Office of Communications designs and coordinates and
produces reports that have all been very
well-received. We have a horseracing benchmark report
that we produce, we have a diversity report that's
produced.

And what I wanted to talk about a little bit today is our annual report. The Office of Communications has produced our tenth annual report for the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board. That report is required by Section 12.11 of the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act. However, I think that our report is particularly good because it goes beyond the requirements of 12.11 and really produces an incredibly informative document.

entire staff, the bureaus and the offices of our agency. It includes statistical summaries and charts that reflect the work of our staff in fulfilling its regulatory responsibilities. It also includes a statement of Gaming Control Board revenue and expenditures, which lists the cost of operation of the Board during the past fiscal year. And it also includes information regarding each casino facility, including slot machine revenue, table game revenue and gaming taxes that have been paid during the past fiscal year.

Another very important accomplishment, and Commissioner Fajt mentioned it just a minute ago, was the Board's Speakers' Bureau. During fiscal year 2014-15 there were 80 speaking engagements held throughout Pennsylvania that were coordinated by Communications Director, Doug Harbach, and Deputy Director, Richard McGarvey. These speaking engagements reach numerous citizens in community groups, allowing for a very important exchange of information and viewpoints on the casino industry and casino regulation.

Doug and Richard are almost always joined by members of the Board, who assist in these

presentations and respond to any questions from the attendees. These outreach opportunities enhance the Board's regulatory efforts by hearing the concerns and thoughts of the public regarding casino gambling.

The full annual report can be accessed by the public on our home page of our website at gamingcontrolboard.pa.gov. And there are also hard copy annual reports in the reception area of our public meeting room. If anyone would like one today they can pick one up on their way out. Thank you very much.

MR. RHEN:

Good morning, Chairman ---

CHAIRMAN:

Morning.

MR. RHEN:

--- and members of the Board. Today I have two topics for discussion. First I'll provide a review of the agency expenditures for the first quarter of this fiscal year. And secondly, I'll present your 2016-2017 budget for your consideration.

During the first quarter of the fiscal year, which ended September 30th, expenditures totaled to \$8.4 million. Expenditures were up three percent from the same quarter last year. Eighty-seven (87) percent of expenditures were for payroll, which totaled 7.3 million dollars for the quarter.

Salaries, overtime and payouts totaled 4.3 million dollars and benefits totaled 2.9 million. The average payroll expense for the quarter was up approximately \$10,000 per payroll from last year. This is with eight fewer paid employees on average for the quarter, the 301 employees this year versus 309 last year.

An increase in payroll expenditures are primarily a function of employee raises, a 10.6

percent increase in health benefit cost and 24.6 increase in pension costs. As a percentage of salaries paid, benefits totaled 68 percent of total salaries versus 62 percent for the same quarter last fiscal year.

Operating at fixed asset expenses for the quarter combined totaled 1.1 million dollars or 13 percent of total expenses. Nearly 75 percent of these expenses were for rentals and leases, which totaled \$463,000, equipment costs, which totaled \$192,000 and software licenses which totaled \$140,000.

That concludes my overview of first quarter operating expenses. I'd be happy to take any questions. Otherwise I can set the budget for next year.

#### CHAIRMAN:

 $\label{eq:Any questions from the Board?}$  Ex-Officio members? Fine, then let's move ahead then.

#### MR. RHEN:

The Gaming Board's proposal for fiscal year 2016-2017 budget request is \$40,619,000 for administration and \$2,000,000 for statutorily mandated local law-enforcement grants.

Funding for the Board supports oversight of over 26,200 slot machines and 1,100 table games

operating at 12 casinos throughout the state. Last fiscal year, the gaming industry returned 1.36 billion dollars in tax revenue to the Commonwealth. Overall the requested appropriation is \$735,000 or 1.8 percent higher than our fiscal year 2015-2016 budget.

The increase is a result of rising pension costs. Next fiscal year we'll see a 20-percent increase in pension rates with total pension costs going to 30 percent of salary expenses. The Board's budget includes 35.5 million dollars for salary and benefits and 5.1 million dollars for operating fix asset expenses.

The personnel budget is 87 percent of the overall request and includes funding for 308 positions. The benefit rate is 72 percent of salary expenses. And consistent with the instructions of the Governor's Budget Office, this budget currently does not include funding for new raises next year.

The operating and fixed asset budget is 13 percent of the overall request, and the total operating fixed asset budget request of 5.1 million dollars essentially matching the average expenses for the prior three fiscal years. And it's \$270,000 less than the current year.

The proposed budget would be funded

through a combination of \$5,755,000 in restricted revenue, including application and license fees and chargebacks of gaming lab costs to manufacturers. And 34.8 million dollars in drawdowns from escrow accounts funded by casino operators.

That concludes my presentation of the budget. I would be happy to take any questions, otherwise I would appreciate your consideration of the motion to approve the 2016-'17 budget.

# MR. FAJT:

I'm sorry, Mr. Chairman. I do have a quick question. Dave, I thought you said that the add-on for benefits, pensions and healthcare, I thought you said this year was 68 percent; is that right?

#### MR. RHEN:

That's correct.

# MR. FAJT:

Okay. And in this quarter, though, the quarterly report that you have, you show it at about 40.4 percent. Is that because we haven't made certain pension and/or healthcare benefits?

That is the percentage of the total personnel expense. But if you take the personnel -the benefit over the personnel cost, it should be about 68 percent.

Good morning, Chairman, members of the Board. Our first agenda item relates to a Local Law Enforcement Grant that Assistant Chief Counsel Denise Miller-Tshudy's here to present.

# ATTORNEY MILLER-TSHUDY:

Good morning, gentlemen, Jennifer. I am here to present a Local Law Enforcement Grant for the Philadelphia District Attorney's Office.

This is a two-year grant at \$250,000 per year. If the Board awards this, it would be their fifth local law-enforcement grant. And what the office proposes to use the funds for is to continue with its Gaming Task Force. And they work with local law enforcement in order to combat illegal gambling in

29 1 Philadelphia. At this time, if you have any questions 2 3 I'll answer them, otherwise, I would ask that a motion 4 be made to grant. 5 CHAIRMAN: 6 Any questions from the Board? agenda. One of the Petitions was heard by the Board earlier today during the Public Hearing, and the remaining two Petitions will be considered based upon the documentary record.

For each of the matters the Board has, in advance of the meeting, been provided with the Petitions, the Answers of the OEC and any supporting evidentiary materials of record.

The first matter is that of Greenwood Gaming. It's their Petition to modify the gaming floor, which you heard just a few minutes ago. As presented, Greenwood's new floor plan will offer 3,505 slot machines, 184 total table games and 10 hybrid games. The change will result in an increase of slot machines of 268 machines, 9 table games and will increase the gaming floor by over 23,000 square feet.

If the Board is inclined to grant their relief, it's requested that the approval be subject to the conditions outlined in OEC's Answer.

Additionally, Greenwood has requested that the exhibits to their Petition be maintained as confidential, as it contains security information.

OEC has no objection to the request and the OCC also is of the opinion that it would appropriate to protect the confidentiality of those exhibits.

2007 to be a certified vendor --- now referred to as a Gaming Service Provider --- and submitted the appropriate applications and disclosure information forms. The forms indicated that one Principal had been convicted of a felony for federal income tax evasion at a prior date.

The OEC issued a Notice of
Recommendation of Denial of the application. And
after a somewhat lengthy process to contest the
Denial, the parties ultimately reached a Consent
Agreement, whereby the Tomko Company withdrew its
Vendor Certification Application with prejudice, and
it was agreed that Tomko and its affiliates could not
conduct business with a slot machine Licensee nor
reapply for licensure for a period of five years.

That term is now expired and Tomko's requesting removal from the Prohibited Gaming Service Provider List.

The OEC does not object to that request, provided that Tomko pay a \$1,500 civil penalty and that it not be granted interim authorization to work until such time as a full background investigation has been completed.

Tomko has agreed to those demands, and with that the Petition is ready for the Board motion.

#### CHAIRMAN:

notified that Ms. Rojas had been indicted on numerous felony offenses in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania.

Specifically, Ms. Rojas, who trains and races thoroughbred horses at Penn National, is alleged to have injected horses with performance-enhancing drugs, thereby, obviously I think, with the hope to increase their chance of winning. A hearing on the matter was held before the Hearing Officer for the Board on August 20th. OEC, Ms. Rojas and her counsel appeared and offered testimony and exhibits.

Thereafter, the Office of Hearings and Appeals (OHA) issued an Order maintaining the suspension, pending further action by the Board.

On September 15th, 2015, Ms. Rojas' counsel informed the Board's clerk that she was waiving her right to any further hearing on the matter and was not further contesting the suspension. The matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration based upon the record to date. And specifically, it's a request to maintain the suspension in place that the Board is acting on.

Nevertheless, Mr. Strachan-Dugan requested a hearing and a hearing was held on June 11th, 2015. Mr. Dugan, as well as the OEC appeared at that hearing, and the Hearing Officer took evidence, subsequently issuing a Report and Recommendation recommending that the application be denied, given the statutory prohibition. And that is the recommendation before the Board.

On January 9th, 2015, Mr. Ware submitted a Gaming Permit Application seeking work as a Poker Host at the SugarHouse Casino.

Mr. Ware disclosed in his Application that he had two prior felony convictions for drugs and weapons offences dating back to the mid-1990s, as well as a subsequent probation revocation proceeding in

that time frame brought after he failed to keep an appointment with his probation officer.

After reviewing these disclosure on Mr.

Ware's application, and running an independent

criminal record check, the OEC issued a Notice of

Recommendation of Denial of his application based upon

these prior convictions.

At approximately the same time

SugarHouse Casino filed a Petition to Withdraw Mr.

Ware's Application as they had withdrawn his offer of employment based upon these circumstances.

The OHA subsequently consolidated the matters, and a hearing was held on May 27th, 2015. At that hearing, Mr. Ware appeared pro se and offered evidence on his own behalf, including that he had over two decades of experience in the casino industry in New Jersey, which included work in the supervisory roles as a Dual Rate Dealer and Poker Tournament Director.

He also submitted documentation showing recognition by his employer through most of that time, which was the Trump Entertainment Company. Mr. Ware continues to maintain a valid Gaming Permit in the State of New Jersey and has held this permit consistently since 2000.

He also testified and put into the record that he owns a commercial cleaning business for the past 15 years, takes college classes, is now committed to his family and involved in both his church and community, including establishing a nonprofit entity known as the Tasker Renaissance, which provides mentoring programs for children, conducts food and clothing drives, as well as programs to remove illegal firearms from the streets.

After the hearing, the Hearing Officer issued a Report and Recommendation recommending that the Petition to Withdraw Mr. Ware's Application as filed by SugarHouse be granted but without prejudice, based on the strong evidence of rehabilitation put into the record by Mr. Ware.

The Hearing Officer concluded that if the Board were to grant that recommendation and consider the application withdrawn, OEC's recommendation of denial of the application would therefore be moot.

After reviewing the evidence of record, the OCC concurs with the findings of the Hearing Officer, but recommends that the recommendation of the Hearing Officer be denied, and that instead Mr. Ware be granted a Gaming Permit having shown himself

suitable to receive one.

A hearing in this matter was held on July 14th, 2015, after requested by Mr. Ehresman, but he failed to attend that hearing and it was held in his absence. OEC offered testimony and documentary evidence into the record showing that Mr. Ehresman was either verbally abusive or threatened violence or vandalized casino equipment on at least 11 occasions.

As a result of the evidence presented, the Report and Recommendation issued recommends that Mr. Ehresman be placed on the Board's Exclusion List. And that's the recommendation before the Board.

On January 30th, 2015, the OEC filed a complaint to place Mr. Gazarik on the Board's Exclusion List. The complaint alleges that on July 19th, 2014 Mr. Gazarik entered a nonpublic area of the Rivers Casino used to store promotional giveaways. He then entered a secured slot storage and slot technician workshop adjacent to that area by breaking through drywall. While in the slot storage room, he attempted to open a locked toolbox and rummaged around the room, but otherwise did no damage.

As a result of his conduct, Mr. Gazarik was permanently evicted from the Rivers and was charged with criminal mischief, trespass, public intoxication and disorderly conduct; ultimately pleading guilty to disorderly conduct and criminal mischief.

A hearing in this matter was held on June 23rd, 2015. Both the OEC and Mr. Gazarik appeared and put evidence into the record. Mr. Gazarik testified that prior to visiting the Rivers on the night in question, he had attended a wedding, consumed too much alcohol and didn't recall any of the events that led to this proceeding.

He requested that he not be added to the Involuntary Exclusion List as the list is public information and he was afraid it would have an effect on his professional reputation.

Subsequently, a Report and Recommendation was issued by a Board Hearing Officer, citing evidence that supported Mr. Gazarik's claim of extreme intoxication and true remorse at the hearing. The Hearing Officer recommended that Mr. Gazarik, in fact, be placed on the Involuntary Exclusion List, but he be allowed to petition for removal from the list after one year. And that is the recommendation before

A hearing in this matter was held on June 4th, 2015. Both OEC and Ms. Ahad appeared; Ms. Ahad acknowledging the evidence that was presented had actually occurred.

Thereafter a Report and Recommendation was issued by the Hearing Officer, concluding that the OEC did not cite the correct section of the Board's regulations under the facts presented as to why Ms.

Asad --- Ahad, excuse me, should be placed on the Exclusion List. And, therefore, Ms. Ahad's due process rights were violated and she could not be placed on the Exclusion List.

The OEC thereafter filed an exception to the Report and Recommendation, citing prior Board precedent for placing people on the list under the regulatory section used. And as a result they objected to the Report and Recommendation.

The OCC would concur in OEC's position in this matter. So, the recommendation of the Hearing Officer before the Board is that this woman not be placed on the list. However, I believe OEC was correct that Board precedent would allow for it under the regulatory section side.

The first item for the Board is the consideration of the suspension of Renee Wu's G2 Employee Permit.

While functioning as a Table Games
Supervisor at the Valley Forge Casino Resort, Ms. Wu
admitted to providing player points to three
individuals who did not earn those points through
their wagering activity.

Ms. Wu issued these points so these patrons could be eligible for prizes at Valley Forge. Specifically, these patrons redeemed two cell phone charging mats each with a maximum retail value of approximately \$30.

No criminal charges were filed against Ms. Wu; however, Valley Forge terminated Ms. Wu as a result of her actions. Ms. Wu has not been employed at any casino in the Commonwealth since her termination.

As such, the OEC request the Board

suspend Ms. Wu's G2 Employee Permit for not less than 1 2 30 days. 3

Mr. Strehle was denied as he is 1 2 prohibited from purchasing a firearm, has been convicted of a crime that carried a maximum sentence 3 of greater than one year, and has been convicted of a 4 5 misdemeanor crime of domestic violence. 6 Trial for this matter was scheduled for October 2nd, 2015; however, the charges against Mr. Strehle are still listed as not final in the docket. Although criminal charges were filed on December 9th, 2014, this incident is alleged to have occurred on November 25th, 2014. Ms. Castro was terminated from Parx Casino on or about December 19th, 2014 for failing to show up for work and is not currently employed at any Pennsylvania casino facility.

At this time, the OEC would ask the Board to consider the suspension of Breanna Castro's Gaming Employee Permit pending disposition of the criminal charges filed against her.

Mr. Molnar has entered and gambled in Pennsylvania casinos in the past as well.

It is alleged that in 2012 and 2013

Bucks County detectives gained intelligence from

cooperating witnesses, a wiretapped phone line and

visual surveillance that Mr. Sabatini and another

individual were operating an illegal sports gambling 1 2 enterprise in Bristol Township, Bucks County 3 Pennsylvania. 4 Criminal charges related to these 5 allegations remain pending against Mr. Sabatini. Mr. 6 Sabatini has entered and gambled at Pennsylvania casinos in the past as well. Based upon the foregoing, the OEC asks 8 9 that the Board place Ralph E. Sabatini on the Board's 10 Excluded Persons List. 11 CHAIRMAN: 12

And the last matter I have is a request to place Parwinder Singh on the Involuntary Exclusion List.

The Bureau of Casino Compliance was notified of the suspect later identified as Parwinder Singh, who was age 19, of attempting to use identification other than his own to gain access to the gaming floor through the hotel entrance at Sands Casino. The identification was presented to security, who noticed that the photo and height on the identification did not resemble the person presenting it.

Mr. Singh's true identity was discovered and he was charged with carrying a false identification card.

The matter is now before the Board to consider to placement of Parwinder Singh on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List.

# CHAIRMAN:

Any questions or comments from the Board? May I have a motion?

# MR. MCCALL:

Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board

issue an Order to approve the addition of Parwinder Singh to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board Involuntary Exclusion List as described by the OEC.

I further move that Mr. Singh may petition the Board for removal from the list any time after his 22nd birthday.
