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                CHAIRMAN DECKER: Good morning. I am
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       Tad Decker, Chairman of the Pennsylvania Gaming
       Control Board. I'd like to welcome the Board
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       and all of you to this public meeting. A quorum
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       of the Board is present; therefore I am calling
       the meeting to order.
                As always, let me ask everyone to turn
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       off their Blackberries and other electrical
       devices, including me, because they interfere
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       with the sound system.
                As we usually do, let's start with the
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       pledge of allegiance.

                (The pledge of allegiance.)
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                CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you.
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                Three announcements: We have a very
       busy schedule today. We have two Category 1
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       suitability hearings taking place this
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       afternoon.
                Secondly, we held executive sessions on
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       September 5th, September 10th, and then earlier
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       this morning to discuss personnel matters. No
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       business was conducted at these sessions.
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                Third, I want to talk about an
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       important date which will be coming up, which is
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under our statute the so-called "deemed complete

- date". As many of you know, Act 71 requires the
- 2 Board to deem complete all initial applications
- 3 for operator licenses.
- 4 This is important for two reasons: It
- 5 starts a 12-month period during which the Board
- 6 is required to approve, condition or deny all
- 7 permanent applications.
- 8 Remember, conditional Category 1
- 9 applications and licenses are exempt from that,
- 10 but the permanent ones are not.
- 11 Second, it is the time when we will not
- 12 permit any further changes to the operator
- 13 applications. I raise this point today because
- it is the Board's intention to deem the
- applications complete at our next meeting, which
- 16 is September 27th, 2006.
- 17 Again, the deemed complete date is an
- important date in the application/licensing
- 19 process, and it is our plan to deem applications
- 20 complete at that time.
- 21 Of course, that is also the date we
- 22 hope to act -- we plan on acting, we intend to
- act, with a much stronger intent than what we
- 24 heard about the word intent, but much stronger
- intent to act on the conditional Category 1

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1 license applications.
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- 2 Any questions or comments from the
- 3 Board on anything in that respect?
- 4 THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 5 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Okay.
- 6 Next item. We have the transcript and
- 7 the minutes of the August 23rd Board Meeting.
- 8 May I have a motion to approve those minutes and
- 9 transcript?
- 10 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Mr. Chairman, I
- 11 move the approval of the transcript and minutes
- of the August 23rd, 2006 meeting and their
- posting on the Board's website.
- 14 CHAIRMAN MARSHALL: Second.
- 15 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you. All in
- 16 favor please indicate by saying aye.
- 17 THE BOARD: Aye.
- 18 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any opposed?
- THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 20 CHAIRMAN DECKER: The motion carries.
- 21 Thanks again.
- Now we going to move on to new
- 23 business, and we are going to hear from our
- 24 Executive Director, Anne Neeb. Good morning,
- 25 Anne.

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1 MS. NEEB: I don't have anything in
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- 2 particular to report other than our continuation
- of the suitability hearings, which will continue
- 4 this afternoon.
- 5 So we will just go ahead and move on
- 6 with administration, and then we have one or two
- 7 other matters which are motions, resolutions.
- 8 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Okay. Thank you.
- 9 MS. NEEB: Thank you, Chairman.
- 10 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Our next item is
- 11 administration. Mike Walsh is not with us today
- 12 so Wendy Chan, our Director of Human Resources,
- will present today's new hires. She will be
- 14 followed by Jim Buck, who is the Director of
- 15 Information Technology, who will also give a
- 16 presentation on the Slots Link system.
- 17 Did I say that right, Jim?
- 18 MR. BUCK: Yes.
- MS. CHAN: Good morning, Mr. Chairman,
- 20 Members of the Board. I am Wendy Chan, Director
- of Human Resources.
- I would like to present the following
- 23 people for employment with the Gaming Control
- 24 Board. They have all successfully completed a
- 25 comprehensive background investigation without

1	any areas of concern:
2	Doreen Appel, Special Assistant;
3	Kari DeMaria, Licensing Analyst;
4	Allison Hicks, Licensing Analyst;
5	Allison Deibert, Licensing Analyst;

10	Jennadi Ferriola, Investigator; and
11	A. Blaine Frank, Investigator.
12	With these new hires, our total
13	complement will be up to 182 employees; and that
14	includes 16% minority.
15	CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you, Wendy.
16	Any questions for Wendy?
17	COMMISSIONER RIVERS: Chairman, based
18	on the recommendation of the Director of HR, I
19	recommend we hire the following people that she
20	has named.
21	CHAIRMAN MARSHALL: Second.
22	COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.
23	CHAIRMAN DECKER: Again, any questions
24	or comments?
25	THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]

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1 CHAIRMAN DECKER: All those in favor of
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- 2 the motion say aye.
- THE BOARD: Aye.
- 4 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any opposed?
- 5 THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 6 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Motion carries.
- 7 Thank you, Wendy.
- 8 Jim.
- 9 MR. BUCK: Good morning, Mr. Chairman
- 10 and Members of the Board.
- 11 Today I am here to update you on a
- 12 project I presented to you in May that has an
- 13 agency-wide impact as it relates to the gaming
- 14 application process.
- 15 I would like to report on the status of
- 16 Slots Link and briefly show you what has been
- 17 completed.
- 18 Back in May I presented our vision to
- 19 develop an on-line application process for
- 20 gaming employees in Pennsylvania.
- 21 The goal was to develop a
- 22 fully-automated system to assemble all of the
- 23 required information for licensing, review and
- 24 reporting. I am pleased to announce that Slots
- 25 Link is now a reality for gaming and non-gaming

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1 employees.
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- 2 The first version of this application
- 3 has been beta tested by Mohegan Sun at Pocono
- 4 Downs. They are very pleased with the on-line
- 5 application and report how easy it is to use
- 6 compared to the paper application.
- 7 We will continue our beta testing of
- 8 Slots Link at Philadelphia Park later this week.
- 9 Next week we are scheduled to implement it at
- 10 Chester Downs.
- 11 Based on their feedback, minor
- 12 adjustments are being made to improve the
- 13 system.
- 14 I would like to remind everyone that
- 15 Slots Link is not available for the general
- 16 public. You must have a bona fide offer from a
- 17 gaming facility to access Slots Link.
- 18 The gaming facility logs into Slots
- 19 Link with their user name and password. To
- 20 create a new application, they enter basic
- 21 demographic and employment information about the
- 22 applicant. The instructions are printed for the
- 23 applicant with their user ID and password.
- 24 The first time the applicant logs onto
- 25 Slots Link, a brief questionnaire must be

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answered to determine which sections will be
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- 2 included in their customized, on-line
- 3 application.
- 4 For example, if someone was never in
- 5 the military, they would not need to answer any
- 6 additional questions concerning military
- 7 service.
- 8 They can stop at any time and resume
- 9 later. The sections can be answered in any
- 10 order. The system has the flexibility to adjust
- 11 to any quantity of information. It will handle
- 12 an applicant having six past residences as
- easily as an applicant with only one.
- 14 At all times the applicant can see what
- 15 sections have been completed, what is in
- progress, and what they still need to begin.
- When the applicant is ready to submit
- the application, the system checks for missing
- information displaying the deficiencies on the
- 20 screen. This will save considerable staff time
- 21 that would have been spent by one of our
- 22 licensing analysts to check that the application
- is complete.
- 24 The applicant must also acknowledge
- 25 that everything has been answered truthfully.

1 The application can be printed for the applicant

- 2 to retain for their records.
- 3 Once they agree that the application is
- 4 ready to be submitted, the data is locked down
- 5 to prevent further editing.
- 6 The applicant returns to the gaming
- 7 facility to complete the submission process.
- 8 The gaming facility's HR staff logs onto
- 9 Slots Link to print all of the forms that
- 10 are required for the applicant's signature.
- 11 They must acknowledge that all of the signed
- 12 paperwork is on file for later inspection by the
- 13 Gaming Control Board.
- 14 Submitting the application signifies
- that the gaming facility approves the processing
- of the applicant's background checks by our
- 17 organization.
- 18 At any time the applicant and the
- 19 gaming facility can view the status of their
- 20 application. The gaming facility can see a
- 21 break-out of the number of applicants in several
- 22 categories.
- 23 They also have the ability to look at
- 24 the submission status for each of their
- 25 applicants, but not the specific application

data. They cannot see the status of applicants

- 2 for any other gaming facilities either.
- When the application has been submitted
- 4 to the PGCB, the interfaces sending segmented
- 5 data to selected agencies are initiated. Only
- 6 the appropriate data that is required by that
- 7 agency is sent to them electronically.
- 8 There is an interface with the
- 9 Department of Revenue for state tax clearance.
- 10 JNET, the Pennsylvania Justice Network, provides
- 11 a watch-list of all of the applicants. Selected
- Gaming Control Board staff is notified by e-mail
- of any incidents involving any applicants.
- 14 Demographic data is transmitted to the system
- 15 we are using for photo capturing and
- 16 fingerprinting. Confirmation e-mails are also
- 17 sent to the applicant.
- 18 Slots Link will assist automating the
- 19 work flow within the Gaming Control Board.
- 20 Standard and ad hoc reports will be run to
- 21 monitor and track each applicant.
- 22 If additional information is required,
- 23 the applicant will be requested to log on to
- 24 Slots Link to submit the supplemental
- 25 information through the application amendment

- 1 page.
- 2 This new page was developed to provide
- 3 the flexibility, to add additional information
- 4 or explanation while maintaining the integrity
- of the original application, which cannot be
- 6 edited.
- 7 The development of Slots Link has been
- 8 a team effort. The project is very complex and
- 9 involved many individuals. The team
- 10 accomplished the project that no other gaming
- 11 jurisdiction has undertaken.
- I would like to recognize the
- developers of Computer Aid for their efforts.
- 14 I would also like to thank Patrick Williams
- 15 for his involvement throughout the
- development, testing and implementation
- 17 of Slots Link.
- 18 Lisa Aungst and her team at the
- 19 Department of Revenue worked with us to
- 20 develop the interface with Revenue and
- 21 Phillip Tomassini and his staff at
- JNET have been and continue to be very
- helpful.
- 24 Today we are declaring success
- 25 with Phase 1 of Slots Link. There is

- 1 still work to be done. The work within PGCB
- 2 needs to be enhanced. Call logs need to be
- 3 developed and ad hoc reports designed.
- 4 In addition, we want to expand this to
- 5 included vendors and other groups such as
- 6 suppliers, union representatives and the
- 7 Horsemen's Association. Other modules are in
- 8 the planning stages.
- 9 That's a snapshot of Slots Link.
- 10 At the beginning of the this project I
- 11 was told that failure was not an option, and we
- 12 are pleased with this release, the progress of
- the ongoing development and the positive
- 14 comments we've received from the applicants.
- There is no action required by the
- Board, but at this time I would entertain any
- 17 questions that you have.
- 18 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any questions for
- 19 Jim?
- THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 21 CHAIRMAN DECKER: I have one. How soon
- do you think it will be really usable by the
- casinos as they open up?
- As we know, it is going to take a while
- 25 for these casinos to get up and running. I

- 1 mean, our estimate is four weeks or something
- 2 after their property is built, and they start
- 3 getting the floor laid out, et cetera.
- What do you think? And they are going
- 5 to be hiring prior to that time? I don't want
- 6 to pin you down, but what do you think?
- 7 MR. BUCK: We have been using it since
- 8 last Friday.
- 9 CHAIRMAN DECKER: So you think it is
- 10 almost ready to go?
- 11 MR. BUCK: The beta testing involved
- submitting actual data, which is going into
- 13 the live system. We have not had any major
- 14 problems or issues. So we are moving ahead with
- 15 it.
- 16 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Does any other gaming
- 17 regulatory body have a system like this?
- MR. BUCK: No, they do not.
- 19 CHAIRMAN DECKER: So this is a
- 20 wonderful thing. I applaud you and Susan,
- 21 because Susan was just talking about this two
- 22 years ago. I thought it was a good pie in the
- 23 sky at the time but this is great. It is really
- 24 terrific.
- Now, we have some other things to get

- done there in addition to the applications. As
- 2 you know, one of them is to make sure we get the
- 3 fingerprinting done so we can finish the
- 4 background checks and things. So hopefully we
- 5 are going to get that resolved shortly.
- 6 Correct?
- 7 MS. NEEB: Yes. Yes, we will.
- 8 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Good. That will be
- 9 great. That is really terrific. Thanks.
- 10 Thanks very much.
- MR. BUCK: Thank you.
- 12 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any questions?
- 13 SECRETARY FAJT: What kind of back-up
- 14 data do you have on this system so that if there
- 15 would be a crash of the Slots Link system? Is
- there either a hard-copy back-up or another
- 17 computer-based back-up?
- MR. BUCK: We have a -- we are backing
- 19 up that system on a regular basis, as well as we
- 20 are copying that data back to another server
- 21 throughout the day. So we have dual
- 22 back-ups on that.
- 23 SECRETARY FAJT: When you say on a
- 24 regular basis, how often is it done?
- MR. BUCK: The back-up is run right now

- 1 once a night.
- 2 SECRETARY FAJT: Okay. Thank you.
- 3 COMMISSIONER COLINS: I have a
- 4 question.
- Jim, the interface with JNET, does
- 6 that -- will there be any connection or
- 7 interface with the fingerprinting system that
- 8 will be developed for the gaming employees?
- 9 Will that info. somehow be interfaced with Slots
- 10 Link?
- MR. BUCK: It is not through JNET,
- 12 but we have a separate interface that is
- used to populate the photo capture system
- 14 with the data in Slots Link; then
- 15 the photo capture center is connected
- 16 to the live scan systems. We are doing this now
- 17 with the fingerprinting that we have done to
- 18 date.
- 19 COMMISSIONER COLINS: Okay. So we are
- 20 ready to go in that aspect? Our technology is
- 21 ready?
- MR. BUCK: That's correct.
- 23 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thanks, Mary.
- Once again, I want to thank Greg for
- 25 all of the help they provided in the past.

- 1 Again, where you could have tensions,
- 2 it is a wonderful example of how people work
- 3 together to get something done in a partnering
- 4 relationship.
- 5 Again, I thank you. On behalf of the
- 6 Board, Greg, we really appreciate everything you
- 7 have done for us, including give us a few
- 8 employees.
- 9 Again, thank you.
- 10 SECRETARY FAJT: You've been good
- 11 lately, Tad.
- 12 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Yeah, that's true.
- Okay. Michael Edmiston, next up.
- 14 Michael is our Director of Hearings and
- 15 Appeals and he will now present some withdrawal
- 16 petitions for our consideration.
- 17 MR. EDMISTON: And very briefly,
- 18 Mr. Chairman and members of the Board, good
- 19 morning.
- 20 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Good morning.
- 21 MR. EDMISTON: Shortly I expect you
- 22 will have before you a motion that will propose
- the granting of orders without prejudice for 22
- 24 applicants, orders of withdrawal, they include
- 25 permittees, key employee qualifiers, one

- 1 management company, and you also will have an
- 2 additional proposed order of withdrawal and
- 3 transfer as to one key employee qualifier.
- 4 There are no objections on the part of
- 5 Chief Enforcement Counsel to these withdrawals
- 6 without prejudice.
- 7 There are no outstanding issues as to
- 8 the status of the fees for these applications.
- 9 All of these fees are non-refundable, and
- 10 counsel in each one of these matters has agreed
- 11 to the proposed orders.
- 12 That is all I have for you,
- 13 Mr. Chairman.
- 14 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you.
- 15 COMMISSIONER COY: Mr. Chairman, I move
- 16 that the Board approve the orders granting
- 17 withdrawal of applications for Arnold Aronoitz,

- 2 and that the order granting the transfer of
- 3 interest application of Guy T. Hillyer.
- 4 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you, Jeff.
- 5 Can we have a second, please?
- 6 COMMISSIONER RIVERS: Second.
- 7 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any questions for
- 8 Michael on this issue?
- 9 [NO RESPONSE]
- 10 CHAIRMAN DECKER: All of those in favor
- 11 say aye.
- 12 THE BOARD: Aye.
- 13 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any opposed to the
- 14 withdrawal?
- THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- MR. EDMISTON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
- 17 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you.
- Okay. Are there some motions?
- MS. NEEB: There are resolutions from
- 20 the Director of the Gaming Lab.
- 21 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Okay. Richard. I'm
- 22 sorry.
- MS. NEEB: We have resolutions
- 24 concerning the movement of slot machines.
- 25 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Okay. I understand.

- 1 Richard? Thank you.
- 2 MR. WILLIAMSON: Good morning, Chairman
- 3 Decker and Members of the Commission. What we
- 4 have before you are three requests to possess
- 5 slot machines, one from Mohegan Sun to possess
- 6 them for training purposes in their office
- 5 building, which is right in front of the track;
- 8 that's been inspected and there has been no
- 9 objections from the staff to this.
- 10 The other two requests are both from
- 11 Betson Coin-OP Distributing Company, a supplier.
- 12 They have offices in Pittsburgh and in King of
- 13 Prussia. Both facilities have been inspected,
- 14 and there are no objections from the staff for
- 15 that. Since each facility is separately
- approved, there are three resolutions for these.
- 17 CHAIRMAN DECKER: How would this work?
- 18 They would have slot machines there?
- MR. WILLIAMS: Yes, as a supplier they
- would have slot machines.
- 21 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Okay. All right.
- Now, how do you want to deal with this? Why
- 23 don't we do them individually?
- 24 COMMISSIONER ANGELI: Mr. Chairman, I
- 25 would like to make a motion for the Board to

- 1 approve the resolution authorizing possession of
- 2 slot machines by Downs Racing as outlined by the
- 3 Director of Gaming Laboratory Operations.
- 4 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Do I have a second?
- 5 COMMISSIONER RIVERS: Second.
- 6 COMMISSIONER MARSHAL: Second.
- 7 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you. Any
- 8 questions or comments?
- 9 THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 10 CHAIRMAN DECKER: All those in favor
- 11 please indicate by saying aye.
- 12 THE BOARD: Aye.
- 13 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any opposed?
- 14 THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 15 CHAIRMAN DECKER: The motion carries.
- 16 Can I have a motion on the second
- 17 proposed resolution?

- 22 Prussia as outlined by the Director of Gaming
- 23 Laboratory Operations.
- 24 COMMISSIONER RIVERS: Second.
- 25 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Again, any questions

- 1 or comments?
- THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 3 CHAIRMAN DECKER: All those in favor
- 4 say aye.
- 5 THE BOARD: Aye.
- 6 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any opposed?
- 7 THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 8 CHAIRMAN DECKER: The motion carries.
- 9 We have a third resolution?
- 10 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Yes, Mr.
- 11 Chairman.
- 12 I would like to make a motion for the
- Board to approve the authorizing the possession
- of slot machines by Beston Coin-OP Distribution
- 15 Company in Pittsburgh, as outlined by the
- 16 Director of Gaming Laboratory Operations.
- 17 COMMISSIONER COY: Second.
- 18 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you.
- 19 Any questions or comments?
- THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]
- 21 CHAIRMAN DECKER: All those in favor
- 22 please indicate by saying aye.
- THE BOARD: Aye.
- 24 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Any opposed?
- THE BOARD: [NO RESPONSE]

- 1 CHAIRMAN DECKER: The motion carries.
- 2 Richard, thank you very much.
- 3 MR. WILLIAMSON: My pleasure. Thank
- 4 you.
- 5 COMMISSIONER COLINS: Can the written
- 6 resolutions be incorporated into the record?
- 7 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Sure.
- 8 COMMISSIONER COLINS: Not read but just
- 9 incorporated in.
- MS. NEEB: We have the resolutions.
- 11 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you.
- 12 Okay. We will pass on the budget
- 13 issue --
- MS. NEEB: Right.
- 15 CHAIRMAN DECKER: -- for now.
- Okay. Now, I think we have a quick
- 17 scheduling note before we close.
- 18 Our next meeting will be on Wednesday
- 19 September 27th. And as we discussed before, it
- 20 will be a very significant one; that is the day
- 21 that we are going to consider our six
- 22 applications for Conditional 1 -- excuse me --
- 23 Conditional Category 1 Gaming Licenses.
- 24 As everyone I would think knows, we
- 25 began our licensing hearings on the Cat 1s

- 1 yesterday. I believe they went very well.
- We will complete two more today. We
- did three yesterday, and we will hold the final
- 4 Cat 1 suitability hearing on the morning of
- 5 September 27th. And then, of course, we will be
- 6 ready to vote.
- 7 We will be holding this meeting --
- 8 those meetings -- I'm sorry -- in the auditorium
- 9 of the Forum Building, which is right on Walnut
- 10 Street here in Harrisburg.
- 11 Like all of our meetings, this one will
- 12 again be open for the public, and we look
- forward to seeing all of you there.
- 14 Is there any other business to come
- 15 from the meeting today?
- 16 COMMISSIONER RIVERS: Move for
- 17 adjournment.
- 18 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Thank you. Second?
- 19 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.
- 20 CHAIRMAN DECKER: All in favor?
- 21 THE BOARD: Aye.
- 22 CHAIRMAN DECKER: Motion carries. We
- 23 are adjourned. Thank you very much.
