The proposed casino at Nemacolin Woodlands is a physical structure, will be smaller in size, yet we will offer the patrons the same level of food choices, entertainment, and shopping that would be found at the larger complexes.

If you have not seen Nemacolin Woodlands Resort first hand, we invite you to stop by and take a look. Then you will know it is truly a tourism gem for not only the Laurel Highlands but for the State of Pennsylvania.

I would now like to take a moment to introduce those who will present on behalf of Nemacolins Woodlands and Woodlands Fayette, LLC.

On behalf of the ownership, management, and staff of Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and Woodlands Fayette, LLC, I thank you, Commissioner Rivers. Commissioner McCabe and Judge Dale Miller for their time and attention this morning.

Over the next 40 minutes, we are going to present to you what we believe is a dynamic plan to develop and operate a first class slots casino at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort.

It will add yet another wonderful amenity to our four star, four diamond resort and provide great employment and economic benefits for Fayette County and the State of Pennsylvania as a whole.

As a few points of reference before we get into our presentation, our proposed casino will be on 16 Nemacolin Woodlands property, yet it is a stand-alone facility that is isolated from the main resort complex, well away from family and children activity areas.

As required by State Gaming Control Law, customers of the proposed casino must be customers of our resort. Unlike the Category I or II casinos, not just anyone can enter.

The Board has seen during its Category I

Woodlands Fayette, LLC, Nemacolin Woodlands Resort, 2 and 84 Lumber Company. Thank you.

MR. KMIEC: We'll start this morning with a short video highlighting the resort.

(Video played.)

MR, KMIEC: Good morning. My name is Jeff Kmiec. I'm Vice President of marketing for Nemacolin Woodlands.

The video highlights you saw and the incredible list of amenities on the screen in front of you really play testament for the type of resort Nemacolin is.

It has quickly classified itself as a first class and world class resort destination locally, regionally, and nationally.

If approved, we intend to build a 17 full-blown, first class casino with lounge, restaurant, entertainment, and shopping areas.

19 Unlike a stand-alone casino, however, the casino 20

patrons will also be resort guests. 21

These next series of slides that we will go 22 through talk about the current economic impact of 23 Nemacolin Woodlands Resort.

24 The employment benefits you see here for 25 the years 2005 and 6 show that full-time Nemacolin employed 1,045 associates and part-time 258 associates.

Of course, these are all good-paying jobs including full benefits packages. The tourism impact with Nemacolin is phenomenal.

The resort in 2005 brought in over 650,000 visitors of which 80 percent were from outside of Fayette County.

The Government impact, for the year 2005, payroll and related taxes you see on this sheet shows that the resort paid a total of over \$30 million.

Annual purchases and goods for the year 2006 are estimated in a variety of areas you see here at over \$31 million.

Construction plays a big role at Nemacolin. The resort continues to grow. You see here for the years 2003 and 2005 that the various projects totaled over \$37 million in construction costs alone.

Marketing plan. Our marketing plan, the support of the community has always been significant. You see here that in 2004 and 5, the resort spent over \$4.2 million in cash goods and services that were donated to a various and variety of charities, some of which are represented here.

The 84 Lumber Classic has brought

facility will have within the community and throughout the state.

Obviously, the operation will spend significant amounts and goods and services regionally, create a number of jobs and employment opportunities at the facility itself and the surrounding region.

There will be dramatic increase in tourism and visitor spending as a result of this project.

There are several indirect and induced impacts which we are able to quantify through economic modeling software, which I'll speak to in a minute as well.

Benefits to Government are something that many of us in this room are focused on today and that includes revenue sharing and taxes, of course.

The projected total value of this investment is estimated at actually 41 million, which includes allocated costs from the existing facility, further investment that is planned and all FF&E.

The construction project is projected to create an estimated 190 jobs during this period, 6 million approximately in construction worker payroll and about \$16 million that will be spent on materials for the project.

On an annual basis, first and foremost,

significant impact to the local region and national attention for the resort. Although this may be the

final year for the PGA event, it speaks volumes for the level and type of event the resort is capable of hosting. We are still in the process of evaluating

our level of participation of the PGA tour for 2007.

And then last but not least, Nemacolins 19 years of consistent growth have allowed the resort to become clearly a contemporary classic. Thank you.

MR. WHITTENBERG: Good morning, Commissioners. I appreciate the opportunity to be here this morning.

My name is Brent Whittenberg with GVA Marquette Advisors. We are a real estate and hospitality consulting firm based in Minneapolis. We were obtained by the applicants to complete a study of the projected economic benefits of this proposed casino venue here at Nemacolin Woodlands.

When we talk about economic impact, there are really two phases of the impact that we attempt to measure. The first phase is obviously the construction project itself, including the jobs and spending that goes along with that effort.

Secondly and more importantly, I think, in this case is the ongoing operational impact that this

we're estimating that the facility will create revenue sharing in excess of \$20 million a year of which an estimated 13 million will go to property tax reform.

Locally, we expect that more than \$600,000 will be generated and distributed to Wharton Township for the purposes of economic development with another 900,000 or more per year going to the Department of Community and Economic Development to be used for grants to Fayette County and economic development authorities.

The facility itself is expected to create 344 jobs creating \$8 million in wages and tip income for these employees.

I think it's important to note that the facility will include more than just gaming. More than 90 of these jobs are expected to be non-gaming positions, and the architects in a moment will speak to some of the other exciting restaurant and entertainment venues that are planned for the casino facility.

These employees in addition to their wages will, of course, earn over 1.4 million in employee benefits. Payroll taxes are expected to exceed \$1.4 million on an annual basis. The facility is expected

to generate another \$200,000 per year in real estate taxes locally.

Sales taxes. The gaming revenues obviously are not subject to sales tax, but all revenue non-gaming will be subject to sales tax, and that includes food and beverage and gift shop revenue. We're estimating direct sales tax impact at the facility of \$800,000 per year.

The facility is expected to spend more than \$8 million per year on goods and services through vendors both locally and regionally and throughout the state.

The tourism impact, as I mentioned earlier, will be dramatic. We're expecting more than 820,000 annual visitors to the casino facility itself, of which more than 40 percent is expected to come from out of state.

I think that it's important to know that the impact will accrue to the surrounding region. Not all of these casino guests will be staying at the Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. I think the impact will be significant upon local hotels and restaurants in particular.

Through our economic modeling software, we 25 are able to quantify and provide estimates of

the last bullet point there. It's \$200,000 in real estate taxes on an annual basis.

With that, I thank you for your time. (Video played.).

MR. HUNTLEY: I'm Phil Huntley of DRS Architects. The video has given you a preview of the exciting design we have planned for the proposed casino.

The Nemacolin casino will be first class in every way with all the features of the larger casinos, plus the amenities of the resort available for the patrons.

Kathryn Jolly and I will give you more detailed information regarding the design, layout, and theme of the casino.

This view shows the existing building, the former outdoor store, which will be converted to the casino. The outdoor store has been relocated to Uniontown to help revitalize the downtown area.

There's a benefit to both the state and Nemacolin in renovating the existing building into a casino. This will allow the casino to be open quickly and generate revenue sooner.

I would now like to walk over to the screen where I can better present to you the site plan and

indirect and induced impacts as well.

The indirect impact really has to do with business spending. As businesses receive more revenue, our model is able to track those dollars as they cycle through the economy.

The induced impacts has to do with the impact of employee earnings as they cycle through the economy. People earn more money and, in turn, spend those dollars locally and regionally.

We measure these impacts in three parts, output, in other words, business and gross profit, if you will, jobs as well and additional employee earnings that are attributed to indirect and induced impacts. You can see those impacts are great and vastly exceed the impact of the facility itself.

This last slide just sums up all of the impacts together combined. The total impact is approaching \$80 million, approximately, \$79 million statewide on an annual basis, 750 new job opportunities statewide, most of which you see will accrue to the county here, more than \$20 million in employee earnings, approximately \$20 million in revenue sharing on an annual basis, significant amounts in payroll taxes and sales taxes.

I should point out that that is a typo on

plan for the facility.

The site is located on Route 40 and is part of the 2800 acre Nemacolin Woodlands project. When we look at this, there's also access via the road right here. Schoolhouse Road back to the site, less than one mile to the center of the heart of the complex.

Part of the reason we had this location right here is the existing building is here with an addition on this side. Entry is achieved in two ways. One entry is right here with a new signalized entry off of Route 40 and the second one from Smithhouse Road right in this direction here.

Both entries lead to a parking area of 478 spaces for the patrons of the casino. There is also VIP parking and valet parking at the entrance. There is also located at that point a bus drop-off. There are many buses that run back and forth to the various areas in the resort and will be able to have pick-up and drop-off at this area before entering the casino.

This is the plan of the casino, which shows the existing building, which I'll outline here of 48,000 square feet. There's a 5,000 square foot addition here.

If a patron enters the casino from under

the covered canopy, they would come into the lobby area located here. There will be shops on either side, valet parking, coats, restrooms, and a lobby area.

Upon approaching the reception desk for the entry into the casino will be validated, they would have the opportunity to purchase PA lottery tickets.

The coral color here shows the actual area of the 500 slots in the casino. The casino is laid out so there will be a high rollers area at the other end of it.

There are two different venues for food service within the casino. The lower portion here opposite the entrance is a food court. There will be five different options for the purchase of food, along with seating for almost 100 people at that point.

There will be a lounge over here in this area which looks down a long axis of the casino. We plan to have a stage, a bar. We'll have an entertainment area on that portion of it along with seating and a dance floor out in front of it.

The grey shows the back of the house. Items -- there's a number of square feet in the back of the house as you can see. It has associate

facilities, administration spaces. It has mechanical, electrical spaces, support for kitchen, and, of course, the cash management systems and things like that as well as the security and video areas.

So this gives you an overview of the plan. The loading dock is located here along with the associate's entrance into it.

Kathryn Jolly will now take us further into the interiors and talk about the exciting concepts and themes.

MS. JOLLY: The old west and the glory days of the gold rush are coming to Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. A new casino will complement the other varied adventures available at this world class resort, these images of both the style of the old west casino that will be created within the former outdoor store building.

Store fronts reminiscent of Matt Dillon's old west will be constructed like stage sets within the existing high ceiling space. 21

Customers will see the banks, the barber shop, the general store, and the saloon that were the hallmarks of the old west street scene while they shop for souvenirs, have their photo taken, purchase Pennsylvania Lottery tickets, and cash in or out of the casino. Behind these stage set scenes, the efficient operations of the casino are housed.

Everyone wants something good to eat while they're at the casino. Here an old chuck wagon graces the entrance to the food court where five themed restaurants provide quick service, quality food, and a place for patrons to sit.

The old west saloon complete with a front porch, swinging barroom doors and player piano music provide an alternative to the casino floor.

An old fashioned bar, table and booth seating, and performance stage enhance the overall casino appearance.

Here, one can relax, celebrate with friends, enjoy a live performance, and simply watch the action that is going on around them.

And on the east wall above the proposed high rollers area, a large scale, three dimensional montage will focus on the gold rush days, complete with mine entrances, old rail cars, and woodsy scenery.

This area will feature museum quality, taxidermied wild animals to heighten the overall visual symmetry.

As you can see from this computer image of the interior, a patron will move through the high ceiling casino space but experience both indoor and outdoor spaces.

The western style trellis serves to shelter the casino floor but also carries the wiring. lightning, and security equipment efficiently connecting the 500 slot machines.

From the western style uniforms worn by every associate to the multiple sit-down venues to the casino floor itself, this old west style casino design will offer the full-blown entertainment experience and high level of excitement that the casino crowd has come to love.

MR. HUNTLEY: As we have explained, the Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and Casino will have a western theme with shops, food courts, and lounge and entertainment in addition to the 500 slots.

When the casino is combined with the existing resort amenities, it will further enhance Nemacolin's world image as a complete resort destination.

By expediting the construction and renovation of the existing facility into a casino, revenue can be generated quickly for the state,

MR. MATHEU: Good morning and thank you. Commissioners, for this opportunity. My name is Trey Matheu. I'm the Director of Resort Operations for Nemacolin Woodlands. I'm here to say that we're very excited at the possibility of a Category III gaming license.

Nemacolin Woodlands has grown tremendously since it was originally purchased in 1987. As you can see, in 1987, we had 36 guest rooms, 2 restaurants and approximately 50 associates.

During the 19 years of operations, those amenities that are given to the guests and activities have blown up. You can see now we have approximately 335 rooms, 1400 associates, and in addition to the activities and amenities listed, we also have, as you have seen in the presentation, an off-road driving academy, including H1 and H2 Hummer vehicles, a world class and world renowned shooting academy and also an equestrian center.

But not only that, we also offer services akin to many municipalities, including water and sewage treatment plants.

At Nemacolin, the associates that we have are our greatest assets. The associates are our

greatest assets for a number of reasons. The first is they offer impeccable services which we're known for nationally and internationally, recognized through both AAA and Mobile ratings.

They also offer the high standards to go with those services. They perpetuate our culture which is really a never-say-no culture for our guests and to be able to get anything done.

Finally, one of the most unique things about our associates is that they are acclimated to change. When I say change, I mean growth and adding new amenities to the resort and adding new opportunities for our guests.

MS. HARDY MAGERKO: What happened last night?

MR. MATHEU: I'm very proud to announce that one of our associates, Pagey Fink, who is a butler at Falling Rock, which is our premiere lodge, was granted the Pennsylvania Tourism and Lodging 20 Association's Spirit of Hospitality Award for the associate of the year, employee of the year for the State of Pennsylvania.

We also have one -- again, with our ability to change with our associates, we've been able to internalize all of our activities and have done so

through organic growth opportunities.

Recruiting has always been one of the things that we've taken very seriously at Nemacolin. If you think of destination resorts or destinations for a resort town, southwestern Pennsylvania, generally, doesn't come to the forefront of your thought, though Nemacolin is trying to change that. We have tried to get very aggressive with a couple of different ways of recruiting associates.

Secondly, we've also found out that we've created a profile for successful candidates in southwestern Pennsylvania. Families are very important to us and also the style and life that this area, the ruralness of this area, offers are very important for the candidates coming in.

We look at a couple of different areas and we aggressively hit our recruiting. We look at search agencies or head hunters, if you will, that target specific facets of hospitality including lodging, culinary arts, food and beverage administration, spa opportunities.

We also look at schools and institutions including Pennsylvania State University, Robert Morris University, Virginia Technical Institute and also the local Laurel Business Institute, which has

28

helped us tremendously with our massage technicians.

Also, the last two things we do, we do aggressively look at the Internet, which has become a part of daily life for many people.

We're also involved in our directors in a national dialogue on how we can better cultivate and identify candidates as they come through schooling, either high schools or secondary schools as well.

The current situation that Nemacolin finds itself in is a good one. We're one of two applicants for one of two Category III applications. As such, we are in the process of conducting an aggressive search for our Director of Slot Operations.

We've looked at two search agencies that right now identify gaming candidates. We also looked at three separate websites, which have done the same.

Finally, we have gone through the schools, including Pennsylvania State University and Robert Morris University, to try to bring up that next level of manager, that next level of interest into the gaming facility should we be awarded a Category III license.

23 When we were looking at a candidate, we're 24 looking at a couple of different specifications for 25 that candidate.

First of all, we are looking at someone who has opened a new facility because that's where we stand now.

Secondly, we're looking at someone who has had experience developing standard operating procedures, everything from cash handling to entrance, security, slot placement, and marketing.

The third, we're looking at this person to hire an experienced management team including Director of Security, Director of Surveillance, Director of Player Tracking, and also, the Director of Cage Operations.

Finally and most importantly to us, we're looking at someone who has had some experience in bringing gaming into a new organization where the associate base is not used to that and that they can hire and train those new associates to be successful.

Currently, that search as we are able to take the first look at the search and whittle it down to about 14 individuals that we were interested in looking at.

Of those 14 individuals, we have asked and invited 4 to come to the property. We are, at this point, very intent on hiring somebody by June 15th to be able to put those standard operating procedures,

As you see on the slide before you, there is a signalized intersection proposed at the entrance. There will be the standard traffic light. turning lanes, and appropriate signage to provide for safe ingress and egress.

The utilities shown as on the slide, as I mentioned, all connect to the existing private systems at Nemacolin.

There are two sources of water supply. The first is the public water supply of the National Pike Water Authority, and Nemacolin has in place signed agreements to receive water and the authority has adequate capacity to provide that.

There is, however, a private backup system within Nemacolin if for some reason it would be needed.

Nemacolin is provided sewage treatment by its own private sewage treatment plant. That plant has substantial excess capacity. We have prepared the studies and submitted to the Pennsylvania DEP; and DEP has, in fact, issued their approval to use the existing sewage treatment plant for this project.

Gas is not connected to the local system. So there will be no impact on the local gas. It is

to be able to put the hiring in place should we be granted a Category III license.

At Nemacolin, we are excited about the prospect of the gaming license. I thank you for your time.

MR. McMILLAN: Good morning, Commissioners. I'm Terry McMillan from McMillan Engineering. We are the site civil engineers for the project.

Nemacolin Woodlands is essentially self supportive and relies very little on the local economy for utilities and services.

All utilities to serve the casino will be connected to the private Nemacolin system, all of which have adequate capacity for the new casino project.

The project has already received the planning agency approvals for clearances necessary to begin construction. Those include the Fayette County Conservation District, the Pennsylvania Bureau for Historic Preservation, the Wharton Township Planning Commission, and the Wharton Township Board of Supervisors.

We had prepared a traffic impact study for the project, and that traffic impact study has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of

connected to a private, separate system.

Electric power also is provided from the private system within Nemacolin and that system will have adequate capacity.

Nemacolin currently has an ongoing relationship with the local services. Those include emergency management, the fire department, police. and security. Those existing relationships will continue and have adequate capacity for the new casino.

So with these, it is our opinion that the new casino will not have a negative effect on the utilities or the local community. Thank you.

MS. ANKER: Good morning. My name is Wanda Anker. I am the Director of Associate Operations and Diversity at the property.

I open my presentation with this quote. Diversity is what binds us together for a common goal, not separate us. It is my pleasure to share with you today our active diversity plans.

The next slide, please. Living in an area of population where the minority base is approximately 3 percent, our 2005 fourth quarter EEOC stats indicate that Nemacolin is 36 percent diverse and 38 percent first quarter of 2006. 25

Our plan of increasing diversity employment numbers included wrote and implemented, a Nemacolin diversity missions statement, wrote and implemented a Nemacolin diversity policy, added a diversity employment link to the Nemacolin website, revised the Nemacolin application to include an EEOC tracking form, subscribed to resources such as weekly Internet newsletter of DiversityInc.com to stay current with diversity issues.

We attended and joined Penn State University's School of Hospitality Management Diversity Advisory Board.

We partnered with Fayette Area Coordinated Transportation to provide a dedicated bus route to Nemacolin to accommodate inner city associates and public.

We included a diversity plan for our purchasing department, which included creating and implemented a purchasing diversity link on the Nemacolin website, created and implement a supplier profile form for vendors to apply to do business with us, which includes the diversity status of the vendor, successful annual vendor open house and banquet which included members of the Pittsburgh Minority Council, created and printed a purchasing

The hospitality industry is diverse with traveling guests, corporate or leisure. We believe that it is good business practice to have a diverse staff.

I end with the quote of Pedro Mandokif,
Chairman of the American Hotel and Lodging
Association, who said, I think success is going to be
the day we don't have to be conscious about doing it
but we're doing it naturally, and so it is at
Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. Thank you very much.

MS. HARDY MAGERKO: Thank you, Board, for coming today and giving us the opportunity to do our presentation.

My name is Maggie Hardy Magerko, President and owner of Nemacolin Woodlands and 84 Lumber Company. I gained sole ownership in 2001.

We started this succession plan in -- what was it -- I think it was -- it took us about four years to do it. It's been a long time. You can imagine my dad is 83 and I'm the heir parent of both companies so it's been a long drawn-out process.

I myself am very excited after seeing again the demonstration today of what we have done since 1987 to today, to me, it's extraordinary. I couldn't have done it without a wonderful group of people like

information brochure of available opportunities to do business.

We purchased a diversity works video from the American Hotel and Lodging Association customized to the hospitality industry.

The training includes all associates, salary and hourly. We created and implemented and revised our associate new hire orientation to include diversity training and the Diversity Works video.

We included printed signage in the native language of our diverse associates participating in our student international program.

We met with professionals of the local college to acquire the knowledge of the culture of our incoming students so that we can fully accommodate them.

We provide an interpreter and services for the hearing impaired at all training, communication meetings, and social programs to accommodate the disabled.

We will not do anything to take away from what Nemacolin is or what we want it to be. We want it to be a five star resort and we believe -- thank you -- I thought the light was my -- I don't know what I thought the light was. I thought it was my cocktail.

In any case, we wanted to make sure that having a casino doesn't ruin the integrity of the resort. Again, thank you for being here today. I appreciate it very much. We're very excited. We won't let you down. It will be a world class facility and so will the casino. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER MILLER: Thank you very much for that presentation.

That concludes the applicant portion of this public input hearing. We will now proceed to the public comment on the applicant and the applicant's presentation. We will begin with elected officials.

I understand that we have State Representative Larry Roberts here this morning. I would ask Representative Roberts to approach the podium. Representative Roberts, you have five minutes.

REPRESENTATIVE ROBERTS: Thank you very much. I am Representative Larry Roberts. I represent the 51st Legislative District, which totally encompasses Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. I'm also proud to say that I live within a 5 iron of Nemacolin Woodlands. So I'm very personally affected by what they're going to be here.

Thank you for welcoming me here today to speak to you on behalf of Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and Spa in Farmington.

The Hardy family has shown their generosity and their loyalty to our area time and time again. So it's only fitting and proper that I come here in support of their application for a gaming permit.

As you may know, the Hardy family not only owns Nemacolin Woodlands, they are also owners of and operators of 84 Lumber Company, that is well known nationwide.

Nemacolin Woodlands, I have to tell you, has built a reputation worldwide and they received visitors from all over the world.

In addition, Nemacolin Woodlands has a rich and vibrant history as one of the Commonwealth's most

slot machines, which is on their application at the proposed site.

Nemacolin also hopes to hire hundreds of new employees, which have been shown on the screen earlier.

In addition, benefits to local government includes 2 percent of net gaming proceeds, which would be distributed to Wharton Township subject to budgetary restrictions, of course, and 2 percent to a fund established at the Department of Community and Economic Development to be used exclusively for grants to the county, which we're looking forward to.

Gaming is the primary revenue generator of Pennsylvania's property tax reform and is a major component of the plans circulating now in the General Assembly.

In fact, I was informed that the Senate has come upon an agreement for tax reform legislation and I'm anxious to get back to vote on that. I'm not sure which way I'm going to vote yet. It's yet to be seen because I don't know what the Senate has approved.

By awarding venues like Nemacolin a gaming license, the gaming industry would capitalize from the success of an already popular tourist location.

scenic, prestigious, and professional resort facilities set on 2800 beautiful acres in this southwest region of Pennsylvania.

Nemacolin offers golfing and all the amenities that you saw on the screen earlier, so I won't go over all of those.

Nemacolin is already recognized for its professionalism and top rate amenities. There's no reason to think gaming would not have the very same level of exceptional service.

Beyond the obvious benefits for the resort itself, introducing a gaming facility here in Fayette County would add to local economies by driving tourism and creating hundreds of seasonal and year-round jobs.

The proposed casino project includes renovation and expansion of the existing facility, the existing supporting facility in Wharton Township, and the project as you were shown is located on Route 40, the state route, which is a historic landmark itself, by the way. Route 40, if you don't know, is known as the National Pike.

Nemacolin anticipates weekday and daily customers of 600 individuals and weekend customers of 1,000 individuals. Nemacolin plans to install 500

While I will continue to strive for the elimination of property tax, we cannot overlook or take lightly any reduction in property taxes that will come about through gaming revenue.

Too much revenue is being lost to our neighboring states. It's imperative that we take steps necessary to keep that revenue at home.

Gentlemen, that's why we have you where you are. That's why we want to make sure that happens.

Most importantly, Nemacolin's owners and management are committed to maintaining a world class resort and providing an inviting atmosphere. Gaming would be just one more amenity at this renowned resort facility.

By getting a gaming venue up and running and in an established and award winning location, the Commonwealth could begin to reap the rewards of this investment property.

Pennsylvania is relying heavily on gaming profits to fund substantial property tax relief, and I feel the southwest region would gain twice as much by bringing home a gaming venue.

I see my time is running short. I did give written comments to the stenographer. I would close by asking that you approve the Nemacolin Woodlands as

soon as possible.

I live in the Borough of Brownsville, Favette County. I'm representing Brownsville First, which is a community group that was formed approximately three years ago to prevent casinos and an Indian reservation from coming into Brownsville, Brownsville Borough.

As such, we have been engaged in this initiative to start casinos at the local, the state, as well as the Federal level. I also add because I'm going to provide some economic analysis this morning that as an individual, I have worked for seven years with one of the big five consulting firms and as such, have provided testimony, expert testimony for 15 the Federal Government and against the Federal Government. I also work for a leading marketing service provider. As such, I'm going to be providing some marketing or market analysis this morning.

**Woodlands Fayette prepared a deficient** application. I'm going to talk about the deficiency of the application first and then a failed business plan.

Then I'm going to go on to discuss why casinos will not -- as time permits -- create sustainable economic growth for Fayette County, as

well as impact the quality of life for our families and why it lacks sound public policy in this county.

Critical information. It impacts the public well being and for consideration of the public has not been provided by Woodlands the initial application was a traffic only. My analysis is based on the inputs of that traffic study, and information today | will point out is different and disparate from that information. I will point out those differences as I go through my testimony.

In Section 441.4 of the Code, there were at least eight deficiencies. I'm going to point out four of them at this time.

Nemacolins did not provide a compulsive or problem gambling plan, safeguards relating to political influence, Section 26; Section 31, the degree to which potential adverse effects will be mitigated was not provided; and Section 33, the applicant's record in dealing with its employees has not been provided.

In Section 441, financial fitness requirements, there are at least 11 deficiencies in the application. I'm going to point out one of them, clear and convincing evidence of financial stability and integrity.

The plan, the initial plan, the traffic study, which was provided, estimated 273,000 customers per year. This morning, we heard testimony on behalf of Nemacolins that that number has changed to 820,000 annual.

Using some standard industry assumptions is reviewed by such sources as Harris 10K, other financial forums and government requirements on behalf of different casinos, Indian reservations, etc.

Looking at a number of those assumptions including \$50 a gambler must lose a day on average, average total wager to be around \$500. The average gambler would have to lose at Nemacolins \$150 and wager over \$1500 per gambling session to support the business plan as outlined and the traffic study or the initial application.

The market characteristics and the draw are insufficient to support this business plan. This is based on population density, characteristics of Favette County and the surrounding impact area of 50 to 100 miles.

The proximity, as well as the lack of significant infrastructure to support Nemacolins, is not available or not provided on a population based

The analysis that I did is based off of the 273,000 customers per year using this information and approximate 335 rooms that were provided this morning in the testimony. That would mean approximately on average 6.7 guests per room per day would have to be engaged in the casino operations.

The initial number according to my research analysis, the 273,000 customers per year, would produce approximately 27 or 27.3 million in revenues. That information is different from the testimony what we had heard today, which I estimate based off of this information, although I did notice that it was provided, would have to be 81 million in revenue and not 27. Again, this difference in information that was provided in the application.

I will point out also that Mr. Hardy at one point, and it was quoted in the newspaper, indicated this would be a \$27 million revenue stream last year.

Another piece of information, again, using the \$27.3 million and looking at the application which states that the draw would be approximately 1.06 million residents or individuals is the market area in the initial application.

Again, looking at information such as

Harrah's Entertainment provided by where the participation rate in a market is 25 percent, noting

that world class casinos obtain approximately 30 percent of shared wallet, that would indicate there are no more than 80,000 potential casino customers within the market area of Nemacolin.

This morning, we heard testimony and I'm estimating based off of the information that was given, even the different testimony this morning or the different numbers from the application, 827,000 annual, 40 percent was indicated to be out of state this morning. Taking that 60 percent remaining in state within this defined market of 827,000, that's 480,000 potential customers or a factor of six times more customers than the initial application had indicated.

The conclusion here is that within Fayette County, individuals would have to wager approximately \$1,000 per trip, assuming 90 percent payout rate with the slots. That's 3 percent of the median income for a family within Fayette County, 3 percent.

In other words, a Fayette County resident would have to wager 3 percent of their income to support this business in a single session at Nemacolin.

This region received the lowest pay in the state in 2000 as well as the lowest pay increase. It ranked 203rd of 313 metro areas in the entire state. This is according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

2000, Foxwoods resides in New London, Norwich region

In this analysis, I'm going to cut to some of the chase here and I mentioned that there were costs. We didn't see any of the costs associated with this venture this morning, costs to the local government, costs to the state.

Based off of my analysis, which is, again, born out of much research, that has been done not only on my behalf but other's behalf.

This analysis is born out of the percentage of the population within a county that would become problem gamblers or addicted gamblers.

Research indicates that within that market area, 50 to 100 approximately miles, one half of the percent of the population would develop that type of significant or severe gambling addiction.

Further research and analysis suggests that when you look at the cost to the county or cost to the surrounding area, that that number can range anywhere from 30 to \$75,000 per individual with that

of Connecticut.

I'm going to point out a couple of things along the sustainable economic element. One of the things that I think is true that when you look at a venue, we heard a lot about the revenue side, I mentioned that I do work with the Federal Government, as well as the Fortune 500. There's a simple rule that if the cost exceeds the revenue, then we just don't do it.

This morning, I'm going to demonstrate additional testimony that the cost and the situation will exceed the revenue for the local government as well as for the state.

The basis of this analysis is born out of a number of sources, including the Census Bureau and Research that was produced by other folks before me.

One of the elements that I will point out is that profits from gambling markets come primarily from local residents.

This was reported by such researchers as Thomson, Gazel, and Richman in '95 where they looked at as much as 80 percent, not 60 percent but 80 percent casino profits come from the local market.

Casinos produce low wage jobs and destroy other employment opportunities. The world's largest casino, at least it was the largest back in early

gambling addiction.

In this situation, the cost to the local community which includes such things as crime, lack of business, employment, bankruptcy, illness, social services, family, abused dollars, suicide, increased government regulation, increased taxes, education and corruption would be approximately \$30 million to the county.

This morning, we heard that the output to the county would be approximately \$65 million. That's with the revised number, not the initial number of 273,000.

In addition, Fayette County will not be the only county experiencing difficulty from the casino coming in. The entire market area, which, again, is approximately that 100 mile radius of the resort, would be close to \$427 million. From the initial numbers, that's 16 times the initial revenue.

Other information that we -- I would like to present this morning is that crime not only costs the community money, but it also has an impact to our families.

I am a father of four with one on the way. The impact of crime associated with the -- associated with the casinos concern me.

Las Vegas reported as recently as in 2000 that new studies and crime rates for counties with casinos are 8 percent higher than crime rates with counties without casinos.

Again, this is born out of a number of studies, including the National Gambling Impact Study Commission Report.

I will close with a quote from one of my heros, George Washington. I'm glad that he was mentioned this morning by the Mayor of Connellsville.

George Washington said, gambling is a child of avarice, the brother of inequity, and the father of mischief. Thank you for your time.

I just wanted to commend the prior speaker 24 for the courage of standing up and giving his testimony, but I respectfully disagree with some of 25

sure that there are going to be some minor negatives but we have those minor negatives now. Why not retain the revenue in the State of Pennsylvania to help address those areas?

Representative Roberts said about the additional revenue that could come in to help with different agencies and the economic development area or activities in the area would be beneficial.

The jobs that were mentioned are desperately needed. Our unemployment rate is still at 7 percent, higher than the national and state average.

So the projected 300 plus jobs that would be created and the spin-off jobs are definitely needed and appreciated.

The economic impact from the visitors is significant. The one comment that was made prior is that a lot of the visitors would be coming locally. I, again, respectfully disagree.

When I was 8 or 9 years old, 20 years ago, maybe a little bit longer, my father would take me to Nemacolin Woodlands -- or not Nemacolin Woodlands. It didn't exist at that time but Ohiopyle State Park.

Back then, you could camp out at the falls and hardly anyone came here. The people that were

I have been working in the community and economic development here in Fayette County for the last 13 years. I've seen a lot of changes, but we still have a lot of challenges.

In the last -- according to the last US Census Data, we are the most distressed rural county in the State of Pennsylvania.

It's nice to see all of the commercial area of Fayette County, the nice amenities at Nemacolin Woodlands, but I want to remind the Board that Favette County has the highest childhood poverty rate in rural counties in the State of Pennsylvania and the highest overall poverty rate.

So I think the decision has been made to bring gaming to Pennsylvania because of the loss of revenue to other states.

Just personally, last week, we gave a bus tour of different development projects in the county. The bus driver said, well, tomorrow, I'm taking a group to Atlantic City.

A lot of people that have been gaming and enjoy that activity have been leaving the state, increasing tourism expenditures in other states to the detriment of Pennsylvania. They live here. I'm

coming here at that time, his canoeing buddies, were 1 2 from the Washington/Baltimore area.

I've been to the Laurel Highlands many times. I live in the area. I've met people from the Washington/Baltimore area. They come here to recreate and vacation on a regular basis.

Nemacolin has drawn significant numbers of people, hundreds of thousands of people from that market area. It's growing every year. They spend money here.

Businesses are coming here out of the Baltimore/Washington area because of the high cost of operation.

So they help market the area for the economic development activities because people get exposed to the area and say, geez, I'm familiar with that.

From a geographic perspective, we forget that Nemacolin Woodlands is just as close to Washington/Baltimore as is Harrisburg, the state capital. It's only a three hour drive. It's a significant market area.

The people living there with high revenue or high incomes are staying at the hotel at Nemacolin. It really generates the economic activity

In my job with economic development and industrial development. I can build business parks and industrial parks and struggle to try to bring in companies here. We have been successful to some extent, but I can quarantee you that I can't do this up in the mountain area of Fayette County.

Half of the area of Fayette County is mountainous. It's environmentally sensitive. I can't put in an industrial park and attract companies that might need a railroad. Railroads don't exist up be too sensitive because of the areas like Ohiopyle State Park, which is, again, the second most visited state park in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

They are looking at increasing revenues in the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. What can we do to get our state parks to be more economic generators?

This type of synergy between development at Nemacolin Woodlands and Ohiopyle State Park, Falling Water, Laurel Caverns, and so forth really helps increase value of each of these attractions for the benefit of everyone.

that the numbers of jobs that were discussed, they were talking about the local impact, the indirect iobs locally.

I know several people here in the audience that are local business people. Nemacolin is a world class resort. 84 Lumber is a world class company. They could do business with anybody in the world.

They could be hiring national engineering firms. McMillan Engineering that testified here works here locally and other people here in the audience are local businesses that they do business with. That is very much appreciated.

Maggie does have a great team of people. Whether it's Trey or Sherri, you know, that are here in the audience, they're involved in the local community organizations, you know, Wanda with the Workforce Investment Board, Trey with the Visitors --Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau.

They're doing it because they care. They have launched programs such as the PGA School for Children to teach character development in the local schools.

They were doing this before the gaming license was ever discussed. This is a world class organization. It's a world class community organization.

What they are saying they're going to do knowing Maggie and Joe Hardy and their reputation. they get it done. They do it for the benefit of everyone involved. We really, really appreciate that.

I think it is what really separates Nemacolin's request for this license and others that I've seen give testimony in that they really do care. They really are involved with the local group. They will continue to be involved with local organizations

So in closing, I would like you to keep that in mind when you're doing your evaluation of the economic impact and the positive benefit that will come about through this project.

On behalf of the Board and their membership, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to present our testimony regarding Nemacolin Woodlands and their application for this license.

When faced with the task of taking a stand on gaming in Fayette County, our executive committee decided it would best serve our membership by providing accurate statistical information.

The decision was made that we must be representative of the level of support of our members by completing a survey to be distributed to each of our members.

We anticipated about a 20 percent response from this survey, but we are pleased with over 30 percent of our members did respond.

Now, to provide the information about the survey and some other information about our chamber,

Put into much more direct terms, we exist as a Chamber of Commerce in order to help our members to succeed in business and to make sure that we maintain and develop a good quality of life for all of our county residents.

As the Chamber charged with representation of the county business community, we are faced with issues on a daily basis, which are poised to make

I would like to introduce Muriel Nuttall, our Executive Director.

MS. NUTTALL: Thank you, Bill.

Good morning. My name is Muriel Nuttall and I am the Executive Director of the Fayette Chamber of Commerce and I would like to thank you as well for this opportunity to present our testimony to you today.

The Fayette Chamber of Commerce has a long history in Fayette County. Since our inception in 1925, we have grown from a localized Chamber of Commerce encompassing only the City of Uniontown to a broad membership of over 500 businesses and organizations representing more than 16,000 employees throughout Fayette County and in our surrounding region as well.

The Chamber's membership is diverse with members in five major sectors; 23 percent of our members are professional services, 20 percent are nonprofit government education, 18 percent are retailers and wholesalers, 15 percent represent the customer service sector and 14 percent are hospitality and food service providers.

Ranked by number of employees, our members range in size from the smallest to the largest, from

1 great impact on our area.

Gaming has certainly been one of these issues. When an organization has such a diverse membership such as ours, we must continually work to be considerate of our membership at large.

Each and every member has an opinion and each member's opinion matters greatly. Our first question of our survey was simple, are you in support of gaming; and indeed, 80 percent of our Respondents were in support of gaming in Fayette County.

Of that 80 percent, 87 percent see gaming as a form of economic development for Fayette County. Now, a healthy economy is rooted in many aspects of community life.

The concept of economic development includes the idea of economic growth where an increase -- we have an increase in the size of the economy.

Economic development also includes a notion of changing the quality or nature of the economy, such as changing investment choices or technology; and the effects of gaming do just that, adding new jobs, new entertainment sources as 16 percent of our Respondents wish for, and property tax reform, which was cited as a reason for support by 43 percent of

our members.

the essential funding necessary to support tourism related business throughout the rest of the county as well.

As the majority of our membership supports Nemacolin in their bid for gaming, I would urge support of our tourism infrastructure goals as well.

Now, conversely, our survey pointed out that there are members who are not supportive of gaming in Fayette.

A total of 19 percent of our Respondents did not support the concept, with 80 percent of those citing ethical concerns of gambling as the primary reason, 28 percent also pointed to quality of life concerns with the casino located in the county.

As one member stated, ethical considerations are at the heart of my objection. What social problems will arise from legalized gambling? We have so many addictive disorders, I can only imagine the impact that accessible gambling will have on families and individuals.

From another, yes, it will bring more money into the county but it will do so at the cost of addiction and financial ruining for some families.

Now, understanding those ethical concerns, I know for a fact actually that our social service

agencies like the Fayette County Drug and Alcohol Commission, and Community Action Agency, as well as Nemacolin Woodlands itself have designed specific programs, and I know that they're prepared to deal with the social problems that may arise from the gaming industry.

In addition, we all seem to agree on one thing. That is the concept of passing onto the next generation the tools necessary to make the best moral and ethical decisions possible.

Nemacolin Woodlands is a good neighbor. The Hardy family have proven to the Fayette Chamber and to the county that they have the best interest of the area in mind as they create and operate their business.

A strong 98 percent of our Respondents supported Nemacolin Woodlands as the best location for a resort casino.

To add just a few final thoughts to our testimony today, allow me to reintroduce our Chamber, Board of Directors President, Bill Blaney.

MR. BLANEY: Certainly, gambling is never a sure bet, especially for the economics of the municipalities that stake their futures on it.

Here in Fayette County, we view gaming as

merely one piece of a much larger and ever expanding economy, one piece if done carefully, handled fairly, and with consideration to our existing social services and infrastructure could help us to continue to pursue a brighter tomorrow.

The bottom line is that while we have a representative minority portion of our membership withholding support of gaming due to what might be best described as social concerns, the overwhelming majority of our membership supports Nemacolin Woodlands in their quest to obtain a slots license. Thank you very much for allowing us to make this.

PRESIDING OFFICER MILLER: Thank you very 24 much. You have ten minutes and you may begin.

MS. URBAN: Thank you. Good morning. I am Anne Urban. I'm the Executive Director of the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau.

I will be echoing some of the comments that were already made by Mike and Muriel. Since 1958, our organization has been the official tourism promotion agency for the region comprised of Fayette, Somerset, and Westmoreland Counties.

Our role is to promote the Laurel Highlands region as a destination to visitors from outside of the region, which results in positive economic impact for our area.

We reach out to individual leisure travelers, to tour operators bringing motor coach groups in, meeting planners, planning conventions and conferences and to travel writers, writing about our fabulous destination.

For more than a decade, we have witnessed extensive growth and development at Nemacolin from exciting special events to the addition of spectacular guest rooms and the expansion of resort activities.

Nemacolin Woodlands Resort is a significant attraction and destination within the Laurel Highlands region.

Nearly 500 conference groups meet annually at Nemacolin, and visitors travel from all over to come to the resort.

Primarily, their target markets are coming from Ohio, West Virginia, Washington D.C., Maryland, northern Virginia, as well as from all points of Pennsylvania. They all come to experience this very special place.

According to the report on the economic impact of travel and tourism in Pennsylvania, visitors spent over \$255 million in Fayette County in 2003 and over 780 million in the entire Laurel Highlands region.

Additionally, tourism provides job opportunities throughout the whole Commonwealth. In Fayette County, over 4,000 individuals are employed in the tourism industry. Nemacolin provides approximately 25 percent of these tourism related jobs.

The Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau recognizes the positive impact of Nemacolin receiving a Category III resorts slots license. It will provide new job opportunities and it will provide a new amenity to offer first time and returning visitors to the region, whether they are individual

leisure travelers or part of a group.

A resort casino at Nemacolin will become a part of our existing Laurel Highlands diverse tourism product, which already includes significant historical sites, world renowned cultural attractions, outstanding recreational opportunities, amusement areas, and national and state parks, all encompassed by our four seasons of natural beauty.

I have personally attended many events and meetings at Nemacolin. I'm certain should they receive this license, they will provide first class service and a memorable experience for casino patrons and all of our visitors.

Because tourism is becoming more and more competitive every year, it is so important that we are able to compete effectively with our neighboring states. This license will provide Nemacolin the opportunity to do so. The benefits will extend throughout our entire region. Thank you very much for your time and consideration.

Fayette County Community Actions is a private, nonprofit organization which is involved in providing healthcare, housing development, community development, and human services throughout our local area.

Most of the residents that we serve are low income residents of Fayette County. We serve people of all ages, from children to senior citizens.

As Mike indicated, Fayette County is the

....

most distressed county in Pennsylvania. Fayette County has suffered for several decades from high poverty, high unemployment, and a lack of jobs.

In fact, the county is second only to the City of Philadelphia in the proportion of residents living below the poverty level.

Almost one in two families either live in poverty or the edge of poverty. 18 percent of our residents live below the Federal poverty level, which most experts feel is too low.

We use a broader indicator, about 50 percent of the median income, about 40 percent of our residents live below 50 percent of the state median income.

Many of our residents are employed in minimum wage jobs with no benefits. Many families struggle day-to-day living on incomes from part-time jobs.

Increasing costs of housing, utility, medical care, food, and transportation challenge our families. Many of our children in our communities go without nutritional foods, clothing, or other needs.

In rural communities like Fayette, poverty is often hidden. Similarly, resources in rural communities like Fayette are never enough to address

efforts, supportive of local charities and provides opportunities for our citizens and participates in training activity.

Their support of organizations such as the partnering agencies of the United Way, Children's Hospital and community groups, like the East End Community Center is part of their positive impact on our local community.

With the approval of this license,
Nemacolin Woodlands will continue to see outstanding
growth, will draw many more visitors to our
communities, strengthen our tourist industry, and
give our county a shot in the arm that it needs to
reduce the level of social distress which exists
today.

According to the initial economic impact study, this project estimated that the new casino will draw over 600,000 visitors from outside the county to our local community.

Over 300 new local jobs will be created, directly resulting in added income of over \$8 million and these jobs will also have benefits.

Our local businesses will benefit from additional dollars spent for goods and services. Our municipalities will benefit from the new revenue

the level of local need.

Our county is near the top in every indicator of social distress, with one of the highest child poverty rates in the state, 26 percent of our children grow up in families with income below the Federal poverty level.

The average wage in Fayette County is 33 percent less than the current statewide average. 22 percent of our residents rely on Medicaid for healthcare, one of the highest rates in the state.

Our residents and our communities are struggling, and we need help to turn this around. One of the few bright spots in the past ten years has been the growth and development at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort.

Nemacolin, a world class resort, is currently one of the larger employers in the county, and the employment opportunities have continued to increase year after year.

Nemacolin currently is the major draw to visitors, providing tourist dollars to the local economy and helping local businesses well beyond Nemacolin Woodlands.

Nemacolin Woodlands has also been a good citizen. It is active in workforce development

sharing taxes, helping Wharton Township and all municipalities throughout the county with the community and economic development fund created by the Act.

Your decision to approve this request will have a positive impact on Fayette County, helping all of us to address depressing problems we face.

The creation of jobs, the benefits to our communities and businesses is why I felt the need to speak in support of this application.

The best way to address the pressing problems, which our communities are challenged by and to address the extreme poverty in which many of our citizens live, is to create jobs and stimulate the local economy of our community.

You can help turn Fayette County around by approving this request for a license for Nemacolin Woodlands. Thank you for providing the opportunity to speak on behalf of this license.

MR. VICITES: Thank you very much. It's an honor to be here today to speak about a subject that I think will help the future of Fayette County and will have an impact to the future of Fayette County.

I want to speak specifically about the current economic impact of the resort and the impact that the gaming will have on Nemacolin Woodlands Resort in the future.

Currently, the impact of Government in 2005, the payroll and related taxes, direct impacts is 27 million including benefits.

The sales tax impact in addition to the revenue tax is 2.1 million in sales and use tax. The real estate taxes are \$903,861 total. That's \$655,340 for the school, \$248,521 for the county and Wharton Township, and the amusement taxes total 271,000.

The employment impact, which is very important to Fayette County, Nemacolin Woodlands Resort is one of the largest, if not the largest, employer in Fayette County. They're good-paying jobs in Falling Rock was invested, the media center and garage, 14 million, the spa expansion 1.7 million. the motor coach park 1.1 million, the golf operations facility 1.5 million, the golf practice range 1 million, the ski slope upgrade 700,000, the squash court 385,000, the bear habitat 310,000 and the shooting range pavilion 90,000.

If the impact -- the impact if the casino, the gaming is approved, which I strongly urge you to consider, the economic impact of this would be as follows: Construction jobs, the operational impacts annually, by spending the operation of goods and services, jobs and employment earnings, the increase in tourism and in visitor spending, the indirect impacts of more business outputs jobs and earnings, and the benefit to Government, the revenue sharing and the taxes.

The construction impact is estimated at \$22 million. The original amount of construction jobs will be 190, 6 million in construction worker payroll, 32,000 per job and 16 million spent on materials for the project.

The ongoing operational impacts, the direct benefits annually, as was said earlier, 344 full-time jobs, over 8 million in wages and tips income, over

with full benefit packages.

In 2005 and 6. Nemacolin Woodlands was 972 full-time employees in the winter season. The projected increase in the peak summer season is 1,145 employees.

There are 228 part-time employees in the winter season. The projected increase is 258 in the peak summer season.

The annual purchase of goods and services, the spin off affected in 2006, the goods and services, were estimated to be \$31 million.

The impact is spread throughout southwestern Pennsylvania with a variety of companies benefiting such as food service companies, maintenance material companies, landscaping and ground maintenance companies, golf operations, supply companies, advertising industry, and the restaurant supply industry.

The construction impact, each year as part of an ongoing renovation and expansion, a variety of projects are in the process. It's an ongoing theme. They just keep growing and building and improving this world class resort.

It provides hundreds of construction jobs. Just a sampling of that from 2003 to 2005, 17 million

1.4 million in employee benefits, over 1.4 million in 2 payroll taxes, hundreds of thousands in real estate taxes, over 800,000 in sales taxes, more than 8 million purchased from vendors, and more than 820,000 4 5 annual visitors.

The direct and indirect inducement impact; more than 22 million indirect output to the county, more than 36 million indirect output statewide, more than 265 indirect jobs in the county, and more than 400 indirect jobs statewide, more than 6 million in direct earnings to the county, more than 11 million in direct earnings statewide, the total impact more than 65 million total impact output for the Fayette County area, more than 79 million statewide, more than 600 new jobs in the county, more than 750 new jobs statewide, more than 15 million employee earnings in the county, more than 20 million employee earnings statewide, more than 19 million in revenue 18 sharing, more than 5 million in payroll taxes, more than 2.7 million in sales taxes and more than 213 million in real estate taxes; the ongoing operational impacts, approximately 230 million in -- 2 percent of the funds established by the Community of Economic 24 Development will be used exclusively for grants to Fayette County and economic development authorities,

organizations with the county and the redevelopment authorities located within Fayette County for grants

for economic development and community improvement projects.

Last but not least, the current economic impact of the resort, in 2004 and 2005, the resort owners donated more than \$4.2 million in cash in goods and services to charity in Fayette County, 4.2 million.

In addition to the resort host, major annual fund-raisers such as the Savoir Affair, \$85,000 to the Hillman Cancer Center, the Royal Reception, 100,000 to Cure Search for cancer, the Westmoreland County Boy Scouts Council Golf Tournament, 115,000.

The Nemacolin Woodlands Resort is a world class facility right at our footsteps in Fayette County. It really is a very big positive impact for Fayette County to have this resort right at our doorstep.

With the gaming being approved, if you would consider that, I strongly urge you to do so. I think it will bring more visitors into the county. It will have more of a positive impact to our tourism.

The Stoning Company now has 14 locations, 200 employees, about 100 concrete mixers. Until three years ago, Uniontown was one of my slowest plants. Now, it's one of the busiest due to two reasons, Mon/Fayette Expressway, the new factories at the Fair Chance Industrial Park and also Nemacolin Woodlands.

They have actually created a positive attitude in Fayette County. My attitude has changed. I'm not considering moving back to Fayette County right now because there are things to do.

MR. SHALLENBERGER: Good morning, members of the Gaming Board. I would like to introduce myself. My name is Terry Shallenberger and I'm president of Shallenberger Construction Company, a Fayette County based contractor, construction company.

We have been involved in numerous construction projects with the Hardys since the mid-'90s, both at Nemacolin and the revitalization of downtown Uniontown.

When I started with the Hardys ten years ago, I employed 15 people. We currently employ approximately 80 employees, 75 of which reside and pay taxes in Fayette County.

I have heard a lot of our success with the constant array of projects that the Hardys have awarded my company.

With the constant expansion of Nemacolin

The restaurant lounge will create 10 to 15 new job opportunities. I feel a casino in the area. it will have a tremendous, positive impact by bringing more people past our establishment.

Our next speaker is Frank Martik.

MR. MARTIK: Thank you for allowing me to speak. My name is Frank Martik. I'm here to represent Martik Brothers, a construction company located in Finleyville, Pennsylvania, and to explain why the proposed casino construction at Nemacolin Woodlands will provide a shot in the arm to the Fayette and surrounding counties employment picture.

We've participated in several projects at Nemacolin Woodlands since its purchase in 1987, and hopefully we will be given the opportunity to be a participant in the proposed casino construction.

If we could use our company as a model for jobs created by the casino, the casino project would be numerous.

Martik Brothers employs approximately 30 in-field employees, 6 of whom reside in Fayette County.

Depending on the project scope, most of them would be involved in the daily work. Aside from the wage taxes and such, the local restaurants and service stations would benefit also. 1 downtown Uniontown, since 1982.

We have been doing floral work since 1985. We've been an in-house florist at the resort since 1999.

We have had a very long and wonderful relationship working with the Hardy family and the resort, and as they have continued to invest and make Nemacolin a world class resort, my business has continued to grow with them.

When we started working with Nemacolin, I had seven employees. I now currently have 23, which approximately 4 to 6 of those positions are tied directly to the Nemacolin account.

We have seen over the course of the years in dealing with the Hardy family, they identify, they don't call them problems. They call them opportunities.

The opportunity is researched. It's studied. They spare no expense, no time to gather the information that is needed to best address the challenge, and then they do it.

I also have the pleasure of being in downtown Uniontown. The Hardys' efforts there have been well chronicled. I'm very fortunate saying it was Joe Hardy's inspiration -- I was a couple years

When I used to travel and you told them you were from Uniontown, you always had that pause. You really had to address that you were 50 miles southeast of Pittsburgh.

Well, now when you tell them you're from Uniontown, they know where you're from. So I think all of that has been done, the Hardy family -- the numbers and statistics have been here, their support of the local business community and the charities are well documented.

My dealings with the family over the years, they depend on you. They are loyal to you. When they give you their word, they give you their word and they follow through.

I believe the numbers here, the economic development that this proposes to bring to the county. They haven't been wrong yet. So I would encourage you to give serious consideration to their

MR. TOPPER: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen, members of the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board. My name is Robert Topper and, as administrative director for Fayette Emergency Medical Service, I'm honored to be here today in support of Nemacolin Woodlands gaming license.

Let me give you a brief history of Fayette EMS and how Nemacolin Woodlands has had a positive influence on the residents of Wharton Township in our ability to provide them quality emergency services.

Favette EMS is a nonprofit ambulance service covering the majority of Fayette County as a 911 provider.

In 2005, we answered more than 19,000 calls for help out of 9 stations, one of which is located just one mile from Nemacolin Woodlands.

In 1998, we were approached by Wharton Township supervisors after the previous ambulance service located in Farmington literally left in the middle of the night, leaving the people of Wharton Township with only one option, an ambulance provider which in some cases was as far away as 45 minutes.

We are more than confident that the funds generated by the license will stay in the community, provide jobs in the community, and to provide the funding for EMS to continue servicing Nemacolin Woodlands as well as provide the people of Wharton Township with quality emergency services. We feel confident about this because that's

the way it's been for the last eight years. We know that's the way it will be as long as the Hardy family owns Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER MILLER: Thank you very much, sir.

After meeting with Wharton Township officials, we explained to them that an ambulance service is a business and there just wasn't enough call volume to generate enough revenue to support a 24-hour a day staffed ambulance.

Supervisor Jim Means arranged for a meeting with Nemacolin Woodlands in the hopes of generating financial support to provide staffing for an ambulance in Wharton Township.

Our contingency of representatives from Fayette EMS met with Miss Maggie Hardy. At that time, we explained to her the problem we had faced in providing medical services to such a rural community as Wharton Township.

She replied with one unforgettable statement. How much do you need? Consistently thereafter, year after year, Nemacolin Woodlands and the Hardy family have financially supported Fayette EMS and Wharton Township, and not just for Nemacolin Woodlands but for all of the people of that mountain community.

Once again, Fayette EMS supports Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and their application for a Pennsylvania State Gaming license. We look forward for the opportunity as Nemacolin grows.

I would like to talk a little bit about the bright spots. Tourism, that's the future for Fayette County. For tourism to succeed in this county, we have several first class attractions right now but we don't have the anchor attraction that brings people to this community year-round, month after month.

Many of our attractions are seasonal. A casino operation in this area would provide an anchor that would increase the tourism in this area on a vearly basis.

Another point I would like to make is we get a lot of comments at our attraction about how well it is operated, the health of the animals and so forth.

One thing that I feel supports that is we live where we work. We live on the site. The Hardy family has the financial resources to live anywhere in the world but they choose Fayette County. They call Favette County their home, Maggie, Pete, Mr. Hardy. They all live at the resort. They're actually going to live where the casino is. I think that really says a lot about any

24 25 concerns we have about how it will be operated, the

type of class that will be presented there. That's all I wanted to say. Thank you.

As we heard from -- and I may mispronounce the gentleman's name -- Mr. Kovscek from Brownsville First, certainly, he presented some figures and some objections to gaming and gambling generally, then specifically to our application.

What is important to note is, first of all, the projected numbers that we showed today on the proposed impact of the casino are three-year numbers.

They were developed by GVA Marquette Associates. So that is where you are ramped up. These are not immediate numbers at the beginning of operation of a casino operation.

The only part of the application that has been made public is the traffic and utility study, which is roughly 5 to 10 percent of that total application.

Nemacolin Woodlands and Woodlands Fayette, LLC certainly fulfilled the requirements and the obligations of that application.

Many other of those components include the business plans, the business projections, the financials, the social mitigation plan, the diversity plan, the compulsive gambling plan. All of these

they've been very supportive of the community in the past and I know they will in the future.

A great deal of our business is generated through their associates and their guests. It's very seasonable, as it is right now, like Sonny said. With the casino, it would generate revenue during the off season and it would make it a lot more favorable to people visiting our area for tourism because, as you know, we have no industry anymore.

We have lost our meals, our coal mines, construction has been way down. The Hardys have generated a lot of, you know, work and revenue for the county and everything they do is first class.

They've been excellent neighbors. They've given back to the communities, to the ball fields, the fire department, the ambulances, the schools.

I feel it's a win/win situation for you folks to bring a slots license to it. Thank you for your time.

PRESIDING OFFICER MILLER: Thank you very much, sir.

That concludes the scheduled registered speakers. At this time, we invite the applicant to make a 15-minute rebuttal or sum up as they choose.

things were submitted.

As the Board put together these public input hearings, it was the decision of the Board that all that was going to be released was that public impact portion of the plan at this point.

Certainly, we have not asked for confidentiality on a great amount of our application; and at the Board's approval and behest, we can get to that point. Certainly, those will be made public.

I should also note that we certainly are willing to sit down with anyone that has concerns about our proposed casino and address their concerns and help them better understand just how we would operate that casino operation and really its benefits to the county.

We would never, ever move forward with creating something that in any way, shape, or form would be detrimental.

One final point I would like to make, Nemacolin Woodlands Resort, as we have seen, has grown tremendously over the last 18 and 19 years.

There was some comments made relative to Fayette County residents utilizing this casino and some of the problems that that could cause.

Certainly, as with the state gaming law,

you have to be a customer of the resort. You have to make a purchase. You can't just walk in.

Beyond that, our marketing budget for the resort in this fiscal year we're in, which ends at the end of December, is \$3 million.

Of that 3 million, less than \$250,000 is spent marketing in the Fayette County area. The balance of that is expended in markets like Washington D.C., Baltimore, Maryland, northern Virginia, Philadelphia, Columbus, Cleveland, and on a national basis.

I think as you have seen some of the awards and accolades that the resort has received from publications like Continest, Golf Digest, our goal is to make Nemacolin a national and international destination, which in the long term is going to greatly benefit the county by continuing to bring more and more tourism into the state.

One final point is that you need to take into account the overnight guests of the resort as you extrapolate these numbers.

With all due respect, the numbers were a bit off because you took a traffic study and you extrapolated that against a three-year number, not taking into account the amount of traffic the resort
