
OVERVIEW OF GAMING FLOOR EXPANSION FOR TABLE GAMES

TABLE GAMES IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

Phasing Plan

Table Games Implementation Plan

- Construction Began Mid-March 2010.
- June 1 6, 2010 -Temporary removal of 89 slot machines to allow for construction on gaming floor.
- June 7 13, 2010 -Temporary removal of 178 slot machines to allow for construction on gaming floor.
- June 14 20, 2010 Temporary removal of 53 slot machines to allow for construction on gaming floor (total slot machines temporarily removed 320).
- June 21 31, 2010 reinstallation of 320 slot machines temporarily removed from gaming floor, installation of 48 banked table games and 1 electronic table game.
- Construction complete July 1, 2010, and all slots and table games installed.

TABLE GAMES HIRING & TRAINING PLAN

Hiring & Training Plan

- Estimate hiring 400 full time and 100 part time employees.
- 358 are table games employees and the balance are support employees.
- Dealer Training Plan submitted to the PGCB and approved March 16, 2010.
- Dealer training provided by Presque Isle
 Downs at an off-site facility beginning March 22, 2010.

Community Outreach

- Informational meetings held for the public regarding dealer training school and requirements.
- Advertising on local radio programs geared towards minorities in Erie County.
- Forum held to reach out to community leaders in Erie County of various minority support services, educational and recreational groups.
- Job Fair to be held for non-dealer positions April 19, 2010, in Erie County.

Dealer Training School

- 49% of candidates attending Dealers School are currently unemployed.
- Demographic by county of candidates:
 - 88% Erie County
 - 7% Crawford County
 - 1% Warren County
 - 1% Venango County
 - 3% Clarion, Allegheny & Mercer Counties
 - 2% Other
- **■** 98% of candidates are PA residents

TABLE GAMES COMPULSIVE GAMBLING

Compulsive Gambling

- Worked with the Council on Compulsive Gambling of PA (CCGPa) to establish a Comprehensive Compulsive Gambling training program for all employees.
- Incorporated Compulsive Gambling Training into new hire orientation to ensure that all team members are aware of the requirements and can assist guests.
- Annual retraining.
- Yearly contributor to the CCGPa.

PRESQUE ISLE DOWNS COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Community Involvement

- Presque Isle Downs has contributed \$205,000+ to charitable organizations. We participate in many community and charitable activities including:
 - United Way
 - Relay for Life (American Cancer Society)
 - Second Harvest Food Bank
- Many of our employees personally give their time as board members, volunteers or as fund raisers for various local and national charities.

INTEGRATING GAMING & RACING

Integrating Gaming and Racing

- State of the art racing/gaming facility
- Presque Isle Downs is the first new thoroughbred racetrack to be built in decades in PA
 - 1 mile synthetic surface racetrack
- Live racing May through September
 - 800 live thoroughbred races per year
- Year round pari-mutuel wagering
 - Simulcast racing from up to 600 racetracks

Race Horse Development Fund

- Presque Isle Downs has contributed \$60.5 Million to the Race Horse Development Fund. (Feb 2007 to March 15, 2010)
 - \$48.3 Million –Purse Money
 - \$ 9.7 Million –PA Breeders Fund
 - \$ 2.5 Million –
 Health & Pension Fund



Further Integration of Gaming and Racing

- Improving the accessibility of the racing experience
 - Improved access to the racetrack, apron and paddock
 - Improved visibility from the buffet
 - New family friendly green space adjacent to track
 - New wagering locations
 - Addition of family friendly entrance into the restaurants
- The Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission approved our expansion plan for table games on March 29, 2010.

Conclusions and Facts

- Presque Isle Downs currently holds a slot machine license which is in good standing.
- The implementation of table games will have a positive economic impact on the Commonwealth, its municipalities and residents.
- Presque Isle Downs has adequate funding for the expansion to accommodate table games and to pay the authorization fee for the certificate for table games and to commence table games operations.
- Presque Isle Downs will maintain the number of slot machines in operation (2,000) to implement table games.
