I am Kenneth Zielonis, and I am the 4 Hearing Officer assigned to conduct today's public 6 input hearing. Before we begin, please turn off all cell phones, pagers, BlackBerries, et cetera, so as not to disturb the speakers or those in the audience. And as the presiding officer, I call to order this public input hearing for a Category 3 Slot Machine 10 License, Applicant Woodlands Fayette, LLC, docketed at 11 1566-2010. The date is September 8th, 2010, and the 12 time is approximately 10:00 a.m. The location is the 13 14 Wharton Township Municipal Building, 114 Elliotsville 15 Road, Farmington, PA, 15437.

This public input hearing is convened by the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board, pursuant to the directive and authority found in Section 1205(b) of the Gaming Act and the Board's regulations at 58 Pa. Code, Section 441a.6. This public hearing was advertised on the Board's website, announced at a previous public Board meeting, and advertised in the local newspapers.

The Board members present today for this hearing, from my left to right, Commissioner Gary

Sojka, Commissioner Jeffrey Coy, Chairman Gregory
Fajt, Commissioner Kenneth McCabe, and Commissioner
James Ginty. The Board and its staff would like to
thank Wharton Township for making this building
available for the hearing today.

This is the last public input hearing in a series of four hearings conducted by the Board, the purpose of which is to allow applicants for the remaining Category 3 Slot Machine License to present their plans before the Board and the public and to allow individual members of the public, community groups, elected officials and local government representatives to express their thoughts, share their concerns about the project with the Board.

The order of the speakers today is as follows: Applicant for the Category 3 Slot Machine License, Woodlands Fayette, then we will hear from any legislators, local government representatives, community leaders or their representatives and individual members of the public who have pre-registered to speak. Woodlands Fayette will have 45 minutes to make their presentation. Each legislative official will have five minutes to speak. Each governmental body will be given up to 30 minutes, and you may split your time into which among those who

are here to speak for you today, community group leaders, ten minutes, and individual members of the public will each have three minutes to speak.

It's very important that each individual begin their remarks by stating their name, your municipality and the state where you reside, and when speaking on behalf of an entity, the name of that entity. All the public speakers will be sworn in, in the groups that I mentioned earlier before the start of their presentation. I will be timing your presentations, will ask you to wrap up your comments at the end of your allotted time. To assist all speakers in adhering to the time limits, we have an electronic stop light over here, a light which shows green, yellow, red. When the light turns green, your time has started. When the light turns yellow, for Woodlands Fayette, you have five minutes, for all other speakers, that will mean you have 30 seconds of the allotted time and you should begin to wrap up your comments. When the light turns red, you will hear a beeping sound, and you're expected to stop speaking at that time and leave the microphone.

If your time runs out and you have comments remaining, please submit them as written comments for the Board's consideration. You may

choose, if you wish, to submit written comments. That 1 will be included as part of the evidentiary record at this public input hearing. Those written comments may 3 be an alternative for live testimony today or in addition to live testimony, and they may be submitted at this hearing. You may also submit them via the Board's website, which can be found at www.pgcb.state.pa.us, or you can mail or fax comments to the Board's clerk. We will be accepting written 10 comments for 60 days after the close of the hearing today or at the close of business Monday, November 11 8th, 2010, when the evidentiary hearing for this 12 public input hearing will be closed. 13

## HEARING OFFICER:

22 Thank you. You may be seated. And we're 23 ready to proceed.

## MR. NOBERS:

Good morning. My name is Jeff Nobers.

I'm a resident of Washington County, Pennsylvania, and
I am the vice-president of Nemacolin Woodlands Resort
and the 84 Lumber Company. I'd like to welcome
Chairman Fajt, Commissioners Coy, Sojka, Ginty,
McCabe, Hearing Officer Zielonis, the Board staff and
the ladies and gentlemen of the public for being here
with us today to hear what we believe are very
exciting plans for the Lady Luck Casino and Nemacolin
Woodlands Resort.

Nemacolin Woodlands and 84 Lumber have a long history of community involvement, and it's important to note that both of these companies obviously operate in the State of Pennsylvania but were founded here, founded by Pennsylvanians and later owned and operated by residents in this state. When 84 Lumber was first founded, Mr. Joe Hardy, the founder of that company, believed in giving back to the communities where this company did business. And that philosophy carried over to Nemacolin Woodlands some 25 years later, when Mr. Hardy purchased that property.

In the recent past, Nemacolin has donated millions of dollars to charities in Fayette County, especially, most recently, we raised nearly \$90,000 for the Boy Scouts of Fayette and Westmoreland County

through a golf tournament that is hosted by Mr. Hardy.

And the Hardy family recently made a million-dollar

pledge to the Uniontown Hospital Capital Campaign,

just a few examples of the involvement of the family

and the resort in this community. Clearly, we know

that Nemacolin Woodlands enhances the entire Laurel

Highlands region and is a crown jewel for this area,

as well as the State of Pennsylvania, and we are among

the largest employers in Fayette County.

Nemacolin Woodlands is a world-class, award-winning resort. And you will get some more details on that in just a few minutes. It was developed by and has been run by the Hardy family for nearly 25 years. And when the resort was first purchased, it encompassed 400 acres of land and had a 40-room hotel. Today we cover nearly 2,000 acres of land and we attract visitors from 44 states and six countries last year alone. Seventy (70) percent of the employees of Nemacolin Woodlands Resort reside in Fayette County. And it's estimated that in 2010 we will generate approximately \$1.5 million through the room occupancy tax that goes to the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau to further market this region.

Nemacolin Woodlands Resort not only meets
but exceeds the Gaming Act. We have 335 rooms,

suites, cabins and luxury homes, hundreds of amenities and activities, clearly more than any other resort property in the State of Pennsylvania, and quite frankly, perhaps more than any in this country.

The State and Nemacolin and Fayette County and Wharton Township have everything to gain from this casino being here. It would enhance what is already a well-established premier resort. It would have a positive impact on tourism locally and for the State. It would maximize the State and local tax revenues, produce substantial positive impact on local employment and spending and create the most complete resort with gaming in America. In fact, we believe it will become a model for other resorts in other states. Though Nemacolin is well established, it's also important to note it is ever evolving, and it evolves because of the day-to-day involvement and leadership of Maggie Hardy Magerko, our president and owner, and Mr. Joe Hardy, our founder. They have not only put lots of money into this resort, but they have put their life into it, their emotion, their creativity, and most importantly, their vision. APPLAUSE

25 MR. NOBERS: And at this time I'd like to introduce the general manager of Nemacolin Woodlands Resort, Mr. Chris Plummer. Chris Plummer. Chris has more than 15 years of experience in the tourism and hospitality industry, including eight years with Caesars Entertainment & Gaming Industry. He is on the Board of Directors of the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau, and he, too, is a Pennsylvania native, hailing from the Chambersburg area. Chris?

It's very important to note that our competition is not local. Our competition is regional and national in scope with resorts in Florida,

California, Colorado, West Virginia and Virginia. 1 2 Currently, 60 percent of our quests come from outside 3 of Pennsylvania, and 70 percent outside of western PA, with our top markets in the Baltimore and Washington, D.C. metro area. Because of our dedicated and talented associates and the vision of our owners, we have been very fortunate to be recognized by the top names in our industry. AAA and Mobil have awarded us five stars and five diamonds in Lautrec and Falling Rock. Mystic Rock is a Golf Digest Top 100 course, 10 and Woodlands Spa is rated ninth best in the country. 11 While we do like the awards, it is our associates and 12 13 our quests that we care about most. They drive our 14 extensive list of amenities, starting with our six 15 different lodging options, including Falling Rock, Chateau Lafayette, The Lodge, our townhouses and 16 17 condos, our private home collection and maybe one of the best recreational vehicle parks you'll ever find. 18 19 Dining is a central part of the Nemacolin 20 experience. We operate 15 unique dining facilities covering our entire 2,000 acres, including Lautrec, 21 22 one of only 14 Mobil five-star, AAA five-diamond, 23 award-winning restaurants in the world. Chef Kristin

Butterworth is the culinary genius behind Lautrec.

She's only 28 and currently the youngest and only

Corporate events are a vital part of our business, and this year there were over 40,000 corporate room nights making up 50 percent of our revenue. We have over 31,000 square feet of meeting space, a dedicated team and unmatched team building programs. engine is driven by a dedicated team, including our banquet captain, Kathy Simons, who was a finalist this year in the PA Spirit of Hospitality Award.

Guests come to Nemacolin to reconnect with their families, friends and clients. All of our recreation opportunities are designed around this philosophy. We offer the finest in traditional resort amenities like golf at Mystic Rock, skiing at Mystic Mountain, horseback riding, fly fishing and mountain biking. There are a number of separate activities that set us apart, like the longest zip line in Pennsylvania, 18 miles of off-road driving, one of the finest shooting academies in the world of sporting clays, near the golf site. And we've developed great

partnerships with companies like Nike and Jeep to enhance these experiences.

3 The Woodlands Spa. The Woodlands Spa features 48 treatment rooms offering over 100 different therapies and services 400 to 500 guests at a given day, traditional massage, facials, manicures, pedicures, as well as untraditional treatments like the use of scrubs, wraps, body kurs and acupuncture. Recently, the vision of our staff team uncovered a new 10 market and presented a new idea, a spa completely dedicated to kids. Spa Voyage opened in 2009 to 11 laughter, smiles, fun and a whole bunch of delighted 12 13 parents.

Across our 2,000 acres quests get to enjoy the Hardy family art collection. The collection is literally around every corner and it includes famous pieces by Botero, Calder and Lautrec, interesting collectibles like a piece of the Berlin Wall, original Beatles photographs and vintage automobiles and aircrafts. So as you can see, the 21 Hardy family likes to collect stuff.

So three or four years ago, when I 23 received a phone call that we needed to start looking for a zookeeper, a veterinarian and started building animal habits, of course, I wasn't surprised.

1 much surprises me about Nemacolin, and that's the beauty of it. Today, our Wildlife Academy is home to nearly 100 exotic animals for our guests to enjoy. Ιt even includes a luxurious pet spa and full-service veterinary clinic.

Our expansive retail operation includes everything from men's and women's apparel, to a jeweler, to a cigar shop, to a fly fishing shop, where you can learn to tie your own flies. As far as amenities go, in the words of our founder, Joe Hardy, we've pretty much got everything except the ocean, but I'm working on that.

And now Pennsylvania has the opportunity to create the greatest amenity-driven casino in the country. I know of no other casino in the country that offers this portfolio of amenities. It's important to note that as the gaming market expands in PA and the surrounding states, this critical element will be crucial to the success of gaming operations. Putting this casino in Nemacolin is 20 years ahead of the curve of the gaming industry and a model that will be mimicked across the country. Pennsylvania has the opportunity to be first.

Having the opportunity to add an amenity that will generate \$70 million in revenue, \$20 million

in wages and millions in taxes is very beneficial for this community. We call them game changers, and they 3 do not come to Fayette County often enough. about this community. And aside from being the largest employer in the county, we also donate millions to local causes each year and contribute \$700,000 in terms of the occupancy tax to support the market in the region. And we're very, very proud to partner with the Isle of Capri to make this happen.

So again, everybody, thank you. I really appreciate the time to speak about Nemacolin. you can see the passion that I have as well as from other associates have for this property. Now, I would like to introduce Jim Perry, chairman and CEO of Isle of Capri, to talk about their company. As you can see, Jim is a native of Newcastle, Pennsylvania. a former Gaming Industry CEO of the Year, former CEO of Argosy Gaming Company and Trump Enterprise, former trustee also of The Hill School in Pottstown, Pennsylvania. Thank you, Chris. My name is Jim Perry, and I reside in Santa Barbara, California. It's a pleasure to be here today. I brought a little Santa 25 Barbara weather with me today. I'm sure you're all

enjoying it. It's great here in western Pennsylvania.

The Laurel Highlands have always been an attraction for me having grown up in western

Pennsylvania, and it's a great opportunity to partner for Isle of Capri with the Hardys in Nemacolin

Woodlands. I do believe that this is the prototype of what gaming will become, as well as what the resort industry will become in the coming years.

Isle is a major regional operator of casino hotels. We operate 15 casinos from Colorado through the midwest down to Florida, and we generally operate under two brands, the Isle Brand and the Lady Luck Brant. The Isle Brand is one of the regional brands, which includes a major hotel, convention meeting space, as well as the casino. The Lady Luck Brand does not necessary have a hotels and is more of a local and a regional facility. We chose the Lady Luck Brand for this property because a hotel and a resort already exist in fine form at Nemacolin.

What does it mean to be a Lady Luck? We poll our customers all the time and ask them what is most important to them, and these are the responses that they've given us almost across the nation.

Number one, they want an exciting atmosphere. That means value of the entertainment dollar, that means a

live band when appropriate, it means a sense of excitement on the casino floor.

Number two, it means the right selection of games, both table games and slots. It's very important that the product that you provide to your customers is a product that meets their needs, creates the excitement of gambling that they're looking for.

Third is acceptable service. We pride ourselves in our ability to communicate with our customers. We have a program which you'll hear more about today where we really reinforce this with annual bonuses to our employees for meeting the needs of our customers.

And finally, quality food and beverage.

Quality food and beverage is wonderful, with fine dining and all the awards, but it's also important with the hamburger, the French fries and the other things that you may enjoy in a casino environment.

Isle of Capri is committed to meeting these needs in this community. And from the first time I sat down with the Hardys last summer, we talked about the fact that we share the same vision of creating a great experience for the customers at our casino as part of the Nemacolin Woodlands experience.

Finally, this project is fully funded.

1 Isle of Capri has the financial capacity currently within its line of credit to build this project from the time we get the approval from the Gaming Board to 3 be able to build this project within nine months from the time we hear that we are approved. With that, I'd like to introduce Paul Keller. Paul is our chief development officer. He, too, has been working in Pennsylvania, 25 years of experience in building casinos and other entertainment facilities. 10 awards are widespread, including architectural awards, a construction award for refitted, re-outfitting other 11 12 properties. He is a graduate of Duke University, with an engineering degree, and the University of Michigan, 13 14 with an M.B.A. Please welcome Paul. Thank you.

Thank you, Jim. Good morning, members of the Board. My name is Paul Keller. I am a resident of St. Louis, Missouri, the headquarter city of Isle of Capri. It's my pleasure to talk today specifically about the casino itself, a very, very special facility, we believe, and we're going to talk a little bit in detail about it right now.

We have planned a \$50 million investment into our casino. All of that goes into the customer experience at the casino. None of it needs to go to

renovating the resort or creating amenities, because obviously all that is already done. It is already here. Much of the building is already there, so \$50 million will create a very special experience in the gaming world.

The facility itself is locate conveniently right on Route 40, at the edge of the resort. It is convenient to visitors of the area. It is also convenient to resort guests who can partake of the 24/7 resort shuttle and bring them to the facility at any time from anywhere on the resort grounds.

The facility, in total, is 71,000 square feet. That includes back of house and customer areas. It is a specially-designed facility that will, in a smaller forum, create all of the casino amenities within the facility that you would normally expect. It is not simply a room full of slot machines.

The view of the existing exterior of the building, as it is today, and the exterior, as it will be. As you can see, we are making some changes. They are not tremendous changes, but we do have to expand the building in places to accommodate table games and some of our food and beverage amenities.

This is an aerial view of the inside of

the casino. We are taking our inspiration for the interior from Frank Lloyd Wright, who has a heavy influence not only on Nemacolin architecture but in 3 this region and, really, in the country. One of his, if not his greatest, work is right down the road. we thought it was appropriate to look at him for inspiration in terms of the interior architecture of the building.

Our casino building will include, as Jim said, a casual dining and restaurant. Otis & Henry's, that's a proprietary brand at Isle of Capri. We will 12 have entertainment. Entertainment is a significant part of the Lady Luck experience, so we are designing a casino floor to accommodate local bands, private party rooms. We will have pool tables and other forms of entertainment.

In terms of traffic, every casino is --every well-designed casino thinks about traffic. our case, the traffic situation doesn't require much in the way of improvements. We will be putting a left turn light and a traffic light at the main intersection leading into the casino. There are actually three lanes into the resort property and the casino to distribute traffic, but we will be putting in a light. The light has been approved by PennDOT.

1 And our traffic engineers have concluded that there is no traffic issues that will be created from the casino.

You can see the location of the intersection where the traffic signals would go. as stated from our traffic engineer, who studied this in 2005, 2006, and most recently, in 2009, stating that the project in terms of traffic flow will actually improve traffic on Route 40.

Parking, also critical to the customer experience in the casino, is something that we thought about. We have absolutely no issues with parking on this property. We will have 900 parking spaces adjacent to the casino. We'll have sufficient valet parking. The resort, itself, has 1,200 parking spaces throughout the resort so that when there are major events, we can easily accommodate people. And again, there's a 24-hour, seven-day-a-week shuttle, that works throughout the resort at all times to distribute those guests. On this slide you can see the close parking.

In terms of utilities and general infrastructure, again, there is no problem with this resort that is within the structure. The resort is very much a self-sufficient entity, with adequate

water, sewer, electric, gas, on property.

2 We do have to make some changes to the 3 building, and it, too, will be expanded a little bit. We will be making interior renovations. We will pave the parking lot areas a little bit. But all that can be done within nine months from the date of award. We're comfortable with that. We do not have any land use issues. We do not have any zoning issues. majority of the physical structure is already in place. So even if the award were to come in the 10 winter, we can begin work on things inside almost 11 12 immediately.

In terms of public safety, we have touched base with all of the service providers in the area, police, security, fire and emergency services. The resort is comfortable with what is available, the service providers are comfortable, and we have no issues with those. Again, essentially Nemacolin Woodlands is a self-supported resort, does not rely much on the community in terms of providing infrastructure. It sort of exists to itself.

So briefly, in conclusion, I would like 23 to say that the plans are complete for a very, very special building and world-class facility. We believe, as Chris said, that Nemacolin could become

America's premier resort destination. There will be 2. only minor traffic improvements. Utilities are 3 adequately supplied. Public safety departments have adequate capacity. The project is ready to go. finally, should the Board grant its approval for Nemacolin Woodlands to have the final license, we believe that we can build something very special that everybody in the Commonwealth will be very proud of. Thank you.

And it is my pleasure to introduce our president and chief operating officer, a woman who 12 this year was given a Lifetime Achievement Award in gaming, who has been named Gaming Executive of the Year --- Gaming Industry Executive of the Year in 2009. She sits on the Board of Directors of the American Gaming Association as the only woman. She is on the Board of Trustees for the National Center for Responsible Gaming, a native of Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, and a proud graduate of Temple University, with 30 years in the gaming industry, I'd like to introduce Virginia McDowell.

Good morning, members of the Commission 24 and staff. Thank you so much for this opportunity. 25 I'd like to talk to you a little bit about Isle of

Capri. As a company, we are dedicated to workforce 1 2 development. We believe that the best employees run the best businesses, which is certainly a philosophy 3 and a sentiment that is shared by the Hardy family and our partners at Nemacolin. We focus on employee retention, primarily through hiring and training programs, with an emphasis on diversity. We offer pay for skills and incentive pay and bonus pay. believe that it's very important to bonus along the employee level, so we bonus according to standard 10 11 control so that everybody gets to share in the success 12 of the enterprise. And we're very, very proud of See.Say.Smile Courtesy Program. This is an 13 14 award-winning program. Essentially we shop our 15 employees' ability to interact with our customers at each of our properties, and we also shop the 16 17 competition. And at every one of our 15 properties 18 across the United States where we do shop for competition, our employees are recognized as being the 19 20 most courteous or the most friendly at each of those facilities. 21

We believe that they're a leader in responsible gaming. We do sit on the Board of the American Gaming Association and are very active. We also participate in a Code of Conduct of Responsible

Gaming. We were actually part of the committee that 1 2 drafted the Code of Conduct a few years ago. 3 conduct problem and underage gaming training annually for all of our team members, as well as alcohol awareness training, participate in the annual Responsible Gaming Week across the enterprise. We do include Responsible Gaming Hotlines in all of our advertising, as required by our various jurisdictions, promote self exclusion problems. And we have strict 10 identification policies for patrons on the casino floor and a bounty hunter program specifically to make 11 sure that the folks on the floor are of legal gambling 12 age in our jurisdictions. 13

We are a company that believes in community involvement. You've heard Jeff and Chris talk about Nemacolin's commitment. We believe the same thing. It's a charitable foundation that honors the legacy of our late founder, Bernie Goldstein, who truly believed in giving back to the communities where we're licensed and operate and do business. If you go to our website or to our Facebook page, you will see that there's a

whole variety of examples of the types of things that

staff participating in Dragon Boat races to benefit a
local pediatric center or painting a Boys & Girls Club
in Waterloo, Iowa, or doing a cleanup in Marquette,
lowa. We truly believe in giving back to our

When you talk about creating a total casino experience, Jim Perry and I have been in the business between the two of us for over 60 years. Between the two of us, we have either been responsible for or have worked at over two dozen different gaming properties. Those properties include major resorts in Atlantic City and in Las Vegas. Now, we are familiar with world-class resorts. We are familiar with worldclass gaming resorts that feature award-winning restaurants. We are familiar with award-winning museums. We're familiar with award-winning golf courses, all the things that major casino resorts offer across the United States. We're even familiar with major casino resorts that have white tiger cubs, although not white lion cubs, which I think is somewhat unique to Nemacolin. But I will tell you that there is no casino resort across the United States that offers all of these things, and the

opportunity for Nemacolin to add gaming as an amenity gives us the ability to create a gaming resort that is unrivaled, unrivaled in the United States. And when customers make a purchasing decision with their leisure dollars, we believe they will come to Pennsylvania and that they will come to Nemacolin.

And with that, I'd like to introduce Jeff Nobers, who I don't think needs an introduction.

## MR. NOBERS:

I think we've seen enough of that slide. So, you've heard about the resort. You've heard about Isle of Capri's plans. What I'd like to run you through here quickly are the benefits of Lady Luck Casino being a house here at Nemacolin.

Fayette County traditionally has among the highest unemployment rate in the State, somewhere around ten percent right now. And if you take into account folks that aren't even signing up for unemployment or are not even bothering to look for a job because there aren't jobs, it may hover closer to 20 percent. Lady Luck Nemacolin will have a substantial impact on helping the unemployment situation in Fayette County. A new casino would create 400 jobs. The resort would create at least an additional 200 jobs. There would be 150 construction

jobs. And when you add that to the total of 1,200 1 employees we have at the resort today, we would be 3 creating 1,800 --- or adding to that, having 1,8080 permanent jobs at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. Well, what kind of jobs are those? They're not minimum wage, they're not low-paying jobs, they're not part time, although some may be. They are jobs in the casino that will include slot technicians, dealers, marketing and finance personnel, food and beverage, 10 both in front and back of the house, and management employees. On the resort side, as we increase room 11 nights, we'll have need for more focus in guest 12 services, housekeeping, food and beverage, activities 13 14 and amenities and employees in management to make sure 15 it continues to run smoothly.

From a tax revenue standpoint, casino operations at Nemacolin will create substantial new tax revenues, and that's very important to note. When we look at our first full year of operation, which would be 2012, we estimate that we would generate \$37.7 million in state tax revenues, \$2.9 million for Fayette County, \$1.3 million for Wharton Township, and an additional \$700,000 in other local taxes, such as income and wage taxes. So the total casino tax impact would be in the neighborhood of \$42 million in that

first year. And our studies, as we looked at the other casinos in the area, of our total revenue number, only three percent would be cannibalization of other casinos, about \$1.8 million of the \$67 million, far and away the least of the four applicants.

Other benefits of the Lady Luck Casino at Nemacolin is the local employment. At Nemacolin we have a very strong commitment to hiring people that reside in Fayette County or at least in the immediate 10 area. We also have a strong commitment to buying locally absolutely whenever possible. We will 12 generate revenues for Wharton Township where they're sorely needed, so they can upgrade their 14 infrastructure, and we will increase tourism revenues for the Laurel Highlands region. We believe that we will attract in the neighborhood of 350,000 additional visitors to this region on an annual basis. And we also estimate that we will increase our room nights at Nemacolin by 30,000 rooms annually. That also has a 20 tax implication. That would generate \$600,000 in 21 additional sales tax and room occupancy tax. \$200,000 22 of that \$600,000 would go into the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau, again, for continued marketing of the 23 Laurel Highlands region. 24

We enjoy substantial local support.

We've had over 1,000 signatures of support in the past 1 2 several weeks. This project is supported by our local 3 elected officials. They are here today and they will tell you why they support this. The projects are supported by prominent local organizations, such as the Fayette County Chamber of Commerce, Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau and the Fayette County Economic Development Council. Clearly, we believe we have the best and most substantial resort that meets 10 the requirements and the needs and would further what is really first-class gaming in Pennsylvania. Before 11 I introduce our final speaker, I would like to request 12 13 that the balance of our remaining time be held for potential rebuttal and a closing statement. 14

Now I'd like to introduce the president and owner of Nemacolin Woodlands Resort, Maggie Hardy Magerko. Maggie grew up in the lumber industry and the resort industry. She became the president of 84 Lumber back in 1992, and the sales have grown substantially during her tenure. Between the two companies, she oversees roughly 5,500 employees, and she's been named one of the top woman in American business. Maggie?

You know, my dad took Nemacolin Woodlands, he 3 brought it out of bankruptcy in 1987. And even when I sit here and see these slides, I'm in awe, and I deal with the day-to-day details. So I just have to say again to the Gaming Board --- and I hope again today --- I think you're going to be able to take a tour of the property. I don't see anyone else who 10 compares to the amenity package that we have at Nemacolin. And me and my father are just so excited 11 12 about the gaming and so committed long term to Nemacolin and to 84. I can't again see another 13 14 appropriate applicant. And so I'm going to be real 15 quick and short because I don't know how much time we have and they want to get the rebuttal in, but I just 16 17 want to say on behalf of the 84 family, the Nemacolin family and everyone here, we're real excited to push 18 19 this through. Thank you.

#### HEARING OFFICER:

Go ahead, Senator.

# SENATOR KASUNIC:

Good morning, and welcome to Fayette County, members of the Board, Chairman Fajt. I hope while you're here visiting the Laurel Highlands that you have an opportunity and take some time to see the treasures and the historic sites that we have throughout the area. If you don't have time today, I'm inviting you, please, come back and spend a few days here in the Laurel Highlands.

Today we sit here in Wharton Township, in 20 the heart of the Laurel Highlands. Actually, this is 21 the hub of the Laurel Highlands, and Fayette County serves as the heartbeat of the Laurel Highlands 23 recreation and tourism community. I stand here today to wholeheartedly support the proposed plan to offer gaming at the Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. I strongly

believe that Nemacolin Woodlands Resort would maximize the economic development, tourism and job creation for the region and for the Commonwealth as well. It is my opinion that Nemacolin Woodlands Resort, without question, without question, is the best location to fulfill the established year-round resort requirements that are in the law.

Unlike the other applicants, Nemacolin Woodlands Resort is a world-class resort which would add a resort-style casino as an additional amenity, not a casino around which a resort would be built. I believe what is significant here and what we're going to present today, what we're talking about today is what the legislative intent was when we passed this piece of legislation. And the legislative intent, and I'll interpret what I view as legislative intent, is whose purpose was the enhancement of guest amenities at established resort hotels in order to protect and enhance tourism venues and to enhance the opportunities of the Commonwealth's resorts with those they're competing with outside of this Commonwealth.

Nemacolin, as you have already heard and a lot of my testimony has already been stated, but as you've already heard, there's a variety of amenities that's available there in terms of dining, in lodging

options and the great golf courses that we have, the
Shooting Academy, the skiing and so on. And we have
received --- and I guess I shouldn't be saying we,
Joe, because I'm not a part of that, but I look at it
as part of it because I represent the area. Now, this
resort has received many, many national and local
awards, and in fact, more than any awards that any
other resort has received in this Commonwealth.

Furthermore, Nemacolin is the only applicant, the only applicant for this license that is not relying on a casino to finance its continuing operation as a resort. As a casino --- a casino at Nemacolin will only serve to add another amenity to the long list it already provides its guests. makes an already great resort even better, while also bringing good jobs and great economic development opportunities to our entire region. The Laurel Highlands that I, you know, started my conversation about is one of the top tourist designations in this Commonwealth. And I would say without question, and once again, probably being very biased on it, I think we have the most beautiful and most scenic area and region of this Commonwealth right here in southwestern Pennsylvania. Millions of people, millions of people come to this area right now. We have the largest

state park in Pennsylvania located within a few miles 1 of this particular resort, Ohiopyle State Park, which provides such things as whitewater rafting, the Great American Passage. And for those of you who don't know what that is, that is one of the most significant and best bike trails, bicycling trails, anywhere in North America. It is fast becoming very popular not only with the eastern seaboard and the rest of the United States, but people are coming from New York to use this bike trail here.

Nemacolin Woodlands is also very close to some other opportunities in terms of those who like hunting and fishing. We have all those opportunities here. Just a few miles to the east of us, we have Youghiogheny Reservoir. I didn't realize --- I thought I had ten minutes, Mr. Chairman. A few miles east of us, the boating center, we have probably, I would guess, at least three million visitors a year coming into this area right now. And the best part about that is all of those people --- most of those people, 70 percent of those people are coming from outside of southwestern Pennsylvania. Sixty (60) percent of them are coming from outside of the State. And the fact is that when we look at if there's a concern about competition, there really would be no

competition there because of the fact that these are people who are traveling here as a destination to visit the Laurel Highlands.

In addition to the Laurel Highlands in Pennsylvania, I must point out, too, that we are in close proximity to western Maryland, the mountains of western Maryland. And there's a facility up there called Deep Creek Lake that is fast becoming the playground for the people out of Baltimore and Washington, D.C., and well over a million people visit that facility, and it's only probably 30 miles from here, along with probably 20, 25 miles from here we have Morgantown, West Virginia, which is --- and don't laugh when I say West Virginia, because West Virginia is an up and coming state, certainly. And Mr. Hardy is a graduate of West Virginia University, so we don't want to make him mad. But it is noted as being --recognized as one of the fastest growing metro areas in this entire country. And that's just 25 miles from here.

If awarded a license, the gaming facility at Nemacolin would offer an additional amenity that many tourists want when they're visiting an area.

Combining the tourism aspect with the fact that Nemacolin already hosts 350,000 guests annually at the

resort, I believe that Nemacolin offers the best opportunity of all the applicants to bring the most revenue to the Commonwealth.

It's bolstered the legalized gaming. Legalized gaming has been great for Pennsylvania. think we can all agree on that. It's generated over a billion dollars already in property tax relief, and it has bolstered two industries that were hurting and actually one that was failing, that was the ag industry and the racing industry, and it helped communities in the areas to cut taxes and to reinvest. The industry has made it possible to be --- possible to fund the wealth programs across this Commonwealth, and it's brought thousands of job opportunities to people who have been struggling for work. Here, at Nemacolin, I'm told establishing a casino will create 400 jobs. And if you look at the data and review the kind of success casinos have had in other parts of the State, I think those projections are solid in the fact that these are life-sustaining jobs. These are goodpaying jobs.

In closing, I want to reiterate to you 23 that Nemacolin Woodlands, without a doubt, is the best location to fulfill the intent of the legislature. Not only is it an established year-round resort, as

the law requires, but it offers by far the greatest variety of existing amenities, recreational activities, dining and lodging options. What we'd like to do is have an opportunity to put our people who are seeking jobs and seeking work, to put them to work and give them an opportunity to stay here in Fayette County.

thank you to the Board for giving me this opportunity, giving Nemacolin and the people here who support this plan today to have this opportunity to speak to you. I look forward to working with you in the future as the gaming facilities are approved, become operational and create jobs and economic development opportunities for our fellow citizens. If there are any questions that you have, you know, I would be glad to answer any questions. If not, thank you for the opportunity to speak to you today. And once again, Nemacolin has put their best foot forward, and I think if we look at the intent of the law and the letter of the law, there's no question that this fulfills all the needs of the requirements. So thank you very much.

Tim Mahoney, State Representative, 51st District, Fayette County. First of all, I'd like to thank you all for coming and having this open meeting for the public. I think it's very important.

Second of all, I'm glad you said you saved the best applicant for last because, by far, Nemacolin Woodlands is probably the best applicant that you have in front of you at this time.

Like my colleague, Senator Kasunic ---9 and by the way, I've never seen him talk so fast. He 10 got everything in that he needed to get in. But the 11 intent of this law was for a resort to have one of 12 these licenses. And by far, Nemacolin Woodlands is 13 14 probably one of the nicest resorts on the East Coast 15 of the country. And it's not only a resort, it's family, it's like a family atmosphere, where people 16 feel comfortable coming there, which Mr. Hardy has all 17 the energy. They feel comfortable by being there. 18 And by having Nemacolin have the opportunity for this 19 20 license, it's a win, win, win. It's a win for 21 Nemacolin, for Isle of Capri to partner up to do a 22 casino the right way in the State of Pennsylvania, the 23 way it was intended. It's a win for the local economy. It's a win for Fayette County as far as the 24 25 number one industry is tourism, and we can build upon

the tourism trade in Fayette County by having this casino here. And it's a win for the State just because of the location being close to Maryland and 3 West Virginia, the draw from there, too. And like the Nemacolin executive said, they do draw worldwide. it's just so massive when you come up here to Nemacolin, the people that you meet from all over the world. People from all over the world like to gamble, and it's going to be a win for the State. So I don't 10 have too much more to say. You don't have to cut me off, but I just hope you consider it and hopefully you 11 12 put it on top of the consideration because of all the 13 amenities and where it's at and what Fayette County 14 does need as far as the unemployment rate. Thank you, 15 and thank you for the time.

The first, we have Vince Zapotosky and also Vincent A. Vicites from the Fayette County Commissioners. Gentlemen, you have 30 minutes. You can split your time as you choose.

### MR. ZAPOTOSKY:

7 Good morning. My name is Vincent Zapotosky. I currently serve as the Chairman of the 8 Fayette County Commissioners. I would like to 10 apologize for my voice, thus for the brevity of my remarks. I would like to welcome Mr. Chairman, 11 members of the Board. Thank you for coming out today 12 13 to beautiful Fayette County, allowing us to provide 14 you with the reasons why we feel that Nemacolin does 15 meet the intent of the gaming law and should be awarded the Category 3 License. 16

Working as a congressional staffer for 12 years, I think the goal of any legislative body and executive body is to write a law that fits and works. Well, this is an opportunity for the Commonwealth to award this Category 3 License to the only applicant, in my opinion, that meets those requirements. It's been discussed that Nemacolin is a destination point, and it truly is, but Nemacolin --- and I'll speak a little differently as a County Commissioner, on the

county as a whole. Nemacolin has become a permanent 1 part of our county landscape. And the word we was used, but it should be used because we are all in this 3 together, and Nemacolin has captured the hearts of many in Fayette County. This isn't about a gaming casino being built a few miles from where we are. This is about the impact that it will have on the county as a whole, the impact that it will have on the future of this county and allow for further growth and 10 development to occur because of this investment, the jobs that it will create, the additional tax revenue 11 12 that it will provide. This is about we. We, the 13 people of Fayette County, support this. 14 people of Fayette County, know what the Hardy family 15 has done up until today and what they will continue to 16 do.

And now, in conjunction with the Isle of Capri, again, to play with words, but it's a winning hand. And I urge you to take that message back, and as you discuss it among yourselves, understand that you're not making just a decision for slots and Blackjack, you're making a decision that rests in the hands of individuals that are truly committed to seeing this industry grow the right away and to be the --- as Mr. Plummer had alluded to, to be the prototype

So I urge you to give every possible consideration in awarding this to Nemacolin Woodlands and the Isle of Capri and fulfill and satisfy the intent of the law. And I entrust that you will not be disappointed because with the Hardy family and the Isle of Capri and the members in this room and the citizens across this county, it will not fail. It will only succeed, and you will see the byproduct of the success for many years to come. My voice is getting a little strained, so I will be brief, but I want to thank you for the opportunity. I do have written testimony that I'd like to provide for the record, but thank you very much. And again, Nemacolin Woodlands is the jackpot in this one, so thank you very much.

#### MR. VICITES:

Gaming Control Board, good morning. Mr. Chairman, as
a four-term County Commissioner, I would like to
express my full support, along with my colleague,
Vince Zapotosky, for supporting Nemacolin Woodlands
Resort to receive this resort casino license.

If Nemacolin Woodlands receives this

license, as you've heard, it could be as much as 600 1 jobs, 150 construction jobs for Fayette County residents, and over \$3 million in tax revenue to 3 county and local government, and also an increase in our hotel tax revenue, which we help develop and grow our tourism effort in Fayette County.

We have two million visitors that come to the Laurel Highlands of Pennsylvania every year. casino is estimated to add, as said earlier, 350 additional people --- 350,000 additional people come to Fayette County, which would help our tourism efforts even further. But more importantly, as a County Commissioner, I've always been focused on economic development in our county, and this will significantly impact our area in terms of economic development. Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and their partnership with the Isle of Capri is a win-win for Fayette County.

Thanks to the Hardy family, Nemacolin Woodlands has accomplished a tremendous amount. a world-class resort. People come from all over the world to this facility. It has the amenities, as mentioned earlier, which I won't get into, I'll 24 provide in my written testimony. But the resort casino license will only enhance Nemacolin and its

This will be a \$50 million investment to amenities. 1 the local economy. Nemacolin Woodlands is one of the top resorts in the United States, and it would really 3 be fitting because they are a very generous supporter of local causes and charitable causes, too numerous to mention. They've helped Fayette County tremendously. The Isle of Capri currently operates 14 casino properties in six states, which serves as an excellent partner in this effort. With the three million people 10 coming to the Laurel Highlands destination, this resort license would enable Nemacolin, already a 11 world-class destination, to become a one-of-a-kind 12 13 resort casino facility. Nobody would have anything 14 like it in the United States. Unlike any other 15 casino, the amenities are too numerous, and it would just be something of a jewel, and it is really the 16 17 crown jewels of Laurel Highlands, Pennsylvania. 18 In closing, I urge you to award this

In closing, I urge you to award this casino license to Nemacolin Woodlands. This is the right decision for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It's the right decision for Fayette County. And I will submit my written testimony.

Yes, sir. Thank you. My name is James Means, Chairman, Wharton Township Supervisor, also the president of Fayette County Township Supervisors Association. I became a supervisor back in 1994 is when I started out in this. Without Nemacolin, our tax millage is 5 mill. We've been able to hold it at 3.47, which is one of the lowest tax base in Fayette County. Thanks to Mr. Hardy and Pete and Maggie Magerko for helping out with the different projects in the community.

#### MS. NUTTALL:

Good morning. My name is Muriel Nuttall, 16 17 and I am the current Executive Director of the Fayette 18 Chamber of Commerce. I am here today with my current Board president, Kristy Litavec, to represent the 19 20 Board and membership. And I would like to thank you 21 for this opportunity to present our testimony 22 regarding Nemacolin Woodlands' application for licensure. And I would also mention both Kristy and 23 myself are lifelong residents of Fayette County. 24

When faced with taking a stand on gaming

in Fayette County, our Executive Committee decided
that it would best serve the membership by providing
accurate statistical information. The decision was
made that we would be most representative of the level
of support of our members by compiling a survey to be
distributed to each of our members. I would like to
present the results.

First of all, let me say that the Fayette Chamber of Commerce has a long history in Fayette County. Since our inception in 1925, we have grown from a localized chamber which encompassed only the City of Uniontown, to a broad membership of over 575 businesses and organizations, representing more than 17,500 employees throughout Fayette County and the surrounding region.

The Chamber's membership is diverse, with members in five major sectors. Twenty-three (23) percent are professional services, 20 percent are nonprofit/government/education entities, 18 percent are retailers and wholesalers, 15 percent represent the customer service sector, and 14 percent are hospitality and food service companies. Ranked by numbers of employees, our members range in size from the smallest to the largest, from sole proprietors on one end of the spectrum to nine of the ten largest

employers in the county on the other end.

As a whole, chambers of commerce are private membership organizations of business and professional people who choose to invest in maintaining their chamber to support the health and wellbeing of commerce, business, the economy and development in the communities where those members do business.

Specifically at the Fayette Chamber, our mission states that we are an action-oriented group, incorporated to promote a favorable business climate 12 for members and their communities and to provide leadership and support for local business and their efforts to improve the local economy, education systems, political environment, and overall quality of life. Put into much more direct terms, we exist as a chamber in order to help our members succeed in business and to make sure that we maintain and develop a good quality of life for all Fayette County residents.

As the chamber charged with representation of the county business community, we are faced with issues on a daily basis which are poised to make a great impact on our area. Gaming has 24 certainly been one of these issues.

organization has such a diverse membership as ours, we must continually work to be considerate of the membership at large. Each and every member has an opinion and each matters greatly.

Regarding our survey, our first question was simple, are you in support of a Class 3 Resort

Gaming License at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort? And indeed, 80.8 percent of our respondents were in total support of gaming at Nemacolin Woodlands.

Of that, 82.8 and 72.7 respectively felt that Fayette County's greatest benefit will come through an increase in tax revenues received and an increase in tourism. This easily equates to high economic development expectations.

A healthy economy is rooted in many aspects of community life. Measures used to engage economic growth include investment, output, consumption and income. Economic development also includes a notion of changing the quality or nature of the economy, such as by changing investment choices or technology. And the effects of gaming in Fayette County can do that, adding new jobs, as a strong 48 percent of our respondents cited, and new business growth, as reported by 38.4.

As one of our members very simply but

very emphatically put it, I think it will create new jobs, exclamation point. And as another said, we need to be optimistic and look for opportunities to build our tax base and economy.

A couple of our other members' comments included, the infrastructure development and the economic influence would be a positive impact for Fayette County. And regarding Nemacolin specifically, Nemacolin is one of the county's largest employers. The addition of the casino will provide employment opportunities for residents and newcomers alike, and 12 we need all the businesses in Fayette County that we can get.

Now, tourism is vitally important to Fayette County. It represents our future and is currently one of our largest industries, consistently ranking first or second. The additional entertainment options afforded through the gaming operations will hopefully help to increase and boost our visitation. Our hotel occupancy tax or bed tax certainly helps to support the essential funding necessary for our tourism industry. As a Chamber of Commerce in very strong partnership with the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau, we are thankful to Nemacolin for the tremendous support that they bring to the industry and are very hopeful of continued increase in support through taxes received by the tourists who choose to enjoy the amazing amenities at Nemacolin Woodlands.

while the membership statistics showed majority support for the casino, conversely, our survey results pointed that there are members who are not supportive of gaming in Fayette. A total of 13.1 percent of our respondents did not support the concept, while six percent were indifferent. The majority of those who were against the license were against the moral concept of gaming and not the location. As one member stated, people that cannot afford it, will give into the temptation to gamble their paychecks away, hoping to be a winner. And from another, we need positive, affordable family entertainment to keep families together and not ways to encourage parents to leave their homes and children.

Now, understanding those ethical concerns, I know that our social service agencies, like the Fayette County Drug and Alcohol Commission, as well as Nemacolin Woodlands itself have designed specific programs, and I know they are very well prepared to deal with the social problems that may arise from the gaming industry. In addition, we all

seem to agree on the concept of passing on to the next 1 2 generation the tools necessary to make the best moral and ethical decisions possible. In fact, a 3 representative of the Fayette County Drug and Alcohol Commission added this comment to our survey, although we are an agency that treats individuals with gambling disorders, we feel that a casino will add to the overall economic growth of the community. Ninety (90) to 95 percent of the individuals that will attend this 10 casino will not have a gambling problem. It is the five to ten percent of the individuals attending this 11 casino that will be problem gamblers or addicted. 12 13 This five to ten percent will find gambling facilities 14 no matter where they're located. We feel that the 15 economical growth brought by the Nemacolin clientele would be a much needed boost in increased tax revenues 16 17 to Fayette County. Hopefully, these increases would 18 enable Fayette County to treat more individuals with 19 substance and abuse addictions and gambling 2.0 addictions.

Nemacolin Woodlands is a good neighbor, and the Hardy family has proven to the Chamber and to the County that they have the best interests of the area in mind as they create and operate their businesses.

certainly gambling is never a sure bet, especially for the economies of the municipalities that stake their futures on it. Here in Fayette County, we view gambling as merely one piece of a much larger and much more expanding economy. One piece, if done carefully, handled fairly and with consideration to our existing social services and infrastructure, could help us to continue to pursue a brighter tomorrow.

The Fayette Chamber represents a strong voice. The businesses and organizations who choose to invest in the Chamber believe that in numbers there is strength. They understand that it is generally far more effective to act and speak collectively than as individual entities. They have chosen to be heard through our organization, and we have compiled and presented their opinion to you.

The bottom line is that while we do have a representative portion of our membership withholding support of gaming due to what might be best described as social concerns, the overwhelming majority of our membership supports Nemacolin Woodlands in their quest to obtain a Class 3 License. Again, thank you for allowing us to present the views of the Fayette Chamber of Commerce to you.

I'm Ronald Virag. I'm the Executive 4 Director of the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau. reside in Westmoreland County. Honorable Commissioner Fajt --- Chairman Fajt and Commissioners of the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board, as the Executive Director of the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau, whose mission is to foster tourism in the three-county 10 11 region comprised of Fayette, Somerset and Westmoreland 12 Counties, I am honored to address you today relative 13 to and in support of the application of Nemacolin 14 Woodlands Resort for a casino license.

I am certainly cognizant of the other entities and regions seeking the last casino license that is currently available in the Commonwealth.

However, in my estimation, of all those in contention, Nemacolin is the premier location and partner for a casino operation.

In order for a casino to be successful, there are a number of criteria that are essential. First, there must be a strong, financially-secure and well-managed organization as the nucleus of the operation. That organization is Nemacolin. And, if

you have any doubts about its management and financial security, just tour the grounds and its facilities, observe its operations and form your own opinion.

Also, forming a part of the nucleus is the organization with which Nemacolin has partnered, namely the Isle of Capri. The Isle of Capri is an excellent choice for Nemacolin because of its stellar track record and because of the outstanding experience and expertise it brings to this venture.

Another integral component that will contribute to the success of a casino is the area in which it's located. Farmington, Pennsylvania is a quiet, clean, congenial, crime-free and visitor-friendly community that sits on the historic National Road. It is typical of the small communities comprising the Laurel Highlands which is permeated with a wealth of cultural, historical, natural outdoor attractions that bring out-of-state and out-of-country visitors to this region year round.

The word-famous architectural creations of Frank Lloyd Wright, namely Fallingwater and Kentuck Knob, are just a stone's throw away. Pennsylvania's most challenging and most visited State park with whitewater venue is located right here in its shadow, at Ohiopyle State Park.

The fastest-growing attraction, not only 1 2 in the Laurel Highlands but in the eastern United 3 States, is the Great Allegheny Passage, as we call it, the GAP. This is a biking and hiking trail that extends from Washington, D.C., now all the way to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and passes right through Ohiopyle. The GAP alone has attracted 1.5 million visitors this year. As word spreads relative to the amenities of the GAP and the growth of the trail 10 towns, that's the little towns that are attracting a 11 variety of entrepreneurs along the trail, the number 12 of visitors to our region will grow exponentially. Many of the visitors will, no doubt, have Lady Luck 13 14 Casino on their things to do agenda of evening 15 activities.

One must also take into consideration some of the year-round outdoor recreation venues in the Laurel Highlands. In the spring, summer and fall a phenomenal array of golf courses, including the two located right at Nemacolin, attract golfers of all skill levels. Likewise, in the winter season, the skiing at Seven Springs, Hidden Valley and Nemacolin's own Mystic Mountain brings visitors to our region from all over the east coast. These and many of our other attractions, including lodging, eating and shopping

In that regard, Nemacolin's reputation and track record of quality and integrity is outstanding. It speaks for itself. In view of these proven accomplishments, I have no doubts that Nemacolin will operate a casino and conduct its business in similar fashion. Nemacolin will develop into the gem of Pennsylvania casinos and set standards that others will aspire to emulate.

employment opportunities here in Fayette County in an effort to improve the quality of life for all of our residents.

Fayette County, much more than Pennsylvania and the rest of the nation, continues to struggle with the process of replacing jobs lost over the past four decades in the mining and manufacturing industries. The decline of steel, coal and related industry employment and output began to stabilize in the late 1980s only to resume a decline in 1990, resulting, in a large part, from the nationwide economic recession. More recently, cutbacks in Federal Defense spending and additional bad news in the private manufacturing sector has delivered additional bad news for the County. In reviewing the most recent July 2010 unemployment statistics, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported a ten-percent unemployment rate for Fayette County. The posted unemployment rate was the highest in the seven-county Pittsburgh metropolitan statistical area and was 19 percent higher than the average for the region.

The largest boon to Fayette County's growth and economy came from the vast deposits of bituminous coal underlying the County around the turn of the 20th Century. There is renewed hope as vast

deposits of natural gas lie below us in the Marcellus Shale formation. The future of Fayette County lies in our energy play, tourism, and industrialization based upon the efficient network of roads and rivers that crisscross our county.

The proposed Nemacolin Lady Luck Casino also provides an outstanding economic opportunity for the County. The gambling industry has emerged as an economic mainstay in many communities and plays an increasingly prominent role in state and even regional economies. Casino gambling delivers economic benefits such as job creation, capital investment, public sector revenue and increased tourism. The economic benefits of casino gambling have been especially powerful in economically-depressed communities like Fayette County, where economic development opportunities are limited.

I spoke to Bill McGowen, Executive

Director of the Redevelopment Authority of the County
of Washington, where the Meadows Racetrack and Casino
is located. Bill stated, and I quote, since the
inception of the Local Share Account Program in 2008,
the local share of revenues from the Meadows have
generated more than \$29 million for economic
development, community improvement, public interest

and job-training projects in Washington County. result, many jobs have been created, civil and cultural projects have been undertaken, workforce development has been improved and new infrastructure has been developed.

Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and the Isle of Capri Casinos are well-established, highly-regarded organizations that have a proven track record of providing outstanding venues and high-quality services. Nestled in the spectacular natural scenery of the Laurel Highlands, the proposed Nemacolin Lady Luck Casino would be a tremendous asset that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania can be proud of. county is already recognized as an outstanding tourist destination because of its outdoor beauty and activities and its abundance of historical and cultural sites.

The proposed location for the Nemacolin Lady Luck Casino is excellent. The facility has an outstanding east coast accessibility within three 21 hours of major metropolitans, such as the Washington, D.C. and Baltimore area, which has a population of over seven million people, and the 24 Pittsburgh/Cleveland area, which has a population of over eight million. Additionally, last year,

Nemacolin Woodlands attracted guests from 44 different states and eight different countries. This is extremely important, as true economic gain will come from spending associated with visitors from outside the region. Money spent by a tourist in a destination casino funds local suppliers supporting the casino, which in turn spends that income on other goods and services in the local economy, thus multiplying the effect of dollars spent.

The Hardy family has unselfishly given back millions of dollars to improve the quality of life for all of our residents, supporting numerous educational, healthcare, community improvement and public interest initiatives. They have supported economic development by investing millions of dollars in the revitalization of our downtown area. In 2004, Mr. Hardy received the Philanthropist of the Year Award from the Association of Fundraising professionals for his outstanding community leadership and monetary contribution, through personal funds, to the restoration of Uniontown, Pennsylvania.

Nemacolin Woodlands ranks as one of the top five private employers in Fayette County. The importance of community relations is recognized in the mission statement of Nemacolin Woodlands, and they,

too, have unselfishly donated millions over the years supporting projects that improve the quality of life for all of our residents.

Nemacolin Woodlands has proven to be an 4 excellent neighbor and have always supported Fay-Penn's economic initiatives, such as our recent Buy Local initiative. Fay-Penn often utilizes the Nemacolin Resort facilities in our quest to attract new businesses to the area, and they are always 10 willing to work with us in providing special rates and VIP attention. As an example, last week we hosted a 11 12 couple of senior executives from a Houston, Texas-based Marcellus Shale-related business that 13 14 recently signed a letter of intent to establish a new 15 operating site here in Fayette County. I received an e-mail from their Vice President of Business 16 17 Development stating that one of the best parts of 18 their visit was their stay at the Nemacolin Resort. He simply described their stay as fantastic and asked 19 20 if we could give them a contact at the resort, as they 21 were planning multiple visits over the next few 22 months.

The Nemacolin Resort also played an important role in attracting Johnson Matthey, a U.K.-based catalytic converter manufacturer that invested

\$43 million in a new state-of-the art manufacturing facility in Fayette County, which currently employs 95 workers. Nemacolin Woodlands played an important role in supporting Johnson Matthey's ability to attract their local operations manager to Fayette County from Johannesburg, South Africa, due in part to the great experience that he and his family had during their stay at the Nemacolin Woodlands Resort during the Christmas season.

Fay-Penn supports and encourages the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board's selection and approval of a gaming license for the Lady Luck Casino at Nemacolin. The proposed Lady Luck Casino at Nemacolin will deliver significant beneficial outcomes for the township, the County and the Commonwealth, including significant direct tax revenue, creation of much-needed employment positions and enhancement of our tourism marketing efforts. Thanks so much for the opportunity to speak in favor of this significant investment for our community that is being made available through the outstanding partnership of the Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and the Isle of Capri Casinos.

Ladies and gentlemen, I'm going to reconvene this public input hearing. The next person on the list is Kim Hankins.

### MR. HANKINS:

9 Good morning, Commissioners. Good 10 morning, Chairman Fajt. My name is Kim Hankins. reside in Washington County. I am the Executive 11 12 Director of the Meadows Standardbred Owners Association. The Meadows Standardbred Owners 13 14 Association represents the owners, trainers and 15 drivers and grooms that race at the Meadows Racetrack and Casino. Due to the proximity of Nemacolin Resort, 16 17 we believe granting a Category 3 Gaming License to Nemacolin would negatively impact the slot play at the 18 Meadows, thereby reducing the income to the purse 19 20 account, breeders' awards, sire stakes and horsemen's 21 retirement and health benefits. Although we recognize 22 that a portion of Nemacolin's slot play would be 23 contributed to the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Fund, as has been seen with The Rivers Casino, the 24 25 return to the Meadows does not overcome the impact of

1 reduced slot play at the Meadows. Also, one of the 2 benefits of a Category 1 License at the Meadows is the 3 exposure to live racing, live horseracing. A license at Nemacolin would lessen the number of patrons that will be exposed to live racing. One of the foremost components of Act 71 was the revitalization of live horseracing in Pennsylvania. For those reasons, the MSOA is opposed to the Category 3 License at Nemacolin.

If, in fact, the license is granted to Nemacolin, the MSOA respectfully requests that a stipulation of licensure would require Nemacolin to include a race booth in the facility with the Meadows Racing as the prominent sitting. Thank you for your attention.

Good morning. I would like to thank the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board for allowing us the opportunity and the time to comment upon the Nemacolin Resort gaming application.

My name is J.R. Shaw. I'm a resident of 24 Washington County, specifically the City of Washington, Pennsylvania. I'm currently the Executive Director of the Washington County Tourism Promotion
agency and have been for the last three years. The
Washington County Tourism Promotion Agency is a
183-member organization that promotes tourism as an
engine of economic growth for the residents of
Washington County, enhancing their quality of life by
providing jobs and lower local taxes.

For the year 2007, the latest year that figures are available, the tourism industry in Washington County generated \$347 million in direct visitor spending, paying over \$87 million in taxes, and supporting 7,600 jobs that paid wages of almost \$250 million.

14 In its mission statement, the 15 Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board states that the objectives of limited gaming in the Commonwealth are 16 17 to deliver a significant source of revenue, assist the horseracing industry, provide broad economic 18 19 opportunities and enhance tourism. The Meadows 20 Racetrack and Casino facility in Washington 21 Pennsylvania is evidence that at least in that area of 22 the Commonwealth, these goals have been met and the 23 Board has achieved its mission. The Meadows has 24 delivered significant tax revenues to the 25 Commonwealth, as well as providing relief to area

communities through the local share program, as one of 1 2 the previous speakers mentioned in his comments. horseracing industry has benefited with larger purses 3 and more races being offered to track fans, as the previous speaker cited as well. Economic opportunities have expanded as the Meadows has provided much needed jobs to area residents and spurred development of the tourism industry. Tourism has been enhanced as Washington County has become more of a destination for leisure travelers throughout the 10 mid-Atlantic. 11

Our opposition to Nemacolin's application for the remaining Class 3 Resort License is not directed at the resort or at the Laurel Highlands. It is because the placement of another casino in southwestern Pennsylvania does not achieve the goals stated in the Gaming Control Board's mission. It would only dilute the successes that have already been achieved.

A Laurel Highlands casino location would generate limited new revenues for the Commonwealth, as the location would significantly draw from existing businesses already in the region, namely at the Meadows Racetrack and Casino and The Rivers Casino in Pittsburgh. A Laurel Highlands casino location

provides no new assistance to the horseracing
industry. In the Commonwealth it would conceivably
take precious leisure spending away from the Meadows,
possibly even Presque Isle Downs, siphoning revenues
away from the already financially strapped horseracing
industry. A Laurel Highlands casino location creates
limited new broad economic opportunities to the
Commonwealth and the region but enhances an already
well-established existing facility in an established
outdoor and rural destination.

Finally, a Laurel Highlands casino

location may have the potential to enhance tourism in
the area, but will face challenges to create new
tourism opportunities in the Commonwealth in a
declining U.S. leisure travel market. In its just
released 2010 Travel and Tourism Works for America
Report, the U.S. Travel Association reports the U.S.
travel economy contracted 8.9 percent in 2009 from
2008 levels. Likewise, the American Gaming
Association reports nationwide revenues from
commercial casinos fell 5.5 percent in 2009. These
figures point to a weak travel market, a flat gaming
market, and do not support introducing competition
into a region with already-established facilities.

In sum, ladies and gentlemen, we feel the

1 Gaming Control Board would much better serve its mission by placing the last casino in an area 3 currently unserved by an existing facility with unmet demand for gaming in another area of the Commonwealth. Thank you for your time. 6 HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. Mr. Hankins, there was a question from the Board for you. 8 9 MR. HANKINS: 10 Yes. 11 HEARING OFFICER: 12 Are you asking for a simulcast room at Nemacolin? 13 14 MR. HANKINS: 15 Yes, if the license is granted to Nemacolin. 16 17 HEARING OFFICER: 18 Okay. Thank you. Our next speaker is Tara M. Coughenour. 19 20 MS. COUGHENOUR: 21 Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman and members 22 of the Board. I am Tara Coughenour, Director of 23 Member Services for the Washington County Chamber of Commerce. I reside in Canonsburg, which is in 2.4 25 | Washington County, Pennsylvania. It is my pleasure to 1 be here with you today to discuss the impact another casino would have on the southwestern Pennsylvania region. It is our belief that the opening of an additional casino would have detrimental effects on our efforts at job creation and property tax relief.

When the State passed gaming a few years ago, one of the main priorities that they had was to create jobs and opportunities for businesses operating in the Commonwealth. To date, the successful opening of both the Meadows and The Rivers casinos have created thousands of new jobs and established vendor relationships with the gaming venues. It has done exactly what the legislature has intended, bringing new jobs and increasing business to our region by tapping into a customer base that was leaving Pennsylvania to utilize gaming facilities in other states. We were successful in retaining those customers.

Now, with the potential to open another casino in southwestern Pennsylvania, we have the potential to dilute the very same customer base we have so strongly attempted to keep, as Mr. Shaw had just stated as well. We believe that further diluting the market in southwestern Pennsylvania with another casino, the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board will

negatively effect, both directly and indirectly, the economic development in the region.

The direct impact of market dilution will be a reduction of customers of existing casinos, thereby leading to potential layoffs, competition of the remaining talent to the new casino and reduction of revenue. This is directly opposite of what the intent was for of gaming in Pennsylvania, the original intent to create jobs and reduce property taxes. By opening another casino in an already saturated market you're going to lose jobs at the existing casinos or, at best, have a zero net gain in job creation. This transferring of jobs from county to county does not create any economic activity or create wealth. It just moves it around regionally.

It will also have an impact as it will affect the economic infrastructure that has grown around the industry. Businesses such as hotels, stores, restaurants, all of which are experiencing increased business now because of the casinos' customer base, will lose those customers by the dilution of the market. This does not even account for the local businesses that are suppliers and vendors. As you lose customers and downsize to accommodate that reduction, the casinos will also

reduce the spending at existing local vendors.

The argument for a new casino is that it will lead to further job creation in our region. That argument is probably true. However, it will come at the expense of job losses at existing casinos. Again, while we will realize an increase in jobs at the new casino, the region will experience an overall decrease or neutral job creation number. Again, this does not benefit anyone as well as threatens an already successful economic infrastructure.

The opening of a new casino in southwestern Pennsylvania is not a competition between counties or between venues. It is a discussion about market dilution, job loss and no new gains in the economy. It is about keeping with the original intent of the gaming laws which was creating new jobs and wealth, not just shifting it around with no new regional gains. Thank you for your time.

### HEARING OFFICER:

Please be seated. And I note for the 10 record that Mr. Lavani provided a written statement 11 with the swearing in. That becomes a verified 12 statement now. Thank you. The first person we have is Thomas Baxter. And I remind everyone you have three minutes for your time. The clock is there. And also I'd remind the audience, please, no clapping, applause, anything of that nature.

## MR. BAXTER:

My name is Thomas Baxter. I'm a resident of Farming and Wharton Township, lifelong homeowner in Wharton Township, and I'm here to support the decision of the Category 3 Gaming License to Nemacolin Woodlands Resort.

The four applicants vying for the 24 Category 3 License, do they all meet the prerequirements of a resort? Holiday Inn, Mechanicsburg

is not listed as a resort for traveling. Eisenhower 1 2 Hotel & Conference Center, Gettysburg, not listed as a resort for traveling. Fernwood Hotel & Resort, East 3 Stroudsburg, is a resort with privately-owned condos and villas. It would be the second casino in that Pocono area. Nemacolin Woodlands Resort, Farmington, is an established resort in 1987. The PGA Tour classified this resort as a world-class resort, with a Three-Star --- with AAA Five-Diamond rating. 10 Nemacolin is an all-year-round resort, which qualifies as a Category 3 License resort. 11 12 Of the four applicants applying to

operate the casinos, Isle of Capri would rank number one due to their expertise in operating 15 other casinos in the United States. The president and COO, Virginia McDowell, received the 2010 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Casino Journal written by Dennis Conrad. The award came from current colleagues and community leaders, recognizing her accomplishments.

Of the four applicants, Nemacolin Woodlands has the support from their local political leaders and community groups. From the testimony I've heard here today from our various legislators, local government representatives and our community groups,

yes, we have the support of the community.

2 All the applicants within the state 3 definitely need economic help. Wharton Township is surrounded by thousands of acres of state game lands and state parks, which produces no tax base. business and land development is essential to our tax base, which helps the improvements of our school districts and relieves tax burdens on existing business and landowners. Fayette County unemployment 10 rate is ten percent, which ranks fourth among the four applicants. Fayette County needs economical 11 12 development and jobs now.

Of the four applicants, which applicant can support a year-round casino? Nemacolin is a premier, established resort destination located in the majestic Laurel Mountains in southwestern Pennsylvania corridor and is surrounded by Maryland and West Virginia. Tourism is our bloodline for our township, county and state. Within 15 minutes of Nemacolin, visitors can visit whitewater rafting down the Youghiogheny, the Frank Lloyd Wright wonders, Fallingwater and Kentuck Knob, or enjoy a day at Ohiopyle State Park. Let's give the visitors another reason to travel to southwestern Pennsylvania and grant Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and Isle of Capri the

Category 3 License and start this project now. Thank you for your time and consideration for this important decision.

# HEARING OFFICER:

Thank you, Mr. Baxter. Dr. Corrado.

# DR. CORRADO:

I am an emergency physician for the past 40 years here, a lifelong resident, spent all of my 73 years here in Uniontown. My father was a physician here in Uniontown. And for the past 90 years we know the economic travails of our patients here and what jobs would be for our area.

I also want you to consider one other thing. We have excellent medical support here. We have helicopters within the six miles of the casino. We also have an air strip right next to the casino, within 100 to 200 yards that could land the helicopter in case there's some kind of a medical emergency. We also have excellent medical backup.

Mr. Hardy and the Hardy family have been very supportive of the ambulance and the hospital and the emergency department and Uniontown Hospital. He was the largest donator to our Capital Campaign at the hospital, and he refused to take any recognition, in fact, dedicated the Emergency Department to me instead

of to himself, despite my urgings. I also always
wonder where would Fayette County be without the Hardy
family and Mr. Joe Hardy? So I think it's time that
our residents deserve a break, and I think Mr. Joe
Hardy has given us that break, and I hope we continue
that through your awarding of the Class 3 License.
Thank you.

# HEARING OFFICER:

Thank you. Mr. Burd, Harry Burd.

# MR. H. BURD:

My name is Harry Burd, Jr. I own and operate the Sunoco Aplus, which is directly across the highway from where the proposed Lady Luck Casino site would be. Since the Hardy family has always been an excellent neighbor and extremely generous to our local communities and they run a world-class operation. I'm looking forward to the local jobs and revenue the casino will bring to our area. I just want to thank you all for your time and support. Thank you.

# HEARING OFFICER:

Thank you. William Paulos.

#### MR. PAULOS:

Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman and
Commissioners, ladies and gentlemen, respectfully, Mr.
Hardy. I am Bill Paulos, principal of Cannery Casino

1 Resorts, owners of the Meadows Racetrack and Casino.

2 I reside in Las Vegas. I'm here today not only as a

3 licensee but also as a long-term partner with the 4 Commonwealth.

When we were licensed, we pledged to provide western Pennsylvania with a first-class facility for harness racing and first-class gaming experience. I believe everyone will agree we've kept our pledge with a rather substantial \$550 million investment.

The intentions of 2330 when passed in 2004 was to provide a significant source of revenue for property tax relief and wage tax reduction, to provide assistance to the horseracing industry, to provide broad economic opportunities to the citizens of the Commonwealth and to enhance tourism. For those stated intentions, we believe that southwestern PA is not the most appropriate location for the final Category 3 License. Southwestern PA is now well served by its existing casinos. Comparably, an additional casino will only be minimally accretive to the State tax totals and most definitely dilutive to the existing Commonwealth partners.

West Virginia is having major layoffs because of market saturation. Another casino in

southwestern Pennsylvania will cause job losses at
both the Meadows and The Rivers casinos. Low revenues
at the Meadows will also be detrimental to the
horsemen for whom this law was cast. And lastly,
dilution could undermine the financial stability of
one or more of the Commonwealth's existing partners.

It is public record that Moody's has downgraded the
debt of one present licensee for underperformance in
this marketplace.

10 When additional licenses were contemplated back in '04, forecasts for the 11 12 southwestern Pennsylvania market were considerably 13 higher than reality. There were all in the billion 14 dollar range. In actuality, it is \$200 million short 15 of that market value. Although the Meadows is surpassing the State's forecast, The Rivers has only 16 17 attained 61 percent of the State's expectations. Fortunately for the Commonwealth, there are other 18 19 options. There are other higher revenue opportunities 2.0 on the other side of the State. The real opportunity for the Commonwealth is on the southeastern border of 21 22 the state, where there is a minor chance of dilution 23 and the ability to tap into the best and most 2.4 underserved markets in the United States, parts of 25 Maryland, with an operator that has major synergies in that marketplace.

In conclusion, it would be a lost opportunity for the Commonwealth to create substantive tax revenue growth if it were to approve the final Category 3 License in southwestern PA. Thank you for your time.

## MR. W. BURD:

My name is William Burd, and I've lived in this community all my life, Wharton Township. I'd like to speak today in favor of Nemacolin Woodlands. I've known the Hardy family to be outstanding, an American success story that we can all be proud of, no matter what county we live in.

Washington County today spoke of the benefits of not granting this. Well, Nemacolin spoke of their market as a worldwide --- excuse me, a worldwide market, covering the United States. And by Washington County's own testimony, they spoke of their regional draw. That's a different market.

My family came here. The first Burd in 23 this area was a Scottish oat miller (phonetic) for General Braddock in the 1750s. People were gamblers back then. They gambled with their lives to come to

southwestern Pennsylvania. Today, I consider myself a 1 conservative Christian. I found it a little hard to 2. support gambling, but this gambling is regulated. 3 There's illegal gambling currently going on throughout the State of Pennsylvania with numbers games. will benefit our community. Tax revenues will benefit the community. I appreciate this Board today. appreciate the State of Pennsylvania. We live in a beautiful, beautiful area. This is a clean industry. 10 We're not tearing up the hills to strip mine. appreciate the Isle of Capri and Nemacolin Woodlands. 11 12 Thank you.

Thank you. Barbara Terry.

Good afternoon. My name is Barbara

Terry, and I live in Wharton Township. We have no place to park. Crime will come. We have crime now. Are we able to afford six full-time police officers?

Our fire department is understaffed. Can we afford to pay six full-time emergency personnel? The increase in our property tax for Wharton Township. And how many stoplights, restaurants and hotels are we going to have here in the next five years. What is going to happen to our National Road. The casino is on the

National Road now. If the license is approved, what percentage of this money is going to go directly to Wharton Township? We, the people, we have to deal with this every day. It's not like we're tourists that's coming from somewhere else. Are we going to receive a lot of money for this gambling casino? How is it going to grow in the years to come?

If the license is approved, are we going to be able to afford all the necessities that we need? Most of the people that live in Wharton Township are over 35, have families or they're elderly or lived here all their life. Having lived here all their life, they're not willing to move or sell. And what about the people that are coming into --- where are they going to live, the people that's going to come here to work at the casino? People in the mountains are not willing to sell. Are they going to come from another county? How is this going to happen for them to have housing? Thank you very much.

# HEARING OFFICER:

Thank you. John Hannan.

#### MR. HANNAN:

Good afternoon to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board, and in all respect, to Mr. Hardy and Mrs. Magerko. As stated, my name is John Hannan, and

I'm the Chief Operating Officer of Verizon Hospitality 1 Group. We are based in Washington County, Pennsylvania.

We're a small business in Washington County, and we own and operate five hotels in western Pennsylvania, including three within five minutes of the Meadows Racetrack & Casino in Washington County. They include a Comfort Inn & Suites, a Cambria Suites, both which are located on Racetrack Road, and the Homewood Inn, which is included in the Southpointe Business Park in Canonsburg, just up the road, on I-79. The Cambria Suites is scheduled to open this month, at the end of September. The combined investment of our hotels in Washington County is over \$40 million and employs over 80 local Washington County residents.

We've carefully undertaken these projects in response to the demand generated by the Meadows Racetrack & Casino and relying certainly on the traffic generated by that casino to sustain their viability in this difficult travel economy. It was certainly risky to develop the five hotels we undertook in this economy, and we certainly understand --- and we certainly can maintain an acceptable occupancy rate with the casino and certainly

understand, as hotel competition increases in the casino area, that we must accept that challenge.

However, a greater risk for us and a concern is the possibility of another casino at Nemacolin Resort that will reduce the market area and our market share for the Meadows Racetrack & Casino.

We currently rely on visitors well beyond one-hour driving time from the Meadows that utilize our hotels. Granting this Category 3 Resort Casino License to Nemacolin will really have a significant impact on our hotels and what we would consider an --- consider unfair to our significant private investors that we have included to Washington County.

We urge the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board this afternoon to consider other locations and not grant this casino license. I appreciate the opportunity and your opportunity to give us public opinion. Thank you.

### HEARING OFFICER:

Thank you. Sandy Wilson.

# MS. WILSON:

Members of the Pennsylvania Gaming

Control Board, thank you for this opportunity to speak

here today. My name is Sandy Wilson, and I'm a

resident of Greene County. I am the Director of Sales

and Marketing at the Holiday Inn in Washington, and I also serve on the Board for Washington County Tourism.

In the seven years I've been Director of Sales at the Holiday Inn, since the opening of the casino, we've seen a major increase in our occupancy. There have been new hotels being built. There's been an increase of over 700 rooms since the inset of the casino. We're seeing proofs --- major proofs of the investments that the Meadows has put into the market. 10 And not only are they an anchor tenant in the Washington County area, but there are a lot of more anchor tenants and area attractions, destinations to 12 come to continue to promote tourism. They're awesome 14 neighbors. I use them in all of my marketing and all of my advertising strategies to continue to attract area visitors from outside the county to not only spend money in the hotels and casino but the area as well. So I appreciate your time, and I hope that you will do all in your power to protect the Meadows Racetrack & Casino in our community. Thank you.

# HEARING OFFICER:

Thank you. Christine Blaine.

### MS. BLAINE:

24 Good afternoon. My name is Christine 25 Blaine, and I am the Director of Marketing and

Communications for the Washington Wild Things, a Minor
League baseball team located in Washington,
Pennsylvania. I also currently serve as the president
of the Washington County Tourism Promotion Agency
Board of Directors.

I'm here today to ask you to reject the application for Lady Luck at Nemacolin. I fear that this project will adversely affect the progress Washington County has made in the tourism industry over the past few years. The Meadows, the Tanger Outlet Mall, and the Washington Wild Things are the top three tourist attractions in Washington County. Currently, we are in the thick of a marketing strategy that allows us to leverage these three major attractions as a keystone in drawing new visitors to the area. The combination of these attractions is wildly appealing and brings people who may not have previously considered Washington to be a tourism destination.

Visitors are currently traveling to our area and they are spending their money in businesses here, including restaurants, hotels, historical sites and more. Hotel stays in Washington County have grown significantly due, in great part, to the Meadows, who is a neighbor in Washington County. But hotels are

not the only ones who are garnering benefits from the Meadows. Several other businesses have opened and flourished as a result of the Meadows' success.

2.4

A decrease in business at the Meadows will directly impact the surrounding business. At a time when unemployment is a hot issue throughout the whole United States, the Meadows has put people to work. As I understand it, the expansion of gaming has increased the Meadows' payroll from 300 to about 2,000, and they are currently probably the number one employer in Washington County. Those numbers, too, play a role in the success of companies in our area. The Meadows' employees and horsemen are Wild Things patrons. When they're not collecting a paycheck --- or when they are collecting their paychecks, they're frequenting venues like CONSOL Energy Park.

I implore you to look at the big picture today. Nemacolin Woodlands is already an award-winning and wonderful visitors site. Giving them a license may be the easiest route right now because it's ready to roll, it's a beautiful site, it will be easy to transform it to a casino, but if you look at the big picture, if it harms the Meadows, it's going to harm southwestern Pennsylvania. The Washington Wild Things baseball team believes another

casino in western Pennsylvania will be detrimental to those already in operation, and we ask you to reject this application. Thank you.

Thank you very much. Consistent with our past practice of providing applicants who ask to reserve a portion of the time for rebuttal, Woodlands Fayette, you have your rebuttal time, and it is shown on the clock. Go ahead.

# MS. MCDOWELL:

Thank you very much, members of the I am sure you won't be surprised to hear that 12 Board. we view the competitive situation somewhat differently. There are a variety of different ways to evaluate the competitive situation. I'd like to draw your attention to a few.

The first would be drive time or proximity to the nearest casino. The nearest casino to Nemacolin Woodlands Resort would be the Meadows, which you've heard several folks talk about today. 21 But we ask you to note that the drive distance is almost 57 miles, and the drive time is over one hour. This is consistent with the drive time between the applicant and Gettysburg and Hollywood Casino, which is a little bit more than an hour. But again, I ask

that I draw your attention to the fact that there are two applicants that have casinos that are less than a half-hour drive time away.

I'd also like to draw your attention to another statistic that we use, which is looking at the number of gaming positions per 10,000 adults. are six mature gaming markets that we are very familiar with. I'd like to draw your attention to St. Louis, where we are headquartered. St. Louis is a mature market. It has about the same number of gaming positions as western Pennsylvania, but I call your attention to the fact that western Pennsylvania has a population that is almost one million larger, which means that, according to this chart, if you're looking in descending order, western Pennsylvania, even with --- and that number of 11,757 would include Nemacolin's gaming position, as allowed by the law, even with those positions, we would still have in western Pennsylvania the lowest number of positions per 10,000 adults, clearly not a saturated market when you look at these other markets that are very, very healthy.

Another way that we can look at this is what we like to refer to as our concentric circles.

These circles represent a 25-mile radius. Our

experience, particularly in local markets, and again, 2 we operate 15 casinos across the United States, is the majority of our revenue comes from within a 25-mile 3 radius. We've heard many people talk today about the fact that they believe that there is saturation in the western Pennsylvania market. With all due respect, I draw your attention to the other end of the Commonwealth. Not only are there a lot of circles there, southeastern Pennsylvania is also currently dealing with the impact of the introduction of table 10 games in West Virginia, table games in Delaware and 11 the introduction of full-scale gaming in Maryland. 12

On the other hand, we need to recognize a couple of things, number one, that the resort license was designed to enhance an existing resort, in addition to whatever could be gained by the local drive-in market. The casino would be designed to serve as an amenity to the hundreds of thousands of guests who currently visit the Nemacolin Woodlands Resort, and we believe would attract hundreds of thousands more who would bring their money to spend in the Commonwealth.

Number two, as I just stated, remember that western Pennsylvania has a very dense population of almost 3 million people. Remember that the resort

license is not a Cat 1 License, is not a Cat 2 License. This is 600 slot machines and up to 50 table games. And if you look at this particular chart, we believe that Nemamcolin not only stands alone, but we also believe Nemacolin would stand above the crowd.

So in closing we believe that Nemacolin has more to experience. You've heard about the absolutely fantastic resort and the wonderful amenities package that this resort has to offer, and we believe that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has everything to gain. We thank you for the opportunity to present today and respectfully request that our presentation materials from today be moved into the record.

### HEARING OFFICER:

The record created here today, including the transcript of the proceedings, any exhibits and any written comments received through the deadline of Monday, November 8th, 2010, will be included in the Woodlands Fayette application record and forwarded to the entire Board for its consideration. At a date in

the near future, the Board will schedule a public
licensing hearing to be held in Harrisburg. Check our
website for the date of that licensing hearing. While
the Board's licensing hearing will be open to the
public, no further public comment will be received by
