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PRESIDING OFFICER:

Good morning everyone. My name is Linda 4 Lloyd and I'm the Presiding Officer assigned today by 5 the Board to conduct this public input hearing 6 regarding the Petition filed by Woodlands Fayette, LLC 7 to conduct table games at its resort casino. Before 8 we begin, if you could all turn off or vibrate your 9 cell phones, PDAs, Blackberries or whatever they're 10 called today so we can all hear what everybody has to 11 say? As the Presiding Officer I call to order this 12 public input hearing regarding a Petition of Woodlands 13 Fayette, LLC for approval in the issuance of a 14 certificate to conduct table games, which was deemed 15 complete by our Bureau of Licensing and filed on 16 January 17th, 2013 at docket number 2988-2013. 17 The date today is Thursday, February 18 The time is 10:15 and the location is the 19 7th. 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The Board and staff would like to thank the Wharton Township's office for making this space available and for their staff's cooperation. been essential in organizing and holding this hearing The purpose of the hearing is to allow today. Woodlands to present to the public its plan to operate table games at its resort casino and to allow individual members of the public, community groups and elected officials to express their thoughts and share their concerns about the proposed project before the The hearing will continue until the last scheduled speaker has had the opportunity to speak. The order of speakers here today is as follows. We'll hear remarks from Senator Richard Kasunic and Representative Tim Mahoney.

And then we will hear from --- the Petitioner Woodlands will make their presentation and then after that we will hear from all the other individuals, local government representatives, community representatives that have registered to

speak. Woodlands will have about 20 minutes for their presentation, government officials will have ten minutes to speak, community groups have about five minutes and individuals have about three minutes each. If you are speaking, if you could begin your remarks by stating your name and spelling it for our court reporter we have so we know who you are. And we'll swear in all speakers in a few minutes.

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If you have written notes of testimony and --- that you will be speaking from, if you would give a copy of that to the court reporter who's sitting over here. She'll probably use that and it'll be very helpful. So this is an official administrative hearing. It is being recorded by a court reporter. It is also being streamed live via our website and will eventually be put up on our So anyone who wants to revisit again can go website. watch again. I ask you all to speak loudly and clearly, and if you are a public speaker, if you want to come up and use the microphone so we can all hear what you have to say. So, let's begin by having each of you that is registered to speak today, provide testimony on behalf of Woodlands. If you would all please stand and raise your right hand to be sworn by the court reporter.

WITNESSES SWORN EN MASSE:

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PRESIDING OFFICER:

One housekeeping matter. Public comment, written public comment was permitted, but we did not receive any written public comment at least until --- up until yesterday afternoon. So, there's none of that and let the record reflect that. So we will hear from right now Senator Richard Kasunic. Senator?

MR. KASUNIC:

Good morning. I'm Senator Richard

Kasunic from the 32nd Senatorial District. And I

would like to welcome the Gaming Board and Staff to

Fayette County this morning in allowing me to voice my

support for Nemacolin Woodlands Resort Request to

Operate Table Games here at the Isle of Capri with

Lady Luck Casino. Before I get into that I want to

first take this opportunity to thank and commend the

Board on its decision to award the Slots License to

Nemacolin facility. As was eventually established by

the Supreme Court, the Board did an excellent job and

used keen judgment to ensure the legislature's intent

of a Resort License within Act 71 was realized. And

as you can see, here in the Laurel Highlands we are truly a destination.

We are a four seasons region and truly a five star crown jewel of the Laurel Highlands is Nemacolin Woodlands, something we're very proud of. And I would like to take this opportunity also to thank the Hardy family for having the vision and taking the chance and the challenge investing millions and millions of dollars in our county here. That certainly has improved the quality of life in here in the region by the number of jobs that they provided and certainly everything that they brought with them from their business sense and operating 84 Lumber and has made our community a more viable community and a better place in which to live and to raise a family. So, Mr. Hardy and Maggie, thank you very much for your vision on that.

You know, and along those lines with what we're talking about today is a situation where you awarded a Resort License in accordance with Act 71 and went along with the true intent of the legislation concerning resort Licenses. And as a member of the Legislature at that time I can testify to the intent of what a resort license was all about and it was about awarding licenses to existing resorts that had

the amenities. It wasn't about awarding a license to 1 a facility to build a resort around and truly what we 2 have here is exactly to the letter of the law. 3 can see out there --- and I talked about the four 4 seasons and this being the destination --- the snow, 5 you know ---. We have all four seasons. We have 6 skiing, we have sleigh riding, we have carriage rides 7 We have a world class spa, we have a at Nemacolin. sporting class facility second to none and not to mention the championship golf courses and many other 10 things that I could go on and on about, but this is 11 truly, you know, a resort that the legislature was 1.2 thinking about when that bill was written when it 13 became the law. So, once again I commend you and 14 extend my appreciation to the Board on that decision. 15

What we would also like to do is talk a little bit about what's happening here in the region and why it's so important to have the table games. So, as we move on --- as we move forward with this last piece of the puzzle that will help make Lady Luck Casino profitable and an attractive venue. Approving and making table games available in a resort is both logical and a rational step. Its availability can only strengthen the resort's attractiveness as a tourist destination.

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As we all know, Nemacolin has already 1 been renowned and it has a reputation worldwide. 2 just here in Pennsylvania, or Southwestern 3 Pennsylvania or in America, but worldwide for its accommodations, its natural beauty, elegance, staff friendliness and guest amenities. Table games will complete and enhance the resort's gaming offerings and 7 provide another option for guests who choose to visit Furthermore and most importantly and the casino. 9 particularly for Southwestern Pennsylvania it will 10 allow the resort to remain competitive in attracting 11 visitors from other large five star resorts who offer 12 similar amenities in other states. 1.3

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over the years we here in Pennsylvania, and particularly our part of the state in southwestern Pennsylvania we have lost conferences, we have lost conventions, we have lost visits from individuals simply because in other areas, in other states they were offering amenities and that one amenity has cost us jobs in here, in Fayette County and certainly tax revenues both local and statewide. I should emphasize that Nemacolin is not seeking, it is not seeking a substantial expansion of gaming. The modest table games expansion would only add about 30 table games and all gaming activity would remain strictly

regulated and confined to the resort's casino.

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Additionally and just as important 2 including table games in the resort's gaming offerings 3 would generate more jobs and spark increased economic 4 development and growth. It would attract more guests. 5 It would draw more conventions and conferences all at the same time simulate and accelerate business and economic investment for host of related and unrelated If Nemacolin and businesses throughout our region. 9 the Isle of Capri is allowed to reach its full 10 potential we are looking at 400 new jobs at the casino 11 itself. Probably another 200 jobs in other areas of 12 Not to mention the other businesses that the resort. 13 I talked about earlier that will obviously need more 14 help and provide new jobs. 15

both slot machine and table game gambling. They employ over 16,000 people and generate about \$4 million each and every day. The lion's share of the proceeds is used for property tax relief, sewer and water projects, grants for fire departments, revenue for local and county projects and bolster the state's horseracing industry at the same time.

Let me briefly elaborate on what I mean by more jobs. While legalizing slot machines has been

an economic plus it should be noted that it takes more 1 people to operate table games. When you take a look 2 at the personnel needs for table games you will find 3 the demand for dealers, pit bosses, floor managers, 4 tellers, surveillance workers and many others. Τо 5 receive the full benefit of hosting a casino Nemacolin 6 must be able to provide and compete against what other casinos have to offer. Last February in our hearing 8 to include table games in the State of New York 9 consultants argued that about \$4 billion in 10 entertainment dollars left their state each year bound 11 for full service casinos like we offer here in 12 Pennsylvania. 13

Denying this license would hamstring Nemacolin's ability to compete and reach its full It would also deprive our region of full potential. economic benefits of gaming and stunt job growth here tremendously. At this time I would like to thank the Board for this opportunity in allowing me to address you and urge you to approve this Table Game License for Nemacolin Woodlands. Thank you very much.

PRESIDING OFFICER:

Next Representative Thank you, Senator.

MR. MAHONEY:

Tim Mahoney.

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Thanks for attending the Good morning. 1 As usual I follow Senator Kasunic and hearing. 2 there's not much left for me to cover. But what he 3 4 did cover is very important to the area and I wholeheartedly believe what he has just put across is 5 the truth in Fayette County. But he did leave out one 6 little issue, When you bring two companies like 7 Nemacolin Woodlands and Isle of Capri together and put 8 them together it's a win/win --- no pun intended with 9 It's a win/win for the whole area and all it 10 will do is make Fayette County and Wharton Township 11 grow for jobs, and for infrastructure and for all the 12 needs that need to be done in this area. And I 13 wholeheartedly support it and I'd like to thank the 14 Board for approving the license before and hopefully 15 they're going to approve the table games in the 16 Thank you very much. And Mr. Hardy and Isle 17 future. of Capri, thank you very much for investing in Fayette 18 19 County. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER:

Thank you. Now, we will hear from Nemacolin Woodlands and their presentation.

MR. PLUMMER:

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Well, thank you, Senator Kasunic and Representative Mahoney. I appreciate it. I'm Chris

I'm the general manager at Nemacolin. I've Plummer. 1 been at Nemacolin since 2006, for seven years. 2 to that I was in the State of Nevada working in the 3 gaming industry for nine years primarily with Caesars Entertainment. So, I want to thank Chairman Ryan, Commissioner Kaiser, Commissioner Fajt for attending 6 and everybody in attendance and giving me a great 7 I can obviously speak for hours about opportunity. 8 something I'm very passionate about, my love for 9 Nemacolin and what Mr. Hardy and Maggie and Pete have 10 created there, but I'll be a little bit briefer. 11

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over the highlights of Woodlands Fayette County. I'm going to talk about that. The chief operating officer of Isle of Capri is going to talk about giving you a construction update and financial suitability and the new GM at the Lady Luck Casino at Nemacolin will then speak about the management team, table games overview and what's going on there. Currently right now at Nemacolin we host over 350,000 guests annually from across the country and the globe. Our 2,000 acre resort employs 900 to 1,200 people based on seasonality and we look forward, really look forward, to growing that number with the opening of Lady Luck Casino very shortly.

Because of our dedicated and talented associates and the division owners we're very fortunate to be recognized by some of the top names in the industry. Lautrec is one of only 26 restaurants in the world to hold on to five star by Forbes Travel Guide and Falling Rock is one of only 52 hotels in the world to hold that same line. Mystic Rock is ranked number 75 best public golf courses in the country by Golf Digest and our Woodlands Spa was recently rated ninth best in the country by the readers of Conde Naste Magazine. We do like the awards, but it's not the most important thing we do. It's our associates and quests that really drive us to do what we do. They drive our extensive list of amenities that starts with our six different lodging options that include Falling Rock, Chateau Lafayette, The Lodge, our townhouses and condos, our private home collection.

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We even have a 20 space RV park that is booked solid throughout the summer. Dining is obviously an essential part of the Nemacolin experience and we operate 15 unique dining options across the property. Corporate events are a vital part of our business. This year we will do over 40,000 events alone in the corporate segment and that makes up about 50 percent of our total revenue. We

anticipate Lady Luck Casino and table games especially
to be a real help to driving that corporate business,
which is a real key to success at Nemacolin. We have
over 31,000 square feet of meeting space, dedicated
planning team and unmatched team building operations
for that corporate business. We offer the finest and
traditional activities like golf at Mystic Rock,
tennis, horseback riding, fly fishing.

Our new Sundial Lodge that we just opened right at Christmas is a year round hub of outdoor activities for this region. In the wintertime we have the ski resort, snow shoe, snowmobile and snow tubing. And in the summertime the zip line, mountain bike and 18 miles of Jeep off-road driving academy. It will truly be a year round outdoor destination for the Laurel Highlands. At Woodlands Spa we have 40 unique treatment rooms and home to over 100 different therapies. We service on a real busy day about 400, 500 guests through that facility. Traditional massage, facials, manicures, pedicures are on our menu as well as untraditional items like unique scrubs, wraps, body kurs and acupuncture.

Across our 2,000 acres our guests also get to enjoy the Hardy family art collection. The collection is literally around every corner of the

resort and it includes famous pieces by Botero, Calder 1 Interesting collectibles like a piece of 2 and Lautrec. the Berlin Wall, original Beatles photographs as well 3 as antique automobile and aircrafts are literally around every corner of our resort. Our expansive 5 retail offerings include everything to men's and 6 7 women's apparel to a jeweler --- to a cigar shop and a fly fishing shop where you can tie your own ties. of course, you don't generally think of luxury resorts 9 unless you think of, you know, hyenas, white lions, 10 tigers, that kind of stuff. Our Wildlife Academy is 11 one of our main attractions for guests across the 12 country. The interactivity with the animals is really 13 unlike any other place in the world and we're home to 14 nearly 100 exotic species for them to enjoy. 15

We also have a luxurious Pet Spa and a full service veterinarian clinic for them to be taken care of as well. So, as you can see, the choice of amenities that we offer at Nemacolin and the associates that drive those amenities are --- is really our competitive advantage. Sixty (60) percent of our guests currently come from outside of the Commonwealth to visit our resort. I think everybody knows Mr. Hardy's famous quote about the ocean, about how he's working on that, about the only thing

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Nemacolin doesn't have is the ocean but he's working on that.

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Knowing the Hardy family as I do over these seven years I'm really just waiting for that phone call telling me I brought it here, now figure out what to do with it, Chris. Adding table games to this list of amenities not only aligns very, very well with our current demographics and what we attract already, but it will also appeal to new visitors as well and will be vital to the success and future of this resort. And we're very, very proud to partner with Isle of Capri in this venture, so I really appreciate you guys giving me the opportunity to talk about Nemacolin and now I would like to introduce Arnold Block. He's the chief operating officer at Isle of Capri. He's going to talk about their company.

MR. BLOCK:

Thank you, Chris, Chairman Ryan,
Commissioners, Executive Director O'Toole. My name is
Arnold Block and I serve as the chief operating
officer of the Isle of Capri Casinos, Incorporated.
We appreciate the opportunity to share details with
you today about our table games at Lady Luck Casino in
Nemacolin. I would like to start by saying how

1 pleased we are to be working with the Hardy family, everyone at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and the 3 Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board to turn the Lady 4 Luck Casino into a reality. I'm sure you already know, Isle of Capri Casinos is a publicly traded 5 6 corporation operating 15 casinos in six states 7 including over 14,000 slot machines, over 330 table We employ over 7,500 individuals with an 8 games. 9 annual payroll topping about \$250 million.

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The design concept of Lady Luck Nemacolin is modern, prairie style creating a vibrant entertainment venue while capturing the essence of the Woodlands resort. The building expansion introduces facade elements, which usually visually pull the structure out of the surrounding landscape, reemphasizing excitement of the entertainment within. The table games are centered on the gaming floor and capture the modernized prairie style design. casino represents an investment of approximately \$60 million and includes 600 slot machines, 28 table games and two restaurants. The floor layout has been carefully planned to allow for easy access to both slots with all the table games located down the center aisles and the restaurants located at the rear of the building. Guests will be able to move quickly from

valet or the parking lot, through security and onto the gaming floor.

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The existing structure which will become 3 the casino, has been completely gutted and work is 4 currently underway to install underground utilities, 5 framing has begun in existing back of house areas and 6 digging for underground utilities has begun for the 7 new restroom addition. Footings have been poured and steel will soon be in place for the new office space We thank everyone at Keating Building 10 Company based in Philadelphia for their hard work and 11 dedication so far and look forward to sharing our 12 completed casino with the Commonwealth sometime this 13 Isle of Capri will be funding the \$7.5 14 summer. million table game authorization fee and all capital 15 expenditures required to bring table games to Lady 16 Luck Nemacolin. We will be utilizing Isle's 17 internally generated cash flow from its existing 18 operation and our existing revolving line of credit. 19 Our available borrowing capacity as of October 28, 20 2012, the date of our last public disclosure, was 21 approximately \$200 million. 22

Next I would like to introduce Rich Laudon. Rich has been named vice president and general manager of Lady Luck Casino Nemacolin. He

brings a diverse background in gaming operations from 1 multiple gaming jurisdictions. He most recently 2 served as vice president and general manager at Argosy 3 Casino in Alton, Illinois. We are thrilled to have 4 Rich lead our management team. As you can see from 5 the extensive list of casinos noted on the slide, Rich 6 is truly an experienced veteran. And now I would like 7 to turn the mic over to Rich. 8

MR. LAUDON:

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Thank you, Arnold. Chairman Ryan, 10 members of the Board and staff, Hardy family and all 11 of the ladies and gentlemen of our audience today, it 12 is a pleasure to be here and to discuss the table 13 games operation, and update you with our plans. 14 date we have hired most of senior management team. 15 I'd like to read the list of names some of which are 16 here today in the audience, so I'd ask those who are 17 here to stand or wave from the back of the room. 18 First of all, Merryan Rutherford, our director of 19 operations. Terry Gwinn, our director of finance who 20 will begin on the 25th of this month. Michael Giunti, 21 director of marketing who will begin this coming 22 Danielle Grimley, director of Human 23 Resources, Amanda Loveland, our compliance officer, 24 Christopher Schroder, surveillance manager, Mark 25

Starrett, our security manager, James Dave Haston, IT manager and Michael Prokop, our casino manager who is diligently working as we speak at our new dealer's school just a short trip away.

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We are both proud and pleased with this team that we have built, two of which are already --were previous Pennsylvania residents. The remaining are relocating as we speak and the rest will be moving to the Commonwealth shortly. Since our focus today is table games let's take a look at the 28 games we will It is a full complement of casino table games. offer. From Blackjack to Texas Hold 'Em our guests will be able to find their favorite game. We expect that the addition of table games to Lady Luck Nemacolin will bring in approximately \$1.4 million in gaming taxes annually at a rate of 14 percent in the first 2 years and 12 percent thereafter, which does include the local share of taxes associated with table games at two percent.

The expected employment impact associated with our table games will be approximately 130 positions. The total employment at Lady Luck Nemacolin could be approximately 400 positions. We have recently begun formal recruiting for table games with a public information session for individuals

1 interested in becoming dealers at our casino.

2 Approximately 100 people visited our staff last

3 | Saturday at the Laurel Business Institute in Uniontown

4 where we shared specific details about becoming a

5 dealer at Lady Luck.

The dealer school will last from 5 to 11 weeks. Trainees will be required to pass drug and alcohol screening on the first day of school currently scheduled to begin this Monday. Once trainees pass dealer school they will be given a contingent job offer. Not everyone is cut out to become a dealer, therefore the training is part of the interview process. Each week trainees will be assessed on their progress. There is no fee to attend this school.

Recruiting for other positions is off to a good start as well having received close to 1,000 applications so far and we have not even posted all of the jobs as yet. We intend to continue to utilize our web postings through Isle of Capri careers page as well as Casinocareers.com and other local outlets as well. We are committed to meet the residency goals. We believe that the best employees run the best business. We focus on employee retention and offer competitive wages and benefits. We provide bonuses down to the front line employees through our See, Say,

1 Smile Courtesy program and our Customer Experience 2 Owners Service Program.

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We will be utilizing a panel interview 3 format when hiring. Panel interviews are designed to 4 help us learn whether or not a candidate has the 5 friendly, outgoing personality that Lady Luck Casino 6 Our goal is to become the friendliest and is seeking. 7 most courteous casino in the Commonwealth. Additionally all of our employees are trained to act 9 responsibly, treat people with respect and to 10 recognize the signs of gambling addiction. We're a 11 member of the Council on Compulsive Gambling of 12 Pennsylvania and remain committed to ensuring that our 13 14 quests play responsibly.

In closing let me say that I am thrilled to be the leading --- leading this Lady Luck Nemacolin team. I look forward to relocating to the Commonwealth. Our leadership team will be strong and brings a wealth of gaming experience to this project and we are proud to be building a Lady Luck Nemacolin into a casino that the entire community will be very, very proud of. We believe our Table Games Petition meets all of the requirements outlined by the legislation and we look forward to adding table games to this project. Thank you, Commissioners and all of

our guests for taking the time to travel to Wharton Township.

PRESIDING OFFICER:

Thank you. We will now hear from the registered speakers. The first registered speaker is James Means.

MR. MEANS:

Everyone knows Jim. That's good enough. We would like to welcome you to Wharton Township and we'd also like to thank the Gaming Board. Thank Mr. Hardy, and Maggie and Keith Magerko, her husband, for what they've done within the community to help us out with our township fire department, stuff that us here at the township we couldn't do. We have approximately 35,000 acres of state forest land and including the federal government and state game land, which you know is the tax revenue and stuff is not that great.

We do get a couple dollars, with Wharton Township being 93.4 square mile, which is the largest township here in the county. Okay? And we do have the lowest tax rate here in the county. We strive to keeping that. It's been that for well over probably 40 years now and we have worked very hard and thanks to people like Mr. Hardy and Maggie and Pete we're able to continue struggling and get through

everything. And we just want to take the opportunity to welcome everybody and thank you. We appreciate it and believe it's going to be a big boost in the arm. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER:

Thank you. John Lewis.

MR. LEWIS:

I'm Wharton Township supervisor. I'm going on my 18th year. I've lived in Wharton Township all my life. Moved up here I was about a year old and seen a lot of things come and go in Wharton Township and looking really forward to this. I'm in support of this table games mainly for the simple reason is it's going to bring more jobs to the area, it's going to bring more money and the Wharton Township is finally going to be a name. It's going to be realized now because we're going to have things up here that we can afford to do, that we've been wanting to promise the residents of Wharton Township for many years seeing the other townships being able to do it and us not having the money because ---.

Speaking after Jim is sort of like speaking after Rich. He said a whole lot and I just got to add to it a few things. We're really looking forward because of the income we're going to get, the

jobs we're going to get and the opportunity to be able 1 to have the people coming here not only is it only 2 going to help Nemacolin Woodland which has been great 3 to us, but also the other restaurants and stuff up This is going to spread people coming in the here. area and just like a lot you might not have been in this area before you see the snow up here where you don't see snow other places.

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It's sort of like a dream come true and we're going to do everything in our power in the township to keep it secure in whichever way we can. Nemacolin has always secured their own area. They've always had the security up there and everything else. We've always had good standing working with them any way it came about, so we're really looking forward for the gambling to come and for Nemacolin Woodlands to work with us and keep this what we really want to see, a dream come true to me. Wharton Township be able to do a lot of things we've never been able to do. with that I'd like to thank the Gaming Board for coming and everybody else that showed up here today and just a thanks to everybody. Thank you.

MS. NUTTALL:

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2. Good morning. My name is Muriel I am the Executive Director of the Fayette 3 County Chamber of Commerce and on behalf of our Board of Directors and our members I would like to thank you 5 for this opportunity to present our testimony 6 7 regarding Nemacolin Woodlands' request for authorization to conduct table games at the Lady Luck 8 The Fayette Chamber of Commerce has a long 9 Casino. history in Fayette County. Since our inception in 10 1925 we have grown from a localized Chamber, which 11 encompassed only the City of Uniontown, to a broad 12 membership of over 600 businesses and organizations 13 representing more than 17,500 employees throughout 14 Fayette County and the surrounding region. 15

The Chamber's membership is very diverse with five --- with members in five major sectors.

Twenty-three (23) are professional services, 20 are non-profit government education, 18 percent are retailers and wholesalers, 15 percent represent the customer service sector and 14 percent are hospitality and food service companies. Ranked by numbers of employees our members range in size from the smallest to the largest, from sole proprietors on one end of the spectrum to nine of the ten largest employers in

the county on the other end.

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As the Chamber is charged with 2 3 representation of the county business community we are faced with issues on a daily basis, which are poised 5 to make great impact on our area. Gaming has certainly been one of these issues. 6 When an 7 organization has such a diverse membership such as ours we must continually work to be considerate of the 8 membership at large. Each and every one of our 9 members have an opinion and each matters greatly. 10 Looking back in time a bit to when the original 11 12 application for, gaming at the resort was presented, a survey was conducted with our membership to gauge the 13 support level of our business community. At that time 14 our Executive Committee decided that it could best 15 serve our membership by providing accurate statistical 16 17 information.

The decision was made at that time that we would be most representative of the level of support by our members by compiling a survey distributed to each of our members. We anticipated about a 10 percent response, but were very pleased with the 17 percent representative sample. Our question was very simple at the time, are you in support of a Class 3 Resort Gaming License at

Nemacolin Woodlands Resort? And indeed 80.8 percent of our respondents were in support of the prospect of gaming at Nemacolin. Of that 82.8 percent and 72.7 percent respectively feel that Fayette County's greatest benefit will come through an increase in tax revenues and an increase in tourism. That easily equates to high economic development expectations.

Looking now at the addition of table games at the Lady Luck Casino further supports the promise of increased tax revenue and increase in tourism. This is evidenced by an article in PA Matters that states that since Pennsylvania's first casino opened its doors in 2006 the tax revenue from slot machines alone has topped \$4.6 billion. Today Pennsylvania's operating casinos employ more than 16,000 people and most will attest to the economic success of the industry in the Keystone State.

Now, we understand that a healthy economy is rooted in many aspects of community life and the concept of economic development envelopes the concept of economic growth, where there's a calculable increase in the size of the economy. Measures used to gauge economic growth include investment, output, consumption and income, but economic development also includes the notion of changing the quality or nature

of the economy such as by changing investment choices or technology. The effects of gaming with the expansion and addition of table games can do just that in Fayette County, adding new jobs and creating continued business growth.

As one of our members simply but emphatically put, I just think it will create jobs, and another stated, we need to be optimistic and look for all the opportunities to build our tax base and economy. This fact is evident through a release from the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board who boasted that combined Slots and Table Games Revenue in PA rose 4.4 percent in 2012. For so many years Fayette County has struggled economically. It is certainly exciting to be here in this beautiful county in the Laurel Highlands ready to move forward with what certainly will be an economic generator.

Tourism is vitally important in Fayette

County. It represents our future and is currently one
of our largest industries consistently ranking first
or second. The additional entertainment options
afforded through the table games will help to increase
and boost our visitation. Our hotel occupancy tax or
bed tax certainly helps to provide the essential
funding necessary to support our tourism related

businesses throughout the rest of the county. As a Chamber of Commerce in strong partnership with our stated TPA, the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau, we are thankful to Nemacolin for the tremendous support that they bring to this industry and are hopeful of a continued increase in support through the taxes received by the tourists who choose to enjoy the amazing amenities here at Nemacolin Woodlands.

majority support for this project as a whole there are members who were not supportive of gaming of any kind in Fayette, but please keep in mind that the majority of those who were against the concept of a casino were against the moral concept of gaming no matter where it's slated to occur and no matter what types of games were to be presented. The addition of table games will not alter the view of these members. Nemacolin Woodlands is a good neighbor and the Hardy family has certainly chose to --- has certainly proven to the Chamber and in the community that they have the best interest of the area in mind as they create and operate their businesses.

Isle of Capri, too, even in its relatively short tenure here in Fayette has proven a commitment to the community both at the doorstep here

as well as to the county and region at large. 1 ability to add table games to the offerings here at 2 Lady Luck will provide even more opportunity to 3 support this area through family sustaining jobs and 4 an increase in tax revenue and tourism. MR. VIRAG:

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I'm Ronald Virag. I'm the Executive

Director of Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau and I am

honored to appear before the Pennsylvania Gaming

Control Board for this hearing in support of Nemacolin Resorts and for the approval of the Table Games

License for Lady Luck Casino. To the Board, I thank you very much for coming in and hearing us support this project and I certainly hope that it will have positive results.

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As the Executive Director of the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau I oversee tourism for the counties of Fayette, Somerset and Westmoreland. In that capacity I am keenly aware of the importance, specifically to Fayette County and generally to the Laurel Highlands, of the Lady Luck Casino and the role that it will play in the economic future of the county and the region. The approval of Table Games License for Lady Luck Casino will attract more visitors to Fayette County and the Laurel Highlands and will no doubt have a positive effect on the length of their stay here.

Table games will be an attraction that will augment the many wonderful attractions already available to visitors. The economic impact of table games will be far reaching. The availability of table games at the casino will create more jobs for area residents and those jobs and the wages they produce will undoubtedly have a positive effect on Fayette

County's economy and the standard of living of its The approval of Table Games License for the casino will also level the playing field with casinos in Pittsburgh and Washington, PA and enable this region to compete with neighboring states that include West Virginia, Virginia, Maryland, Ohio and New York. With the nearest Pennsylvania casinos approximately 70 miles away, give or take a few miles, the market is not overrun or saturated with casinos or table games.

Speaking of Washington, PA, tourism spending in Washington County in 2006, before the Meadows Casino was operational, was \$415 million. In 2011, just five years later, tourism spending in Washington County was \$669 million. That's an increase of 59 percent. I can assure you that increase wasn't attributable to the fact that Washington County found more tourist attractions or historical sites. That growth in tourist spending is directly attributable to what the casino has brought into that county.

A press release from the Meadows on February 13, 2012 noted the following, representatives from the Meadows Racetrack and Casino revealed its economic impact to local communities in paid goods and

services and tax revenues. The latest figures for 1 2011 show the Meadows disbursing more than \$191 2 million throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 3 which included gaming taxes. In addition to our 4 facility being an all-inclusive entertainment 5 destination, Pennsylvanians, and especially local 6 residents, are seeing the benefits associated with 7 gaming activities, said Sean Sullivan, vice president 8 and general manager of the Meadows Racetrack and 9 Casino. He continues saying, whether you are an owner 10 of a nearby small business, involved in harness racing 11 or simply a resident of the local community who 12 receives tax revenues, Pennsylvanians as a whole are 13 experiencing the positive economic impact of these 14 disbursements. Mr. Sullivan went on to state, given 15 the location of the facility, Washington County 16 received the largest percentage of disbursement in 17 18 2011 totaling \$18 million.

This amount has grown from 2007 when the county received approximately \$3 million. Remember 2007 was just when it was getting up and running. That's a 460 percent increase. The Laurel Highlands is a larger area and has more visitor attractions than Washington County. And I don't say this factitiously. It's just factual, we are a larger area. We have many

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more visitor attractions, which will result in higher visitor counts. Therefore, we would expect that the economic impact of the Lady Luck Casino will produce results for Fayette County and the region that are even more dramatic than those referred to relative to the Meadows Casino.

Fayette County is a highly desirable four season visitor destination because of its many attractions that include Falling Water, Ohiopyle, the Great Allegheny Passage as well as a number of natural and historical sites. Its proximity to Seven Springs Mountain Resort, Hidden Valley Resort, the Flight 93 Memorial, Idlewild Children's Park, the Arnold Palmer Regional Airport and a variety of other attractions put it on the agenda of hundreds of thousands of visitors year after year. Many of those visitors will add Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and Lady Luck Casino to their list of places to visit while in the Laurel Highlands.

Table games will attract visitors to the casino who are in the area for a multitude of attractions, which are generally not available to visitors once the sun sets. Therefore, the expanded gaming offerings of the Lady Luck Casino will provide visitors recreation in the evenings and enhance their

overall experience. The approval of table games at 1 the Lady Luck Casino will be a win for many 2 individuals and entities in the area. It will be a 3 win for new jobs. These jobs will be created because 4 of this expansion of the casino. It will also be a 5 protection for the existing jobs because of the It'll be a win for taxpayers of collateral spending. 7 Fayette County and of the Commonwealth of 8 It will be a win for the businesses in Pennsylvania. 9 Fayette County and the Laurel Highlands because of 10 increased visitors it will attract and the money they 11 will be spending in our area. It will be a win for 12 the schools and their students in the area because 13 increased income and property taxes will help offset 14 the vast budgetary cutbacks that school districts have 15 And it will be a win for the recently experienced. 16 residents because more people will be gainfully 17 employed and they'll be able to enjoy more amenities 1.8 that will be provided by the county and the township 19 to enhance their quality of life. 20

The Isle of Capri brings its years of talent and experience to Nemacolin to ensure the accomplishment of all the goals and objectives that have been established by Nemacolin's owners and its leadership. I sincerely thank the

Board for your gracious attention and for your consideration of my support for the approval of the Table Games License for the Lady Luck Casino at Nemacolin Resort. Thank you.

MR. ZIEGLER:

Well, for those of you that I don't know, my name is Fred Ziegler and I've lived in Fayette County my whole life. My parents were both educators, seven brothers and sisters. Moved to the mountain in 1972 and have seen a lot of changes, you know, in the county over those years. Was here whenever the resort was owned by the Brockwell family and when the Hardys came in and bought the resort at the auction, there's just been a lot of work taking place. I know it was --- I don't think it was the initial intent to make it the resort that it is now.

I've heard different stories about the involvement, but I know that it was filled with passion between Maggie and her father and Pete came along some time thereafter and kind of built, you know, a fantastic resort. I'm a business man. I own the Stone House Restaurant and Hotel. It's a national historical landmark, and you know, a result of a lot

of hard work and a lot of years of energy. You know, we've been able to expand it. We have been able to payroll that exceeds \$500,000 there and we never would have been able to sustain the business had it not been for Nemacolin Woodlands nor would we have been able to bring the employees.

So, it's been, you know, such an exciting number of years that we've gone through the involvement, the development. I have three children that live in this county with me. I had a grandson yesterday, first one. What's important to me is to maintain employment for my children in this area, in this community so that on Sundays we can have dinner and we can get together, and you know --- this whole process --- the years that you've endured to get here and everything that you endure through appeals. I have another business, and you know, really 1 educated, polished, blue blood families that come to 2 this place, I've never seen anything like this. 3 to have the low receptions, but anyhow I completely 4 endorse it and welcome it and pray that your judgment 5 will still be keen. And thank you for coming. 6 you, Mr. and Mr. Hardy and Pete. I mean, Maggie, Mr. 7 Hardy and Pete. We look forward to it. 8
