







I appreciate the opportunity to submit my written comments to the Gaming Control Board; I regret that I was unable to attend the hearing on May 10, 2006, in Pittsburgh.

My name is Dominick Frollini. I'm 30 years old and have lived in Western Pennsylvania my entire life. I've been a resident of the City of Pittsburgh for the past 13 years, beginning when I moved here to attend college. Still, I must say that I find it somewhat remarkable that I am here today at all...

What I mean is that I, like many younger people in Western Pennsylvania, have seen nearly all of my peers leave our city and our region to pursue careers elsewhere.

Despite the large numbers of students who pass through our many colleges and universities on their way to their ultimate careers, we have not been able to keep those people here – the so-called “brain drain”. The U.S. Census Bureau notes that Pittsburgh ranks 275 out of 276 regions in terms of retaining college-educated individuals.

But what does this mean? And why is it happening?

The meaning of this is rather straightforward. A majority of the young people trained at our region's world-class institutions choose to pursue their careers elsewhere, robbing this region of the contribution they would otherwise make to our economy.

The why is, perhaps, more complicated. There is both a perceived and a real lack of opportunity here. Even those young people who take their first job in our region, as I did, often find that they cannot stay. Indeed, for the past five years I have commuted each week to Cleveland, Ohio, to earn a living, though I remain a resident of this region because I believe so strongly in its potential.

My generation was born into Pittsburgh's Second Renaissance... but I believe the time has come for a *Third Renaissance* – one that will create jobs, increase the attractiveness of our region by adding those cultural and commercial amenities and opportunities we are lacking (and that appeal to the young professionals we are losing), and reconnect and revitalize the Uptown and Downtown sections of the City of Pittsburgh.

The slots casino that will be coming into our region will help start Renaissance Three, but to truly be successful, the region requires a development project on a massive scale that will:


- Create new job opportunities;
- Encourage additional development and *redevelopment*; and
- Provide first-class venues not only for gaming, but also for concerts, religious services, circuses, and, yes, hockey.

As the Gaming Control Board considers the proposals before it and looks to make its decision for Western Pennsylvania, I urge it to consider that *only* the Isle of Capri proposal has the ability to serve as the impetus for Pittsburgh's Third Renaissance.

With the creation of more than 2,500 full-time jobs, the construction of a 290 million dollar multi-purpose arena as the cornerstone of more than a billion dollars in redevelopment, the Isle of Capri plan will create the opportunities needed to increase our region's ability to retain our best and brightest – the young men and women who represent our region's future.

I ask that you award the license to the Isle of Capri, launch Renaissance Three, and take this city and this region to the next level. Thank you.

As a resident of and financial consumer within the city of Pittsburgh, I would like to lend my support to the Isle of Capri's bid for a slots license. The Isle of Capri offers multiple benefits to the city, its residents, and the surrounding areas. Advantages, such as community redevelopment, the value innovation of a new arena, as well as the invested interest in the young population of Pittsburgh all make the Isle of Capri the plan of choice.

As a graduate student at Duquesne University, I drive past the lower Hill district daily. I see an area that is commonly referred to as "economically depressed;" however, the Isle of Capri plans offers an opportunity for revitalization. As the Hill district is revived, the city will become more marketable allowing for the possibility of additional money to be drawn in from new residents or tourists.


I started a hockey fan - and spread it-out for work.

To Whom It May Concern:

I would like to take some of your time and add my opinion of who should be awarded the Slots License for the City of Pittsburgh. I do appreciate you taking the time to read my thoughts and comments. I do apologize for possibly repeating items that you may have heard or read over + over. I am a 31 year old male that grew up in Pittsburgh. My four years away for college was spent in Ohio obtaining an Accounting and Business Degree from Muskingum College. I continued my education and completed an MBA program through the University of Phoenix. I do love my hometown, and I want what is best for the City and my family as we bring up our Five Month Old Daughter. Based upon the proposals by PITG Gaming LLC (PITG), The Isle of Capri Casinos (I) and Forest City Enterprises/Harrahs (FCE), I believe that the IOCC plan offers the best and safest investment in to the Pittsburgh Region. Although some may find my opinion as biased because I am a hockey fan, and I am a Pittsburgh Penguin Season Ticket Holder, my financial background and my concern for the future and the development of the City I love is why I am offering my comments.

The IOCC proposal offers a neighborhood development plan of the Lower Hill District along with \$290 million for a multi purpose facility for the City of Pittsburgh. According to the proposal by IOCC, if they were to be awarded the License, within five days they would put \$15 million in an account towards a new facility, and the balance of \$275 million by 90 days. Speaking in financial terms this means the City and Region will be able to start we have made \$290 million on the slots in Fiscal Year 2007, yes Fiscal Year 2007. Within 90 days there could be a cash gain of \$275 million.

the \$290 in Year Zero offered by IOCC. Although Allegheny County Chief Executive Dan Onorato believes that the PITG and FCE's "commitment" to a Plan B means a facility will be built, I don't believe he is considering the economic history of the region. For several years I have seen different businesses enter the City and Region, only to fold or move elsewhere. No one knows for sure if projected revenues will be brought in by the estimates made by the three applicants. One thing I know about business based on history, is if you are not making money, you get out. If after five or ten years that revenues are not meeting expectations and financial losses occur by PITG or FCE, they may close up and leave, thus their "commitment" to a facility is no longer available. Their contribution will need to be made up by someone, possibly the Tax Payers. Under the IOCC plan, if they were to leave or fold, the City will still have a \$290 million facility for the region.

IOCC has a plan committed to the Region by investing in it early. The plan presented by PITG shows they are willing to develop the Hill District, and commit to a facility. I am concerned about FCE's commitment, or lack of commitment to the Region. Their offering of \$25 million to an endowment fund of \$1 million a year to a foundation to help Pittsburgh, is significantly less than the \$290 million offered by IOCC. FCE also says their Worldwide Members will be brought in to play in Pittsburgh. I cannot think of a reason someone from Spain would want to spend a winter's day in Pittsburgh to play Slots, since there will be no table games to play. I am also concerned about Station Square and FCE's plan for it. I reviewed the plans and I contacted Harrah's about planned buildings that replaced existing restaurants and shops. The reply I received was "Harrah's will provide exclusive restaurants for guests to enjoy meals. Harrah's will also provide retail and gift shops as part of their facility." Based upon their reply I am assuming existing businesses will be eliminated. If this is the case then the only traffic around Station Square will be for their Slots, not for other businesses. This could be why they feel traffic is not an issue.

Money plays an important factor in my opinion also. As a hockey fan, should the City lose their NHL team, I will be taking money I earned in PA to Columbus, OH; Buffalo, NY; and Washington. The City also loses revenue brought in by visiting hockey fans. A fan from Canada, Detroit, New York, or Ohio will not come to Pittsburgh to play slots if they can't watch a game. During the NHL lockout, the City lost millions of dollars, a casino might be able to replace some of the money, but it will not be able to replace it at all levels of business. Any new jobs that a casino creates will be offset by the loss of jobs if there is no main tenant at a multi purpose facility.

Based upon the financial impact the City and Region will immediately gain by the IOCC Plan, I firmly believe the best plan for Pittsburgh is the one offered by IOCC. The Region is guaranteed \$290 million dollars, no matter if IOCC stays operational for five, ten, or fifty years. Any money the PA government has put aside for a multi purpose facility can be used elsewhere in the State. There is no guarantee that the PITG or FCE plans will generate \$290 million in Fiscal Year One, or any combination of Fiscal Years, to the Region or City.



Dear Gaming Control Board Members:

I do not often write letters to my political representatives, however, I am quite passionate about this issue. As you have the ultimate decision in awarding the Pittsburgh Slots License, I am writing today to encourage you and your fellow leaders to award the license to the Isle of Capri Group affiliated with the Pittsburgh Penguins. To be honest, I was not a proponent of the slots legislation, as I, like many people, worry about the repercussions of gambling on our community. However, we are past the point of no return. It is time to ensure that the casinos are not the only ones benefiting from the gambling revenue and that the taxpayers and city benefit as well.

To be clear, I am not writing this as a sports fan, but as a concerned citizen and lifelong Pittsburgher. It is no secret that the City of Pittsburgh is in dire financial straits. It is absolutely criminal what years of political mismanagement on every level have done to a city that is so full of potential. With the proper management and utilization of revenue, this city and region could absolutely flourish. This region simply cannot afford to lose the Penguins. The loss of tax revenue would be staggering: ticket sales, concessions, souvenirs, clothing, lodging, restaurants, etc. While many of our shortsighted, apathetic residents say that they are ambivalent as to what happens with the Penguins. They fail to understand the economic consequences on the area in lost revenue and jobs. A recent CMU study has estimated the annual financial impact of the Penguins on the region at \$104.4 million. In addition, while the governor has introduced Plan B to fund the arena, the Penguins have made no commitment to staying in the city. As a taxpayer, I do not support a \$290 million dollar bond issue for an arena that would be paid for by the Isle of Capri plan.

Hockey aside, the region benefits far more from the Isle of Capri plan than any other plan on the table. The city gets a new arena, the Lower Hill District gets new development that it needs, and perhaps the best gift possible for a bankrupt metropolis: a dependable source of tax revenue. It is hard for me to comprehend why this is even a debate.

I am against issuing the license to Harrah's. The company has done nothing but lie to the city since their involvement in Pittsburgh. They had to circumvent the system by having Forest City apply for the license due to their application for Chester Downs. Worse yet, the company is notorious for overestimating their revenue projections: their casino in New Orleans is a prime example. In New Orleans, they ultimately had to file for federal bankruptcy protection and have their state tax revenue responsibility cut in half. What if that happens here? Pennsylvanian's are counting on that revenue for property tax relief. In addition, an independent traffic consultant stated that they clearly underestimated the traffic impact of a casino on the South Side of the city. You do not have to be an expert to understand that Station Square is a very poor location for a casino. There are very few roads in and out of the South Side as the Monongahela River is on one side and Mt Washington is on the other, and given the geography there is no way to expand E. Carson St. significantly. On event days and weekend nights the area is already a traffic mess. In addition, Station Square already has plenty of development. The Lower Hill would benefit much more from redevelopment and it would tie in geographically with the future development of downtown Pittsburgh.

Please award the Pittsburgh Slots License to the Isle of Capri group. We simply cannot afford to let the Penguins leave the city. If the Penguins leave, ultimately, the taxpayers will be opening their wallets yet again. We will have to make up the tax revenue difference. We will have to pay for the new arena that will inevitably be built (without a permanent tenant) in the next 5 to 10 years. And we will lose an attraction that draws young people to the area, a demographic that the aging Pittsburgh desperately needs.

The loss of the Penguins will just put another nail in the coffin of a city that has so much wasted potential.

I have operated my law office at the above address since 1983. At the present time, I have been at this location for 23 years. When I first moved in to my present location, the uptown area of the City of Pittsburgh was in a very dilapidated condition. At the present time, 23 years later, the uptown area of the City of Pittsburgh is still in a dilapidated or more dilapidated condition. There has been absolutely no civic development or renovation of the properties that exists in this area.

I am very strongly in favor of the Slots License being granted to the Isle of Capri:

1. They have promised to help re-develop and revitalize the uptown area.
2. They have promised to establish a grocery store/supermarket in the Hill District area which would be of great benefit to all persons residing in the uptown/Hill District area since those residents have absolutely no place at which to purchase groceries and other food essentials.
3. Isle of Capri has categorically agreed to build a new arena in this area which will insure that the Pittsburgh Penguins will remain in Pittsburgh throughout the period of all of our lifetimes.
4. The parking situation in this area would never become a problem. If additional parking is needed, there is a multitude of space existing between Washington Place and the Oakland area of the City of Pittsburgh which could be used for parking. Those properties are occupied by relatively low value houses and buildings which could be obtained by the Isle of Capri at a much lower cost that would exist in other areas of the

City of Pittsburgh. Parking lots could be constructed from Washington Place to Oakland at a very minimal cost and would provide those property owners with a fair value for the property owners.

5. As we can see from evaluating the casinos that are in Wheeling and Mountaineer in West Virginia, those casino areas are heavily secured by security officers who very closely police those areas to make certain that criminal elements are not frequenting their casinos. This would be the obligation of the Isle of Capri to supply a sufficient number of security officers who would protect patrons attending the casinos and providing them with safe passages to their automobiles.

6. The primary reason as to why I feel so strongly that the Isle of Capri should receive a casino license is that it is an absolute necessity for the City of Pittsburgh, the County of Allegheny and the surrounding area that we keep the Pittsburgh Penguins as a hockey franchise in this area. If a decision is made against the Isle of Capri, it is absolutely clear that the Pittsburgh Penguins will move their franchise to another city. We can only look back to February 5, 2006 when the Pittsburgh Steelers won the Super Bowl. This created countrywide attention to the City of Pittsburgh and with the goodwill celebrity status of Hines Ward and Ben Roethlisberger in traveling to foreign countries, the amount of goodwill that arose from those two football celebrities in foreign countries created a total awareness in those foreign countries as to the existence of the City of Pittsburgh. Once again, if the Pittsburgh Penguins are able to achieve their Stanley Cup prominence as existed in the early 1990's, this celebrity status will once again benefit the City of Pittsburgh.

I would now like to state my reasons why I oppose the granting of the slots license to the other two competitors:

Re: Harrah's on the South Side.

1. The Southside area, particularly the Station Square area is completely developed and does not need any further re-development.

2. If anyone has ever attended a concert at the Chevrolet Tent in the Station Square Area, parking becomes almost impossible. I am presently intending to attend a Bobby Vinton concert on June 4th which begins at 3:00 PM. I plan on arriving prior to 2:00 PM so that I can find a parking space. I know that if I arrive at 3:00 PM, I will not find a place to park.

3. Even if a 10-story parking garage should be constructed by Harrah's, this cannot provide sufficient parking for the patrons of the casino wherein it is stated that 3,000 slot machines will be installed at the casino. If there is one person for each slot machine in a vehicle arriving at the casino, this will mean that there will be 3,000 automobiles converging upon this location on any given day. This small area in the Station Square area can simply not handle this number of vehicles.

4. The traffic congestion will be absolutely unbelievable. The access leading to Station Square consists of East Carson Street and West Carson Street which is the same road. That one street cannot handle all of this voluminous number of vehicles.

In regard to the Isle of Capri proposal located in the lower Hill, access is provided from Fifth Avenue, Center Avenue, Wylie Avenue, Bedford Avenue, Bigelow Boulevard, I-579 and all of the downtown City of Pittsburgh streets. There will be minimal parking jams.

Re: Proposal Made by Mr. Barden proposed for the North Shore (I apologize for not remembering the name of Mr. Barden's organization).

1. Mr. Barden's proposal appears to have a sufficient amount of space and reasonably adequate parking and access to his facility although it is not really comparable to the amount of parking space and access to the facility as exists with the Isle of Capri.
