We'll now call the matter of Mt. Airy Number One, LLC, Petition for Approval of Expansion and Reconfiguration of their Gaming Floor. Could the representatives of Mt. Airy please come forward?

Thank you. We'll get started here. Again, I would ask anyone who is speaking on behalf of

10 Mt. Airy, LLC or OEC who are not attorneys to please

11 stand and be sworn in by the stenographer.

CHAIRMAN:

Thank you. And again, anybody who's speaking for the first time, please state your name and spell it for the stenographer. And with that, Mt. Airy, you may begin.

ATTORNEY SHIFFER:

Good afternoon, Commissioners. Don 22 Shiffer, S-H-I-F-F-E-R, counsel for Mt. Airy Casino. To my immediate left is Mt. Airy's CEO, George Toth. 23 24 And to his immediate left is our Vice President of casino operations, James Tuthill. 25

On April the 7th, this Board approved Mt.

Airy's Table Games Petition. And in its May 3rd

Order, granted Mt. Airy approval of its Table Games

Operational Certificate. In its Table Games Petition,

Mt. Airy submitted slide one for the Board's review,

depicting 2,451 slot machines as well as 68 table

games. And that breakdown is as follows.

On April the 12th, Mt. Airy filed a petition with the Board seeking approval of amendments to its gaming floor plan to reflect additional square footage of its gaming floor, reconfiguration of its gaming floor and reduction in the total number of slot machines in placement of table games on its existing gaming floor.

In asking for relief to reduce the number of slot machines, slides three and four reflect those. Slides --- appendix B of the original --- excuse me. Appendix B reflects 2,451 slot machines and there was an original request for a reduction. And that would be the rendering of that.

The breakdown of table games in the original petition remained at 68 and had the following complement. On April the 23rd, Mt. Airy filed a petition with the --- an amendment to this petition with the Board, withdrawing its request to reduce the

1 total number of slot machines on its gaming floor.
2 And due to changes that were precipitated by
3 management, relocated all of its table games to the
4 main gaming floor and moved the location of its Asian
5 games on its floor. That would be depicted in

appendix C of its amended petition, labeled OP-5C.

In addition to the reconfiguration,
because of the logistics involved with the changes,

Mt. Airy was able to fit an additional four table games on its gaming floor in addition to the 68 that was approved. This is reflected in this slide. As

you can see, the changes are as follows.

The poker area was moved. This is a rendering of the third floor at Mt. Airy. This is its bus entrance. This is its hotel entrance. There were originally poker games placed here. They were moved all down into what was formerly the Asian gaming area. And the Asian gaming area was moved to an area north

And the Asian gaming area was moved to an area north of the center bar on the floor.

The current breakdown of slot machines that we are proposing before the Board this afternoon is 72. Again, this is four games more than we were granted allotment for originally. But we believe that the revenue that these games would generate and given the fact that they would meet all surveillance and

operational conditions, internal control conditions, that we ask for the increase.

To sum it up, the increase in the square footage of Mt. Airy's gaming floor would go from an originally --- it is OP-4, which it's currently operating under 57,261 square feet to 69,247 square feet with 2,451 slot machines and 72 table games. This, our management believes and our operations experts believe, would maximize the coverage and configuration for the types of games that we would like to go with.

ATTORNEY DAVENPORT:

Yes, thank you, Chairman. Nan Davenport, Deputy Chief Enforcement Counsel for the OEC. want to point out pursuant to Section 1317(a)(2) of the amended Act, the Table Games Operation Certificate shall include an itemized list by type of table games and the number of gaming tables approved by the Board and permitted in the licensed facility.

And Don, I just want to clarify. 23 Although you state that you're increasing the number that the Board already authorized under the Table Games Operation Certificate Petition by four you're

also increasing, and in some cases decreasing, the numbers for the different break out. Could you just please go over that quickly as well?

ATTORNEY SHIFFER:

Certainly, Nan. I'm going to let that question be fielded by Jim Tuthill.

Good afternoon, Chairman and 8 Commissioners. My name is James Tuthill, J-A-M-E-S, T 10 as in Thomas, U, T as in Thomas, H-I-L-L. First of all, with regard to the movement to poker on the first 11 12 floor and having all games on the first floor, it's 13 our feeling that it's much more conducive to have 14 games within line of sight for shift managers, pit 15 managers, to be able to manage. That was the rationale behind bringing the games from the third 16 17 floor all to the main floor.

With regard to different marketing strategies as we move forward --- I'm sorry. Yes, I'm sorry. The question was with regard to the changes. 21 We reduced the number of poker games by bringing them to the first floor to 11 games and increased the number of mini baccarat games.

ATTORNEY DAVENPORT:

So appendix E, which was filed with your

second amended petition --- I believe that was filed on April 29th, 2010. As well as the very last power point, table games breakdown. It has a 72 number on the bottom of it. If you could go to that screen.

Okay. That is exactly the table games configuration that you're requesting today; is that correct?

That is correct.

So any table games operation certificate would have to reflect those numbers; correct?

MR. TUTHILL:

That is correct. That's correct.

ATTORNEY DAVENPORT:

Thank you. No further questions.

CHAIRMAN:

Okay. Does OEC have any presentation on this matter?

ATTORNEY DAVENPORT:

Just a quick statement. Because the petition and then the subsequent amended petitions changed so quickly, within two and a half weeks, we just want to make sure that any type of relief that they requested was reflected before the Board in order not to delay the implementation of table games at Mt.

10 In our answer, we set forth ten conditions, 1 Airy. and so we recommend the Board impose those conditions. 3 CHAIRMAN: Thank you. Does Mt. Airy have any 4 questions for the OEC? 6 ATTORNEY SHIFFER: Not at this time. 8 CHAIRMAN: 9 Questions from the Board? Commissioner 10 Ginty? 11 MR. GINTY: 12 Have you reviewed the conditions? 13 ATTORNEY SHIFFER: 14 Yes, I have, Commissioner. 15 MR. GINTY: 16 Do you agree with them? 17 ATTORNEY SHIFFER: 18 Yes, I do. 19 CHAIRMAN: 20 Commissioner Sojka? 21 MR. SOJKA: 22 I just need the numbers clarified again. 23 I know about the 72 table games. But you're now 24 saying 2,451 slot machines. Do I understand that to 25 be a reduction of about nine slot machines, or am I

lost?

No, Commissioner. Initially what Mt. Airy was granted --- the number of slot machines that 5 it was able to have in use pursuant to its table games certificate and what it is currently operating under, which is Operation Plan Four, it's authorized to have 2,451 machines ---

So you are at the number that you were supposed to be at in the statute in terms of the number of slot machines that were in operation before table games came in?

Yes, to our belief, yes.

25 Not to be dumb on this, but the question is really the 2,451 slot machines, is that the same number or more than the number of slot machines you had on October 1st of 2009? Because that's the critical date pursuant to the statute.

6 I would have to --- I would defer that specific number to the number that Mt. Airy had up --pursuant to delegate their authority by the Board. The Executive Director was able to reduce the number 10 of slot machines, up to two percent of the gaming floor. And I believe that Mt. Airy's request for that 11 reduction was fielded after October 1st of '09. But 12 13 pursuant to the request and the way it was authorized, in the Table Games Certificate, in the May 3rd Order, 14 15 2,451 slot machines is what we were authorized to 16 operate with.

ATTORNEY DAVENPORT:

Mr. Chairman, I'd like to point out that according to the Board's May 3rd, 2010 Order, paragraph seven states within five days after Board approval of the petition, Mt. Airy should provide BTO with a tentative schedule for implementing table games operation. At the completion of table games expansion project, Mt. Airy shall have a minimum of 2,451 slot machines available for play on its gaming floor.

CHAIRMAN:

Thank you. And the third floor, as I understood it, you're moving your table games that were originally planned there down to the first floor for the reasons that you stated. What is going in on the third floor?

MR. TOTH:

George Toth, G-E-O-R-G-E, T-O-T-H. Good afternoon, Commissioners and Chairman. The third floor will be all slots.

CHAIRMAN:

All slots. Thank you. Commissioner

13 Trujillo, any questions from your end?

MR. TRUJILLO:

No, thank you.

CHAIRMAN:

Thank you. Any other questions? Okay.
