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PROCEEDINGS

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CHAIRMAN:

Folks, we're going to continue this hearing with Greenwood Gaming. I'd like them to proceed up here. Folks, you're testing my patience. Folks, we're going to take a five-minute break. We'll take a five-minute break. We'll be right back. Thank you.

10 SHORT BREAK TAKEN

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CHAIRMAN:

Could I ask everybody to please take your seats and also have the Greenwood Gaming and 14 Entertainment folks come up to the front table. Let's get restarted with Greenwood Gaming. And could I have, as we did for the Foxwoods folks, anybody who's presenting testimony on behalf of Greenwood Gaming, please stand up, state your name, spell your name for the stenographer, and then we will have you sworn in. Gentlemen, please stand, state your name for the stenographer, spell your name, and then we'll swear you in.

ATTORNEY KOHLER:

Good morning, Chairman Fajt.

CHAIRMAN:

Yes. Please ---.

ATTORNEY KOHLER:

I am Alan Kohler, K-O-H-L-E-R, with Eckert Seamans on behalf of Greenwood Gaming.

ALAN C. KOHLER, HAVING FIRST BEEN DULY SWORN, 6

TESTIFIED AS FOLLOWS:

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CHAIRMAN:

10 Thank you. Greenwood Gaming, please 11 proceed with your presentation.

12 A. Good morning, Chairman Fajt. Good morning, 13 members of the Board. I think we have some technical difficulty that we'll get straightened out here in one second, but this is an exciting time for Greenwood Gaming or Philadelphia Park. We are now less than four months away from the grand opening of our new casino. We are looking forward to that day, obviously. We have an obligation under our Statement of Conditions to, from time to time, update you, present any changes and also provide you more detail as that detail develops in advance of opening. That is why we are here today and will likely appear before you at least once more before the opening in mid-24 25 December.

Things are on schedule. Things are going well. 1 We think we have a great facility to tell you about. 3 And I know, Chairman Fajt, you've toured the facility. Some others have seen the facility. And as the construction proceeds, it's starting to take shape and you can start to see what it will look like when we do If you give me one minute, we'll get the PowerPoint going.

What I can say until we do that is the facility is now planned to have --- to open with 3,300 slot 11 machines. The size of the gaming floor is 128,855 12 square feet, as planned. This is --- and anybody who's been even on the construction site, the thing that strikes you almost ---.

15 BRIEF INTERRUPTION

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The thing that strikes you --- or at least strikes 17 me almost immediately, even as compared to other 18 facilities at least that I've been to, is the massive size of the facility. It is a very large facility. 19 20 It will have a very large gaming floor. And we'll be 21 in a position to be prepared to provide amenities, the 22 3,300 slot machines to start, and to react to any 23 developments that may occur.

CHAIRMAN:

I'm sorry. We do have copies up here. Ι

apologize to the folks in the audience who don't have copies, but hopefully we'll have this straightened out 3 momentarily. Please proceed. And Mr. Bonner will chip in here, but we're going to go through this fairly quickly. The front page gives you some idea --- it's a rendering, of course, but some idea of what the fully-constructed casino will look like. I think the thing that catches your eye, which may be a little different from the other 10 facilities, is the video screens in the front of the casino. They are, as you can see from the rendering, 11 very large. The center screen is 61 feet wide and 35 12 13 --- approximately 35 feet high. The two screens 14 are --- the two side screens are approximately 50 feet 15 wide and approximately 30 feet wide. And we'll go into that a little more. As you move to the second 16 17 page, you can start to see that --- these are very 18 recent photos, last week. You can start to see that take shape and start to envision what that will look 19 20 like in real life. The following photos are just 21 construction photos. It gives you, you know, some 22 feeling --- and you really can't appreciate it unless you're inside the construction site, but some feeling 23 2.4 for how fast it is. We can skip through those 25 quickly.

After the construction photos you have ---. let the audience catch up. This is a rendering of what it will look like as you approach the casino, and then, again, the large video screens being the feature you notice most. And I guess I have to flip now. This is sort of a side view of the portico chair (phonetic) and the entryway as you would drive up to the casino. This is what the plan looks like. You can see the gaming floor, the entrance, back room areas.

MR. RIVERS:

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Could you point out what certain things are on this --- on these sheets?

ATTORNEY BONNER:

Maybe I can help with that, Commissioner. In the lower portion of the slide we're looking at now is the main entrance. Those areas marked portico cahir to the right of the center and left of the center are the main entrance doors. Folks will enter and in between those two doors, up against the 21 building wall, is the main customer/player desk, where folks will get customer service. Cards are issued at that point. And then there's access straight into the casino from those main entrances. To the right of the 25 main casino area, in the orange color area, is the

food court. And staying on the right side of the wall, as you move to the back of the building there's a cage and simulcast area. And then in the gray 3 areas, up towards the top on the right, one is a steakhouse restaurant. And then the one farthest to the back on the right is a Chickie's and Pete's Restaurant that will be open in the casino. The area in the center to the back, the gray area, that is shell space that is being constructed but not being 10 outfitted at this time. That provides for expansion in the future, if the market indicates that it's 11 12 appropriate for it. But right now the plan that we're showing you would accommodate 3,300 slot machines. 13 Wе 14 now operate 2,912. So it's a significant increase 15 over the machines that we currently operate, yet with 16 potential to expand beyond that increased number if 17 the market indicates that. We also have a couple bars 18 and lounges. The food court area that I mentioned has five or six outlets for different kinds of food as 19 20 well. 21

21 A. And we'll get to see some of these things as we go 22 through the PowerPoint.

MR. MCCABE:

Where is the Gaming Board's office?

25 <u>ATTORNEY BONNER</u>:

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The Gaming Board's office is --- in the upper right appendage, all that gray area, that's back-of-house area, and the Gaming Board and State Police offices are in that area to the right but closest to the casino itself. I don't know if I've answered your question, Commissioner.

MR. MCCABE:

Yes. I just wanted to see because we had a concern early on of letting the public know where we're located. And one of the casinos put us in the basement, away from everybody. And we had to tell them, no, we wanted to be --- have access to the gaming floor.

ATTORNEY BONNER:

We had those discussions with staff,

Commissioner, and the Gaming Board and the State

Police space is in the back-of-house area but the

closest of that space to the casino floor. So they're

literally out of the doorway and into the casino.

A. This is what --- a rendering of what the lobby

will look like as you come into the casino.

ATTORNEY BONNER:

That's the main desk between the two main entrances in the lobby area of the casino.

A. This is a rendering of what the gaming floor will

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look like. Another one. This is obviously the
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   cashier's cage. This is --- as part of our Statement
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  of Conditions we were required to do everything
  possible to put a simulcast area in the actual casino.
  There will be a simulcast area in the actual casino.
  This is a rendering of what it will look like.
                MR. SOJKA:
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                Will you also have one on the trackside
   as well?
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                ATTORNEY BONNER:
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                Yes.
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                MR. SOJKA:
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                 So you'll have two simulcast rooms?
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       On the trackside ---.
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                ATTORNEY BONNER:
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                 In the grandstand building, yes.
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                MR. SOJKA:
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                 Yes.
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                ATTORNEY BONNER:
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                We have it on the first floor and the
  fifth floor in the existing building, and that will
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  remain.
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                MR. SOJKA:
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                Okay. So you're going to be rich in
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  simulcast areas?
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ATTORNEY BONNER:

We will be.

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This is the center bar, which is in the center of the facility.

ATTORNEY BONNER:

Right. We have two main bar/lounge areas, and this is one of them.

This is the entryway to the high limit room. is the food court, what it will look like. Another picture of the food --- another rendering of the food court.

ATTORNEY BONNER:

More food court.

14 Where you pick up your food. And this is not 15 directly relevant to our petition or the permitted facility, but we did want to give you --- in many of 16 17 these hearings you've had a question about the backside commitment, so we figured we'd address that 18 19 in advance.

Our backside commitment is dictated by a contract with our Horsemen's Association. It's a contractual obligation. It goes well beyond the obligation in the 23 statute. This gives you some idea of where we're at 24 with that. Even though we haven't even opened our permitted facility, we have expended large amounts of

money and made significant progress to a complete renovation of the backside.

MR. SOJKA:

Does your current plan also call for taking the existing slot machines out of the racing side when you have the new facility up and running? This was an issue that --- this was also an Α. Yes. issue when you approved our permitted facility. you required in your order is that if we were going to keep any slot machines in the grandstand, that it had to be with your approval, which I think goes without saying. Under current plans we will have no slot machines in the grandstand. The company's view of that 14 has evolved. And so to the extent that might have been an issue, it will not be.

MR. SOJKA:

Good.

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This is the final slide. It gives you, by Α. quarter, some idea of the expenditures that we've made on the backside and continue to make on the backside and will continue in the future. And just the emphasis that, you know, again, pursuant to contract but well beyond the statute we've certainly met our obligation in that regard.

ATTORNEY BONNER:

Mr. Chairman, on that point, I think it's 1 2 significant, Alan can correct me, I think the statutory requirement was an investment of \$5 million 3 on the backside. The contract we have with the Horsemen, which we've extended out to year 2018, has --- requires us to do renovations like those outlines. The total cost is going to be about \$25 million. So we're significantly exceeding the requirements of the statute but doing it in concert 10 with the Horsemen for the maximum benefit for racing at the track, which continues to be one of the most 11 12 successful operations in the country. So we're 1.3 pleased with the results thus far. 14 That concludes our presentation, so we'd be glad 15 to entertain questions, or you can turn things over to

CHAIRMAN:

the Office of Enforcement Counsel.

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Let me just ask if it's okay if the Board holds questions. Let me ask Office of Enforcement Counsel, do you have any questions for Philly Park, and then we'll let you do your presentation?

ATTORNEY PITRE:

We don't have a presentation. We filed our Answer, and we are not in objection to their petition. I do have a couple of questions, though.

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CHAIRMAN:

Please proceed.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY ATTORNEY PITRE:

- 5 Q. With regard to your construction timeframe and the
- 6 opening, we know we're under a December deadline for
- 7 that to happen; are you guys on track to meet that
- 8 deadline?

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- 9 A. Yes, we're on schedule. But as you're fully
- 10 aware, it's a very tight schedule. It was a very
- 11 tight schedule from the beginning. Our plan is to
- 12 open on time. We also plan, however, to start meeting
- 13 with staff, assuming they're amenable, you know,
- 14 frequently in the fall and keeping in touch on all
- 15 issues so that if there is a problem, which we don't
- 16 foresee and, you know, aren't here to notify you of,
- 17 but if there is a problem which could affect the
- 18 timeline, we would let you know immediately and would
- 19 work towards a resolution. But to answer your
- 20 question directly, we are on schedule.
- 21 Q. Okay. And the second thing, back when the
- 22 extension was given, there was some talk about
- 23 integrating the racing side with the casino. There
- 24 was some talk of Smarty Jones Way and having a trolley
- 25 of some sort to transport people back and forth from

1 the racing side to the casino. Has that been fully implemented in your plan?

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Those plans have not changed. You know, you're referring to the requirement of a shuttle bus back and forth. That's in our Statement of Conditions, and I think we did refer to it as Smarty Jones Way. anyway, a well-developed promenade between the grandstand and the new casino. We are not here to ask for any modifications to our Statement of Conditions today.

ATTORNEY MILLER:

And can I say, Commissioners, I recently 13 visited the site. I recently saw the entrance where they'll be do the busing to and from the casinos. bluntly asked Mr. Bonner questions about whether or not they were committed to that, and I'm absolutely satisfied they are committing to integrating this facility with the grandstand.

CHAIRMAN:

Mr. Kohler or Mr. Bonner, any questions for OEC?

ATTORNEY KOHLER:

No, sir.

CHAIRMAN:

I'll entertain questions from the Board.

I have two quick questions. I'm a little concerned about the reduction in slot machines. I think your plan, as filed in 2007, stated that you would have 4,000 machines in your new facility. Now, I understand you're going to have 3,300, which is, give or take, I guess, 400 more than what you have now. I do understand that you have some room for expansion.

8 And can you tell us why you reduced from 4,000 to 3,300?

ATTORNEY BONNER:

Sure. I'll give it a shot, Mr. Chairman. We think that it's the prudent way to proceed in the market, which is a market that is still developing. We've seen other operators come in with a large complement of machines, which overall have relatively low utilization and low win per units. Our goal is to maintain our relatively high win per unit, and we think that --- although we're in a very vibrant and rich demographic area, we think that increasing what we're currently operating by ten percent in one shot, which his what we're doing actually more than that, is about what the right number is. And this is gained by experience and operation and by the experience we've seen other operators have since we submitted that information to you a couple of years ago. So we think

that this is the best way to provide the product to the customer, allow time for it to be absorbed. And as you see, we have the opportunity in the space that is already constructed to expand if the market tells us that the demand is there.

ATTORNEY KOHLER:

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There's been another factor in that decision making, and I think it is basically a 8 decision to serve our patrons in the most efficient 10 manner. As I'm sure you all know, we currently have two floors of casino, the first and the third floor of 11 the grandstand. The third floor --- and this being, 12 you know, something that typically happens in --- you 13 14 don't see many multi-floor casinos. But where they 15 are, this typically happens, is that people will --you know, will frequent the first floor. And our win 17 per unit on the third floor has been lower. We have underutilized machines on the third floor. 18 You know, we may have some over-utilized machines on the first 19 20 floor. We think that all evens out when we go to a 21 single-floor permanent facility. We should be able to 22 maintain the win per unit of machines that were 23 successful and increase win per unit on machines that were formerly on the higher floor. And that 24 25 ultimately, this will provide, you know, a great

economic model. I don't know that we're expecting a 1 2 whole lot less business than we originally planned 3 for, this just being a more efficient way to initially serve it. The other thing I wanted to say is Philly Park, you know, has not been shy about increasing the number of slot machines when they see a market made. In fact, we've been criticized for --- you know, for being aggressive in that in the past. So you know, if we need more slot machines, we will be talking to you 10 immediately. And you know, more slot machines means more revenue, so we have a business interest in that 11 12 regard.

CHAIRMAN:

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One other quick question. On the existing grandstand building, I heard you say earlier that you were going to put some simulcast rooms there. Anything else in that building?

ATTORNEY BONNER:

We currently have simulcast there, Mr.

Chairman, and we're going to preserve that in the grandstand. We have an obligation as one of our conditions of existing licensure to restore that grandstand to racing, once we move the casino operation out of it, and to start that within a certain period after we open the new casino. We're in

the process now of designing those plans. Our
thinking is that we continue and expand the racing
operation there. We continue the food and beverage
operations that are there and possibly expand them,
because we will have additional space. And then we'll
have space that could be reserved for special events
and occasional activities, perhaps in concert with the
racing cards. And that's where we are right now. But
we are required to develop plans and submit them to
the Gaming Board, which we will be doing in the near
future.

CHAIRMAN:

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Okay. Thank you.

MR. SOJKA:

Just one quick follow up on that, and that is, again, we understand you would have to petition us or come to us, but none of your plans for adding more slot machines would involve putting them back into the grandstand, would they?

ATTORNEY KOHLER:

Well, no. And there's no plan --- you know, I sit here under oath, and there's no plans to do that. But you know, sometimes things change, and I just want to --- we are not legally precluded from proposing that.

1 MR. SOJKA: 2 That's right. But you would need to come 3 back to us. ATTORNEY KOHLER: 4 5 But there are absolutely no plans to do that right now. That was a possibility that was under 6 very active consideration by management at one time. I'm not guaranteeing you that it might not revisit at some point in the future, but it is not on the table 10 right now. 11 MR. SOJKA: 12 Okay. 13 CHAIRMAN: 14 Thank you. We're going to take a 45 15 minute break for executive session. We'll come back and reconvene the public meeting.
