CHAIRMAN:

We have one hearing scheduled today regarding the petition of Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment to expand its gaming floor. Can we have the representatives of Greenwood step forward? Thank you.

I would ask that before any of you speak, whatever you have to say, if you'd first state and spell your name for the court reporter prior to your presentation. And I would ask all non-attorney witnesses to please stand and be sworn.

ATTORNEY STEWART:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Good morning.

And good morning to the Board. My name is Mark

Stewart, that's S-T-E-W-A-R-T; with the law firm of

Eckert Seamans here today with Greenwood Gaming and

Entertainment. And I'll have the executives from the

company introduce themselves.

MR. FARANCA:

Good morning, members of the Board. My name is Anthony Faranca, that's F-A-R-A-N-C-A, and I am the General Manager at Parx Casino.

2 CHAIRMAN:

Thank you.

ATTORNEY STEWART:

So, it's a pleasure to be before you all this morning. Thank you very much. I did want to also say that we have General Counsel, Tom Bonner and Assistant General Counsel, Bryan Schroeder with us, in case you have guestions for them later.

We're pleased to be before you today on Parx's OP23 operating petition --- Operating Plan 23. In order to give some overview on that, I'll turn it over to Mr. Faranca, the General Manager, Anthony?

MR. FARANCA:

Again, good morning members of the Board. My name is Anthony Faranca. I am the GM at Parx. My colleagues and I are very proud to be here. We thank you for trusting us in being able to present this proposal to you today.

We believe the first phase of this expansion plan not only gives us --- makes us more appealing to our existing customer base, but also will make us even more attractive to customers who may be driving from further distances.

In summary, as the Parx Casino continues

to mature as a property, a big part of our long-term
strategy must to be to reinvent ourselves. That will
be to protect existing revenue streams that we have
today, and also to allow us to create new ones in the
future.

And this first phase of the expansion, we believe, gives us the opportunity to fortify that long-term strategy. And we hope that you'll find it appealing and give us approval today. So, thank you very much.

ATTORNEY STEWART:

As Anthony just mentioned, this is the first phase of Parx's long-term plan to finalize its shell-space expansion. It's going to be looking to add cutting-edge games, as well as additional amenities for its customers. As you'll see as we go through the presentation, the plan is calling for increases in gaming floor space, slot machine totals and table game totals.

We believe that these changes will help the company maintain its competitive advantage in Pennsylvania and in the region. And to that end, we will --- the company proposes to remove underperforming slot machines that will --- in addition to freeing up space for the more profitable

games will create a better environment for casino patrons on the gaming floor.

And finally, this plan paves the way for the future shell-expansion projects as well, which include the potential opening of a gastropub restaurant, a possible addition of technology-based and/or skill-based games, and a potentially large scale entertainment venue.

Current conditions. Parx has 153,000 plus square feet on its gaming floor, which features over 3,200 slot machines and 175 table games.

OP23 would substantially increase the floor as well as slot machine and table game inventory. Parx would add 23,185 square feet of gaming space, so that the new grand total would be 176,592 square feet for the gaming floor. There were also ---. This expansion will see Parx add 434 new slot machines to gaming floor. As you will hear, that's not the net number, but there will be 434 new machines added. And there will be the opening of the X Lounge which will be a new luxury lounge in a center casino location to provide additional non-gaming amenities for guests.

The plan before you shows the gaming floor and highlights the expansion space in the yellow

- 1 box. Close-up of that space shows the X Lounge in the
- 2 | yellow circle. The green line is the current casino
- 3 | wall. So, everything behind the green line is new.
- 4 | That's the 434 slot machines that were just
- 5 referenced. And as you can see, there is additional
- 6 restroom capacity being added for customers'
- 7 | convenience.
- 8 There's a rendering of the X Lounge.
- 9 And there will also be increases in the table game
- 10 inventory, as was mentioned. Parx will be removing 60
- 11 | slot machines near the cage and high limit table game
- 12 area, which will enable it to reconfigure its floor,
- 13 the current 12 tables there, as well as add six
- 14 additional banking games.
- 15 And the reconfiguration is really an
- 16 outgrowth of the companies continued success in
- 17 growing its table game business. The expansion will
- 18 | allow for a transitional pit between Parx's high limit
- 19 area and its larger table game area to accommodate
- 20 this growing demand.
- 21 And finally, with this increased
- 22 | inventory, Parx will feature 119 banking table games,
- 23 | if the plan is approved by you.
- The design plan before you shows the
- 25 | table game --- the new table game area in the small

yellow box. On a close-up of that ---. Well, let me go back for one moment. The black out --- blacked out area is the cage. Right to the right of that is the high-limit area. And, as you can see, it kind of seques into this new table game area that we're talking about. Then in terms of the close-up, you can see the reconfiguration and the addition of the six banking table games.

As was mentioned, Parx and the plan also proposes to optimize its casino floor by strategically removing specific slot machines that have been underperforming and reconfiguring the banks to improve customer experience. There will be some 106 slot machines removed from 39 different slot banks. And this will create a much more spacious environment for patrons, so that they can more easily move throughout the gaming floor, have better sight lines to amenities, as well as improved casino signage.

So, in summary, OP23 would result in a net increase of 268 slot machines, an increase of nine table games, because there will be three nonbanking poker table games added as well; and as mentioned, an increase of over 23,000 square feet of gaming space.

In terms of changes to the smoking, nonsmoking areas, ultimately while there is a slight

increase in the smoking --- designated smoking area, 1 2 the overall percentage of the gaming floor that is 3 smoking will decrease by more than four percent. 4 the nonsmoking area will, in fact, be larger under OP23.

And in terms of benefits, the company believes that these changes and the increase slot machine and table game inventories will help to produce additional gross gaming revenue as well as gaming taxes for the benefit of the Commonwealth. anticipate an increase in Parx's gaming revenue of approximately \$15,000,000 to \$20,000,000 per year, as well as a modest increase in employment in several operational departments.

ATTORNEY JEWELL:

How would you characterize the increase in employment? You say modest, but do you have some numbers to give us a sense of that range?

ATTORNEY STEWART:

My apologies. Mr. Faranca, if you ---?

MR. FARANCA:

2.1

We're confident that we'll add at least 15 to 20 full-time employees. And the majority of them will be full time. And depending on the success, we may even add more, depending on how things go.

CHAIRMAN:

I was going to ask if the Enforcement Counsel had any questions.

ATTORNEY MILLER:

Sure. Thanks. Dustin Miller, Assistant Enforcement Counsel for the Office of Enforcement Counsel (OEC). If you could, take a look at slide two. That's really the first slide with the text on it.

Several months ago now you gave a presentation regarding mobile gaming. And I noticed there --- at the last point there at the --- you talked about new technology-based and skill-based games. Is the mobile gaming presentation that you gave, is that something that you're still considering?

MR. DIXON:

Yes, the presentation we gave you, we're still continuing to work with various vendors to try and develop products that we believe will --- will work well on the venue floor. So, that is part of

that future kind of growth that we're working on.

ATTORNEY MILLER:

And I see, you know, your plans are to

add six --=- I believe six new table games. The

addition of table games, will that give you more

flexibility regarding the limits on your table games,

as far as a range of high to low limit play?

ATTORNEY STEWART:

Ari.

MR. MIZRACHI:

Yeah. We've added capacity as --- you know, since ---. In 2010 we started working with only seven games and we're going up to 119 at the Parx Casino. So, having more inventory gives us the option to reach out to multiple levels of customers that bet low and bet high.

ATTORNEY MILLER:

I know in your petition you outlined a potential timeline of when you could accomplish this project. I believe that what was attached was slated to actually start October 5th. Do you have a revised timeline? Do you have any idea how long it would take you to implement these changes?

MR. DIXON:

The rest of OP23 carries on through December. Some of the table game reconfigurations would happen after we open the expansion area for the slots. So, I believe the whole project is slated to be finished right around Christmas.

MR. MIZRACHI:

That's correct.

ATTORNEY MILLER:

And I believe it's on slide four you indicated that you are planning to add 434 new slot machines. But then after the --- I guess you would call it the reconfiguration stage, that number would be brought down to, I believe, 200 and ---

MR. DIXON:

Sixty-eight (68).

ATTORNEY MILLER:

--- 268. So, it is your plan to operate with that higher number; I believe the total number would be 3,671 for a period of time and then bring that down to 3,505; is that correct?

MR. DIXON:

1 That is correct, yes.

ATTORNEY MILLER:

Okay. If you could take a look at slide six, please. And this has to do with the expansion, and maybe it's just for clarification. Where the X Lounge is indicated there, to the left it appears there's a set of doors. Could you clarify, those doors do not open to the outside of the casino?

MR. DIXON:

That's correct. Those doors are to the further shell space that we have behind the X Lounge bar, which is the space we're still working on developing exactly what's going to be built out in that space.

In your petition it appears that the table games you're talking about adding are primarily blackjack and roulette tables. Is that your most popular games, is that why you're adding blackjack and

18 roulette or is there a reason that you're not picking 1 2 any other type of table game? 3 MR. FARANCA: The majority, over 50 percent of 4 Yes. 5 our business comes from blackjack and roulette 6 continues to be ---. We're trying to meet the supply of what is demand. We started with four roulette games five years ago. We'll be up to 15. Every weekend we continue to be at capacity with roulette. 10 ATTORNEY MILLER: 11 So, that's sort of to relieve that, I 12 guess, congestion or ---? 1.3 MR. FARANCA: 14 Yes. As an end to your point is it's 15 also to give us relief with lower-end limits, to appease a vast majority of our local players. 16 17 ATTORNEY MILLER: 18 I don't have any further questions at 19 this time. 20 CHAIRMAN: 21 Thank you. Are there questions from the 2.2 Ex-Officio members? 2.3 MR. SMITH: 2.4 I'm not sure if this is on or not. 25 CHAIRMAN:

19 It is. 1 2 MR. SMITH: 3 With respect to the anticipated increase 4 in revenue of \$15,000,000 to \$20,000,000, do you have 5 a breakdown of what's expected from slots versus 6 tables? MR. FARANCA: 8 I would say 90 percent of that increase 9 is in slots and ten percent is in tables. 10 MR. SMITH: 11 Very good. Thank you. 12 CHAIRMAN: Okay. Are there questions from the 13 14 Board? 15 MR. WOODS: 16 Just one question. In the increase in 17 slot machines, are you looking at purchasing new 18 product or are you leasing? What will your mix of 19 lease and owned machines be at that time? 20 MR. DIXON: 21 It will stay pretty much the same as it 22 is now. So, the majority of the new games are 23 purchased games. Our lease percentage is between nine 24 and ten percent of the floor and we'll typically 25 maintain that going forward.

MR. MCCALL:

Do you anticipate any other disruption of service within the casino? I know that there's a wall you're adding on, but do you anticipate any other disruption of any other games? And I have a second question, I guess, to that point. But just with the general construction, will there be any other disruption within the casino?

MR. DIXON:

During the few days when we actually remove that temporary wall, the games that are currently in front of it will be out of service for maybe a day as we go along in sections and remove that wall. And obviously during the reconfiguration around that area there'll be some disruption to existing games, but we're going to obviously keep that to an absolute minimum. There will be nothing major like we had to do the electrical shutdown.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I have just one question and I hesitate asking it. But really it's got my mind going, so I need to get this off my mind. I was down there and you gentlemen took me through the facility. And clearly great thought has gone into this, but I'm curious. The X Lounge, I mean, was marketing research done on that? How did you come up with X Lounge?

MR. FARANCA:

Our marketing team is very creative. We do focus groups all the time, and the X Lounge fits in with the theme of our brand. It's going to be a very high-end experience that we think our customers are really going to appreciate. And we look forward to having it there as an amenity that will actually support future amenities that will come with additional OP plans in the future. And we look forward to discussing that.

MR. MOSCATO:

Okay. Thank you, I was just curious how

you came up with that.

MR. FAJT:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. On the X

Lounge, I assume it's open to all patrons, this is not a high-end exclusive --- you know, for high-end patron only? It's open to everybody?

MR. FARANCA:

That is correct. It would be for all patrons.

MR. FAJT:

And one question on the smoking. Mr. Stewart has heard me talk about this before. We do a lot of public speaking as Board members on gaming around Pennsylvania. It's the number one issue that we hear when we're out there. I see that you are decreasing the overall smoking area of your gaming floor from about four-and-a-half percent, if I did my math right. Is that just by coincidence or is that, again, something you found in your focus groups, a sign of the times, that less people that go into the casino smoke, more people bothered by it, or is it, again, just coincidence?

ATTORNEY STEWART:

I'll allow the executives to speak to the specifics of the plans, but as a general matter,

Parx has found that a substantial portion of their customers enjoy the smoking. They get actually a lot of positive feedbacks about their ability to smoke and, you know, the accommodations that are made for them with the air-handling systems and the like.

So, in general the company has not had a bad experience that you've referenced. I don't believe it was intentional to have it be reduced in terms of responding to a negative feedback from the customers. I think it was probably just more of the balancing of the floor. But does anybody have anything?

MR. FARANCA:

1.3

I think it's fair to say that the majority of our VIP customers do enjoy the opportunity to smoke. We do surveys all the time and we do see in those surveys that they enjoy that option. And in order to protect our future revenues and help with tax revenue for the State, we want to continue down that path and appease those guests. And we believe that the expansion plan that we presented to you today in the additional square footage will actually give us an opportunity to better balance the airflow in the building and hopefully will lead to a better air quality overall. So, that hopefully will improve the

experience for all of our patrons. 1 2 MR. FAJT: 3 All right. Thank you. 4 MR. FARANCA: 5 You're welcome. 6 CHAIRMAN: 7 I have one question on that subject. haven't spent a lot of time in casinos anywhere, a little bit in Pennsylvania. Do you keep the smoking 10 areas sequestered from the nonsmoking or is it all 11 just interspersed? 12 MR. DIXON: 13 It's fairly well-delineated. There's 14 basically two areas that are nonsmoking, a kind of 15 central area that is mostly smoking. So, we try and 16 delineate the areas with signage so that people know 17 whether they're in a smoking or nonsmoking area. CHAIRMAN: 18 19 I know I'm asking a loaded question. 20 Are the games, range of games and types of games, 21 equally available in both the smoking and nonsmoking 2.2 areas? 2.3 MR. DIXON:

In general, yes. We do try and make sure that we offer a full range of different types of
