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CHAIRMAN:

Good morning, ladies and gentleman. name is Bill Ryan, Chairman of the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board. Before we begin I would ask everyone to turn off or at least put on silent cell phones and other electronic devices. Thank you very much.

With us today is Deputy Secretary of Agriculture Fred Strathmeyer, representing Russell Redding, the Acting Secretary for the Department of Agriculture. Also, Jennifer Langan from the State Treasurer's Office. And Bob Coyne representing the Acting Secretary for the Department of Revenue, Eileen McNulty. Thanks to the three of you for being here.

CHAIRMAN:

Okay. Ladies and gentlemen, thank you very much for your patience. We will begin today's 25 public meeting. First of all, let me say that the

Board held an executive session yesterday March 30th for the purpose of discussing personnel matters and to conduct quasi-judicial deliberations relating to matters being considered by the Board today.

I would also like to iterate an announcement that the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board will hold a public hearing on April 8th, 2015 to gather evidence, including public comment, on the Renewal of the Casino License of Valley Forge Convention Center Partners, LP, operator of Valley Forge Casino in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania. The hearing will begin at 10:00 a.m. at the Upper Marion Township Building, 175 West Valley Forge Road, Freedom Hall Room, King of Prussia, Pennsylvania.

MR. MCNALLY:

Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board approve the minutes and transcript of the February 4, 2015 meeting.

CHAIRMAN:

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CHAIRMAN:

Opposed? The Motion carries. Next we'll hear from our Executive Director Kevin O'Toole. Kevin?

MR. O'TOOLE:

Good afternoon, Chairman Ryan, members of the Board. The Board previously recognized March as Compulsive and Problem Gambling Awareness Month. And with the encouragement and support of the full Board, our Office of Compulsive and Problem Gambling had a very busy March. So, on the last day of the month, I thought we'd have Director Lanza give an update of her efforts.

MS. LANZA:

Thank you, Kevin. Good morning,

Chairman --- good afternoon, I guess, Chairman and
members of the Board.

CHAIRMAN:

Almost.

MS. LANZA:

As you know, March was National Problem Gambling Awareness Month, a time to reach out to the community to raise awareness of gambling addiction and treatment options. One of the main functions of the Office of Compulsive and Problem Gambling is outreach, not only in March, but throughout the year. The OCPG

has adapted and created many different types of informational handouts and self-help tools regarding gambling disorders and responsible gambling to provide during our outreach events. We offer these handouts to those who have a gambling addiction, their loved ones and to the general public so that they can be educated on all aspects of problem gambling.

Events that the OCPG participates in are senior fairs and health fairs, problem gambling conferences, informational tables set up at the capital, local malls and educational institutes just to name a few. At the senior and health fairs, we target senior citizens and provide them with the most up-to-date resources on older adults and gambling. We also spread the word to policymakers that the Board takes its role as gambling regulator very seriously. And that while most individuals are able to enjoy gambling as an entertainment amenity, we also have programs in place to assist those who are unable to gamble responsibly.

During National Problem Gambling

Awareness Month, the OCPG spent time at Pennsylvania

State University providing students and staff

information on college students and gambling. Also in

March, the OCPG's program analyst, Elizabeth Burch,

and I attended the Annual Statewide Conference hosted by the Council on Compulsive Gambling of Pennsylvania. The conference was made up of several different speakers sharing information regarding cutting edge findings on problem gambling. Speaking engagements are yet another important factor in Problem Gambling Awareness and Outreach. I have been fortunate enough to speak to many different community groups, such as Kiwanis Clubs, women's groups and conferences on addictions, among many others. It is so very important to educate as many people as possible on the different aspects of problem gambling.

The OCPG works closely with other government and non-profit bodies in Problem Gambling Outreach. We have an ongoing relationship with the Council of Compulsive Gambling in Pennsylvania, the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, the Pennsylvania Lottery and the Governor's Advisory Commission on Aging American Affairs. Together we pull resources so that we can best reach our audience throughout the Commonwealth.

As the OCPG moves forward throughout the year, Elizabeth and I will continue to reach out to the public to spread the world on problem gambling and the treatment options available in Pennsylvania. We

are persistently searching for new ideas on outreach and how to affectively promote responsible gambling and problem gambling awareness. I would like to thank each of you on the Board for your ongoing support of the OCPG and our efforts. So, thank you very much.

Okay. The first grant item that I have for you today is with the Philadelphia District

Attorneys Office. The Board had awarded them a grant in August of 2014. And one of the approved budget items was the training for some of its detectives.

The training occurred before the Board was able to award the grant. Therefore, they were not able to use grant funds for the training purposes. They're now asking to repurpose that budget item for --- I'm sorry. They want to use it for investigative costs. So any investigator costs they have when they're going out and investigating illegal gambling purposes. This has been reviewed by appropriate staff and I'm recommending that the Board issue an Order granting this request.

CHAIRMAN:

The second matter I have for 25 the Board is a grant with the City of Harrisburg

Bureau of Police and its co-applicant the Humane Society of Harrisburg. In accordance with the Board's new guidelines, we've applied a two-year grant --- or they've applied for a two-year grant to run from 2015 to 2017 in the amount of \$162,659 in the first year and \$130,159 in the second year. If approved this would be the first grant for the City of Harrisburg Police Department and also for the co-applicant.

The grant is sought pursuant to the Gaming Act which provides for the funding of legal law enforcement agencies to be used for investigation and enforcement of illegal gaming in the Commonwealth.

This specific grant aims to investigate and combat illegal gaming known in believed places, and specific to illegal slot machines, dog fighting and cockfighting.

The application was reviewed by appropriate staff. Appropriate reductions have been made for uniforms and equipment and also, it's in accordance with Board guidelines budget purposes, have been reduced to two percent. Do you have any questions? I'd be happy to answer them for you.

CHAIRMAN:

Any questions? Comments? Ex-officio members? May I have the Motion?

MS. KAISER:

Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board issue an Order to approve the Local Law Enforcement Grant as described by the OCC.

MR. MCCALL:

Second.

CHAIRMAN:

All in favor?

ALL SAY AYE

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10 CHAIRMAN:

Opposed? The motion carries.

ATTORNEY MILLER-TSHUDY:

Thank you.

CHAIRMAN:

Thank you.

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

Today the Board has just one Petition before it for consideration. That Petition is Presque Isle Downs' Petition to reduce the number of Slot Machines and Table Games on its gaming floor. This is the same matter heard just a few minutes ago by the Board. In addition to the presentation, the Board has received all of the pleadings and any other documents filed in the evidentiary record.

As we also heard earlier, if approved

the OEC has proposed 13 conditions to be placed on Presque Isle which are outlined in their Answer along with modifications made by Chief Enforcement Counsel during the hearing. The record is closed and ready for the Board's consideration.

CHAIRMAN:

Any questions or comments from the Board? Ex-officio members? May I have a Motion?

MR. MCCALL:

Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board issue an Order to grant the Petition of Presque Isle Downs regarding the reduction of slot machines and table games as directed by the OCC, with the conditions requested by the OEC.

MR. MCNALLY:

All in favor?

Opposed? The motion carries.

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

Next, presenting withdrawals and Reports
for Recommendations is Deputy Chief Counsel Steve

ATTORNEY COOK:

Good afternoon.

CHAIRMAN:

Good afternoon, Steve.

ATTORNEY COOK:

The Board has received 12 unopposed

Petitions to withdraw the applications or surrender

the credentials of 16 individuals. The persons

subject to these Petitions are as follows: David T.

Wafle, Jr., Frederick H. Kraus, Robert Ippolito, David

A. Pettit, Jr., Josephine Linden, William A. McKenna,

David B. Robbins, Robert L. Guido, Michael Klayko,

Diane Wilfong. The OEC has responded to each of these

Petitions indicating they have no objection to same.

As such if the Board were to grant these petitions,

they would be doing so without prejudice. The matters

are now ripe for the Board's consideration.

CHAIRMAN:

Any questions or comments from the Board? Ex-officio members? Can I have a Motion?

MR. MCNALLY:

Mr. Chairman, I do admit the Motion in Order to approve the Withdrawals and Surrenders as

described by OCC.

CHAIRMAN:

Second?

MR. MOSCATO:

Second.

CHAIRMAN:

All in favor?

8 ALL SAY AYE

CHAIRMAN:

Opposed? The motion carries.

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

Next before the Board for consideration are four Reports and Recommendations received from the Office of Hearings and Appeals. These Reports and Recommendations, as well as the complete evidentiary record in each matters have been provided to the Board prior to today's meeting. Additionally in each case, the person whom the Report and Recommendation pertains has been advised that the Board would be taking the matter up today and that they could come forward and briefly address the Board. If any of these persons are present and wish to come forward, they should do so when their matter is called.

The first Report and Recommendation pertains to Nebiyu Bellete. This matter was

considered by the Board at your January 14th, 2015 meeting. However, it was later discovered that the Hearing Notice received by Mr. Bellete informing him of the January 14th meeting had an incorrect time. As a result of this error, Mr. Bellete appeared after the meeting had adjourned. And after the OCC was notified of that error, we did not have the Chairman sign an Order, but rather relist for the Report and Recommendation today.

By way of background on March 21st,
2012, Mr. Bellete was placed on the Board's
Involuntary Exclusion List after it was proven that on
September 1st, 2011, he cheated while playing table
games at the Sands Bethworks Casino. Per Board
Regulations, an individual placed on the Board's
Exclusion List generally must wait five years before
being allowed to petition to Board to come off the
list. However, the regulations do provide that a
person may one time in that five-year period petition
for early removal from the list.

On May 30th, 2012, two months after being placed on the list, Mr. Bellete filed his first Petition requesting early removal. The Board denied this request on December 12th, 2012. Mr. Bellete has now filed a second request for early consideration to

remove his name from the Exclusion List. The OEC filed an Answer objecting to that request as not being in compliance with the Board Regulations.

with OEC's position and that is matter of law under the Board's Regulations Mr. Bellete could not be granted the relief he requested at this time. And as a result, the recommendation before the Board today is that his request be denied. And the matter is now ripe for consideration. I do believe Mr. Bellete is in the room; I don't know whether he wishes to address the Board.

CHAIRMAN:

Is Nebiyu Bellete in the hearing room?

MR. BELLETE:

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CHAIRMAN:

Come forward please, sir. Come over there if you will. Mr. Bellete, do you wish to address the Board on this matter?

MR. BELLETE:

Yes, I do, sir.

CHAIRMAN:

All right. Well, you're going to have to be sworn. Stand up if you will, sir.

First, I would like to say thank you to the Board 9 and ---. 10 CHAIRMAN: 11 Okay. Try to keep your voice up, sir. 12 Try to speak into the microphone so everybody can hear 13 you. 14 Sure. First, I would like to say thank you to 15 the Board the Chairman as well and all the officials in the room. My name was listed in the Exclusion List 16 17 about three years ago and I found that out --- I found 18 out about my name after the incident. When I was --let me tell you what. I'm sorry for --- first, I 19 20 would like to say sorry about --- if my English 21 or ---. 22 CHAIRMAN: 23 You English is fine, sir. 24 Yeah. Okay. I did have an incident in Sands 25 Casino. And when I found out that my name would be on

the Exclusion List when they send it to me, I didn't bother too much to appeal because I wasn't intending to go back there because casino --- or gambling is not my life. But I used to do it as a fun and I did play at Casino --- at Sands over like maybe 30 times.

And the one incident for --- there was a game and I was kidding with the dealer and somehow he --- and I gave him a good tip. And I keep playing. And at the end of that game, the day I left ---. And then I came back, the second time I come back, they found out that I was --- this incident happened. But what I'm trying to tell the Board is I have played over, without exaggeration, 800,000 seconds at the Casino at Sands.

CHAIRMAN:

I'm sorry. Give me that again, sir?

A. I have played over 800,000 seconds in casino.

But my profile was judged for the 60 second or 10 second incident that is presented to this Board. And my problem with that is in the last three years in my life, this website --- Exclusion List have affected my life, my family, my friendship and everything because I'm a businessman. Every time I give my business card to anybody, first thing they do is they Google me and they want to know who I am. And the first thing that comes in the Google is Exclusion List in the computer.

And because of that, I have lost two big contracts that I had to get it, but there's nothing I can do. Now I'm raising my kids ---. My kids are like in high school. My daughter, she's a national ice skater, the only African-American ice skater in New Jersey. I'm telling you the truth. And they're honor students. I want to send them to a good school and I have to save money and I have to earn money.

So my name being on the waiting list is affecting my life. Not only affecting my life, affecting my family life. Like I said in the beginning, I'm in Ethiopian region with American citizens. And I'm a taxpayer citizen. Since 1998, I have run my company with six full-time employee and some seasonal employee on the wintertime. And currently, I am the chairman, vice chairman of the church, which is the Ethiopian Orthodox Church in New Jersey. I oversee a half a million dollar fund. And we just bought a church and I'm in charge of the construction.

All of this is my positive side of me. Based on the fact that I'm telling you, and today, I'm here humbly asking your leniency and kindness and forgiveness for the first time so that I can be a better person to the society. I can live my life to the positive side and contribute something to the

country as well as to my State of New Jersey. And in the future, maybe the State of Pennsylvania.

Given a second change, I promise you in the strongest sense that I will never again act in the controversial of the --- whatever incumbent upon me and the role model to my kids as well as my parents to me. And this website thing for the people that sees my name on the website is becoming a stumbling block in the future of my business endeavor.

I don't know how much to tell you, but for me, my life is gone because of this. I mean, I don't see myself being productive. I don't see --- I can't give anybody --- I can't be it anymore. I can't give my business card. And I didn't respond to them in the beginning because it's not gambling --- I didn't know they were going to post me like this, they were going to portray me like this. Maybe they ask me not to come to Casino. That's fine with me. I'm not against it. I won't go to casinos. If you see me coming there or they reported that, I went to --- I go to any of the casinos, I mean, of course you don't have the right, but you can put me --- I promise you, you can put me behind bars for ten years.

My problem now is I want to lead a positive life, but they have my negative image and my positive dreams

in front. So once and for all, I thank you for listening and the rest is on you. I thank you again.

CHAIRMAN:

Mr. Cook, once again, could you tell the Board what were the facts after the filing of the first request, the first Petition by this gentleman?

ATTORNEY COOK:

The Petition was filed within two months of Mr. Bellete being placed on the list, went to a hearing at the OHA, a Report and Recommendation came up. Their recommendation at that point in time was that he remain on the list.

CHAIRMAN:

Did he show up for the hearing?

ATTORNEY COOK:

Appeals. I don't know that he showed up in front of the Board. I don't believe he did. The Board adopted that Report and Recommendation so he remained on the list. That was in May of 2012. Three years have passed and now he's petitioned again to come off the list. Our Board Regulations specifically say you can only request once in the first five-year period. So as a matter of law, pursuant to our regulations, the Hearing Officer didn't even grant him a hearing the

second time and just said pursuant to the regulations, we recommend it be denied. And that's what's in front of the Board.

CHAIRMAN:

Didn't grant him a hearing appropriately because of the law?

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

Complied with the regulations, yes.

CHAIRMAN:

Okay. And questions?

MR. FAJT:

Yeah, I have a question. And again, Mr. Bellete, do you understand that what you did --- I don't care it was ten seconds or one second out of 800,000 seconds, it was wrong and illegal? Do you understand that?

A. Yes, I do understand.

MR. FAJT:

understand the law and, you know, I don't want to set precedence. But let me just throw this out. What if Mr. Bellete would agree to go on the Self-Excluded List for a period of five years in exchange for coming --- which is a private list, as opposed to being on the Excluded Persons List, which is a public list?

And again, I'm just throwing it out for discussion. If we can't do it because of the operation of law that you mentioned before about his appeal to the Board twice within the five year period, I'm fine with that. But as a point of discussion, I ---.

ATTORNEY COOK:

Well, I think it's --- yeah, I think it's within the Board's power to grant extraordinary release if it so chooses. The issue with going on the Self-Exclusion List is there is a prerequisite that the person acknowledge that they have a problem --- a gambling problem. I don't know whether Mr. Bellete is willing to do that or not, or if that's in fact the situation.

MR. FAJT:

Would it be proper to table this motion and let you have that discussion with Mr. Bellete?

And again, I don't want to put anybody on the Board in a bad spot. So if you are not comfortable with that and believe that the law, you know, is what it is, I'm fine to vote this down. Well, not vote it down, but vote with the Report and Recommendation.

CHAIRMAN:

I guess, Greg, my input would be that

this is the first time I've ever heard of this. I certainly admire your ingenuity here.

MR. FAJT:

Or lack thereof.

CHAIRMAN:

think what we do is table it because as we all know, the petitioner here --- or the Respondent, excuse me, isn't the only person who would be affected. We have two separate Exclusion Lists. If that's a motion from you, Greg, and someone seconds the motion to table to give the Board the opportunity to review this and make a decision, I certainly wouldn't have any problem with that.

MR. FAJT:

I will make a motion to table this

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MR. MOSCATO:

I'll second it.

CHAIRMAN:

Okay. All in favor of tabling?

22 ALL SAY AYE.

CHAIRMAN:

Opposed? All right. Sir, this matter

has been tabled which means we have decided not to

make a decision today. You will be hearing from the Board at sometime in the not too distant future. And if you have any further questions before that, you can consult or call the employees here at the Board and get further information. But at this point, the Board is not going to do anything. Do you understand?

A. Yes, I do understand. And if you need any more elaborate --- or any kind of evidence that you need from me, my taxpayer, the Board that --- or the Church that I run, my kid's life, how they perform, and my family and everything, I'm willing to give you anything that you ask me.

CHAIRMAN:

All right, sir. You're excused.

A. Thank you.

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

The next matter before the Board today is a Report and Recommendation pertaining to Timothy Laity. Mr. Laity was issued a Gaming Employee Permit on June 28th, 2012 and worked as a security officer at the Meadows Racetrack and Casino. On June 20, 2014, the OEC filed a complaint to revoke Mr. Laity's Gaming Permit after learning that he had been terminated from the Meadows after making terroristic threats while on duty. As a result of his actions, the Meadows, as I

indicated, terminated Mr. Laity's employment. I do not believe --- oh, I believe he was also charged criminally for his conduct.

A hearing in this matter was held on December 18th, 2014. Service was made, but Mr. Laity did not attend the hearing. The OEC did however attend and presented evidence and testimony to support its Petition to revoke this individuals Gaming Permit. As a result of that evidence, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that the permit of Timothy Laity be revoked. And that is the recommendation before the Board.

CHAIRMAN:

Any questions or comments from the Board? Ex-Officio members? May I have a Motion?

MR. WOODS:

Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board adopt the Report and Recommendation issued by the OHA regarding the Gaming Employee Occupation Permit of Timothy Laity as described by the OCC.

On October 17th, 2014, the OEC filed a Complaint to place Mr. McMillan on the Board's Exclusion List alleging that on June 14th, 2014 he arrived at Harrah's with his nine-year-old son in the car and then left his son in the car unattended, entered the casino, redeemed promotional play and wagered.

A hearing in this matter was held on December 2nd, 2014 and both the OEC and Mr. McMillan appeared offering testimony and other evidence. The uncontested evidence presented showed Mr. McMillan did in fact leave his son unattended. Five minutes after Mr. McMillan left his son in the car, a security officer spotted the unattended child and took him inside the casino to the security office. Mr. McMillan returned to his vehicle 15 minutes later. Ultimately, security got in contact with him, reunited him with his son. He was barred from the casino for some period of time. However, police were not notified.

Mr. McMillan testified at his hearing

that he did not intend on leaving his son in the car for any extended period of time and that he only intended to run in and out of the casino to quickly redeem and play promotional play, which the evidence supports that exactly what happened.

Based on all of the evidence received, the Hearing Officer issued a Report and Recommendation recommending that Mr. McMillan be placed on the Exclusion List. However, after six months, he could petition to be removed from the Exclusion List. And that is the recommendation before the Board.

CHAIRMAN:

The final Report and Recommendation before the Board today pertains to a Request for a Recovery of Winnings while on the Voluntary Self-Exclusion List. As a result of this request, a hearing was held before the Board's OHA on October 28th, 2014.

show that on June 20th, 2014, an individual with the initials S.S.S. met with the Casino Compliance Representative at Parx and requested to be placed on the Board's Voluntary Self-Exclusion List for his lifetime. The Casino Compliance Representative conducted the mandatory interview with S.S.S. and completed all of the required procedures which include a checklist explaining that one would lose any winnings if found on a casino floor gaming after placement on the list.

On July 28th, 2014, five weeks after placing himself on the Self-Exclusion List while at Parx, S.S.S. was identified on the gaming floor of Parx and identified as being Self-Excluded. He was confronted by both Parx security and a Casino

Compliance Representative and escorted to the Pennsylvania State Police Office, at which time \$2,175 in chips were confiscated and turned over to the Board's Compulsive and Problem Gambling Programs as forfeited winnings of a Self-Excluded person.

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S.S.S. now petitions to return to return \$2,000 of that \$2,175 as his own money and not money won at the casino. At the hearing held on October 28th, 2014, both OEC and S.S.S. appeared and presented evidence. S.S.S. testified that he understood that under the Board's regulations a person on the Self-Exclusion List could have all casino winnings confiscated if found to be gaming, but he argued that he started gaming with \$2,000 and therefore only \$175.00 of the money confiscated were in fact his winnings. OEC presented evidence showing that this gentleman did in fact purchase \$2,000 in chips. However, they were purchased in four separate transactions. The first three transactions totaled \$900 in chips all of which were lost. S.S.S. then proceeded to purchase \$1,100 in chips, which grew to \$2,175 though table games play.

A Report and Recommendation was issued after the hearing and the Hearing Officer found that while every wager made could not be accounted for, the

evidence available showed that S.S.S. lost at least 49 bets since his \$1,100 buy-in and as a result, it was reasonable to presume that he lost an amount greater that \$1,100, notwithstanding ending his gambling session with over \$2,100. As a result, the Hearing Officer recommends that the entire \$2,175 remain in the possession of the Board as forfeited winnings.

TDN will still be required to pay \$45,000 for the renewal of its Slot Machine Supplier License. I have provided you with Draft Orders for this entity and ask that the Board consider the Orders to renew the Slot Machine and Table Game Supplier License, as well as the reduced Table Game Licensing fee for TDN Money Systems.

ATTORNEY PITRE:

We have 22 matters on the agenda for the Board's consideration today, which we will try to get through quickly. They consist of one Consent Agreement, two Suspensions, nine Revocations and ten Involuntary Exclusions. The first matter is a Consent Agreement between the OEC and Greenwood Gaming. I see Mr. Schroeder is at the table. OEC is represented by Dustin Miller. Dustin will present the matter for the Board's consideration.

CHAIRMAN:

Good afternoon, Mr. Miller. You can proceed.

ATTORNEY MILLER:

Good afternoon, Chairman Ryan and members of the Board. The OEC has a Consent Agreement between itself and Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment,

doing business as Parx Casino, prepared for the Board's approval at this time. This Consent Agreement arises from two incidents of underage Gaming at Parx Casino on September 11th, 2014 and November 24th, 2014.

On September 11th, 2014, T.T., an individual under the age of 21, entered Parx Casino at 2:57 a.m. T.T. was 20 years of age at the time of this incident. T.T. produced a fake State of Texas driver's license when challenged by a Parx Casino Security Guard upon entering Parx Casino, which indicated that she was 23 years old. T.T. remained on the gaming floor at Parx Casino for approximately one hour and 13 minutes before it was ascertained that she was under the age of 21. T.T. played six different slot machines while on Parx Casino's gaming floor.

She consumed no alcoholic beverages during this time.

T.T. was detected when she hit a jackpot for \$1,582. Player Services Representative scanned T.T.'s fake Texas driver's license at the main cage while processing her jackpot. T.T. fled to the parking lot of Parx Casino when her identification failed to correctly scan and attempted to leave the property by taxi cab before being apprehended by Pennsylvania State Police. While being questioned by

Pennsylvania State Police, T.T. admitted to being 20 years old and from the State of Missouri. She was charged with criminal trespass for the incident.

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On November 24th, 2014, L.J.T., an individual under the age of 21, entered Parx Casino at 12:55 p.m. L.J.T. was 18 years old at the time of this incident. L.J.T. was not asked for identification from any employee of Parx Casino when she entered the casino. L.J.T. remained on the gaming floor for 16 minutes. During that time, L.J.T. played a slot machine for approximately four minutes. L.J.T. was identified as being an underage patron when she attempted to buy into a pai gow poker table and L.J.T. was apprehended before she was able to exit Parx Casino. L.J.T. did not consume any alcoholic beverages while on the gaming floor. L.J.T. was charged with underage gaming under the Gaming Act of this instance.

On February 6th, 2015, the parties entered into a Consent Agreement to settle these outstanding compliance matters. The terms of that Consent Agreement include the provision that Parx Casino's shall institute policies and provide training, guidance and reinforcement to employees to minimize the opportunity for similar incidents of this

nature to occur in the future.

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And also Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment, Inc. shall pay a total fine of \$15,000. Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment, Inc. shall also pay a fee of \$2,500 for costs incurred by OEC, BIE and other related staff which is consistent with the Board's billing policy. The defining cost shall be due within five days of the Board's approval of this Consent Agreement.

Counsel for Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment, Inc. is in attendance today to answer any questions that you may have.

CHAIRMAN:

Mr. Schroeder?

ATTORNEY SCHROEDER:

Good afternoon, Commissioners and Chairman. That's Bryan Schroeder. B-R-Y-A-N, S-C-H-R-O-E-D-E-R. Assistant General Counsel with Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment, Inc., representing Parx Casino. We agree with everything stated by OEC and I'd be glad to answer any questions that the Board has.

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As a result, OEC will present --- read a short summary of the facts in each instance and request the required the penalty --- or the requested penalty from the Board in each instance and answer any questions that the Board may have.

CHAIRMAN:

Okay. Thank you, Cyrus. And I guess on behalf of the Board, let me state for the record that the Board has been provided by the OEC with the complete record in all these matters. And therefore, the Board is well versed on the contents of these petitions. So with that in mind and with that being clear to everybody, why don't you proceed?

ATTORNEY MILLER:

The first matter that I have today is the Revocation Complaint of Mr. Michael R. Bottone. We filed a Revocation Complaint in this matter because on August 10th and 11th, 2014, Mr. Bottone gave a patron a player rating that the patron had not earned, resulting in the patron being awarded a \$200 gift card through a promotion that Parx Casino was running at the time. So with that being said, we would ask that the Board revoke Mr. Bottone's Gaming Employee Permit for that activity.

CHAIRMAN:

Is Michael Bottone present in the hearing room? Any questions or comments from the Board? Ex-Officio members? May I have a Motion?

MR. FAJT:

Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board issue an Order to approve the revocation of Michael Bottone's G2 Employee Occupation Permit as described by the OEC.

Mr. McShane was arrested and charged with one count of hindering apprehension or prosecution and one count of unsworn falsifications to authorities. The charges stand for Mr. McShane providing false information to the Pottstown Police Department during an investigation. Mr. McShane subsequently pled guilty to the one count of hindering apprehension or prosecution. As such, the Revocation of Michael McShane's Non-Gaming Registration is now ripe for the Board's consideration.
