Before we begin, I'd like to ask everyone as we always do to please turn off your cell phones or silence them and other electronic devices. Thank you. With us today we have Fred Strathmeyer representing Russell Redding, Secretary of the Department of Agriculture.

Jennifer Langan representing Timothy Reese our State Treasurer, and Robert Coyne representing the Secretary of the Department of Revenue Eileen McNulty. Thank you all for being here.

Quorum of the Board is present today,
I'll call today's meeting to order. We are operating
initially, just as a matter of housekeeping without a
court reporter. She is on her way. As I mentioned

earlier, so when she gets here we'll take a minute and let her get set up. First order of business, please join me in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE RECITED

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MR. FAJT:

We'll now get started with the regular agenda items. By way of announcements the Board held and Executive Session yesterday December 13th for the purpose of discussing personnel matters and to conduct quasi-judicial deliberations relating to matters being considered by the Board today. Under new business, next we'll hear from our Executive Director, Kevin O'Toole. Kevin?

MR. O'TOOLE:

Good morning, Chairman Barasch. Good morning, members of the Board. I'm very pleased to have with me today our very important employee, Claire Yantis. Claire has been employed by the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board since November of 2008, when she was hired as Director of our Office of Human Resources. Today I would like to publicly recognize the recent appointment of Claire as the Gaming Control Board's Administrative Director. This appointment brings to a conclusion an initiative that began by the Board earlier this year, 2016, to restructure our

table of organization of the Gaming Control Board. In particular on the administrative side of our table of organization. For the purpose of improving our efficiency and our workplace accountability.

As Administrative Director, Claire assumes a new role for the Gaming Control Board.

While we have known Claire for the past eight years as an extremely talented Human Resource Executive, her responsibilities will be expanded in new and exciting ways. Claire will lead a team of seven directors that will focus on improving the agency's management of all administrative functions. As Executive Director, I look forward to working even more closely with Claire on many interdisciplinary issues as the Gaming Control Board enters its second decade of operations. So, I'd like everyone to join me this morning in congratulating Claire on her new position.

Just briefly. Claire, you've done an excellent job working in this agency and you richly deserve this promotion. It's good for you, but it's also really good for the agency and I congratulate

you.

MR. FAJT:

MRS. YANTIS:

Thank you. I appreciate your support and confidence and I look forward to more closely working with Kevin.

MR. FAJT:

Great. Thank you both. Next up we have our Chief Counsel, Doug Sherman.

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

Good morning Chairman/members of the Board. Our first agenda item relates to a Proposed Statement of Policy which Assistant Chief Counsel Susan Yokum is here to present.

ATTORNEY YOCUM:

Good morning members of the Board. The agenda item for you today is a Statement of Policy. It is 125-203. It will add a new variation to Blackjack for Blackjack played on hybrid gaming tables. In this variation, there is no hold card dealt to the dealer so essentially players receive two cards face up, the dealer receives his card face up and then all cards dealt thereafter are community cards which may be designated to either the player's

hand or the dealer's hand depending on the option selected by the player. All of the rules of Blackjack applicable to traditional Blackjack are applicable to that when it's played on hybrid gaming table and that would be dealer stands on a soft center team and Blackjack plays three to two. I'd be happy to answer any questions you may have regarding this Statement of Policy.

MR. FAJT:

Any questions or comments from the Board, ex-officios? Thank you. May I have a motion please?

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

Today we have two petitions before you for consideration. Each can be decided on the documents filed of record as they are uncontested.

For each of the matters the Board has in advance of the meeting been provided with the Petition, OEC's Answer, and any evidentiary materials which have been filed in the record. The first Petition before the Board pertains to Maven, Incorporated and Melonease Shaw. Specifically the Petition asks that the Board lift the suspension of Maven's Gaming Service Provider Registration. Maven, Incorporated is a registered Gaming Service Provider that has provided lobbying, consulting, and community outreach services to both the Rivers and SugarHouse Casinos.

Maven, Incorporated is owned solely by Melonease Shaw. During July of 2016, the Office of Enforcement Counsel (OEC) filed a request for an Emergency Suspension of the Gaming Service Provider Registration after learning that its Principal had been charged by the Office of Attorney General with various criminal offenses relating to alleged misuse

of funds when the Principal was the president of the transitional work corporation and with temporary assistance to needy family program funds. Subsequent to the filing of those charges and the suspension of the Gaming Service Provider, the charges have been withdrawn and are no longer pending. As such, the Gaming Service Provider had requested that the suspension be lifted. The OEC does not object to that request on the basis that the charges are no longer pending and that request is now before the Board for your consideration.

MR. FAJT:

Commissioner Young, I believe you have a brief comment to make on this?

MS. YOUNG:

Yes, I do. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

Mr. Chairman, I would like to note for the record that
I will be recusing myself for consideration of this
matter. While I am certain I can be objective as I do
know Ms. Shaw and am familiar with Maven, Inc. I
believe it would be appropriate not to participate.
Thank you.

MR. FAJT:

Thank you. Any questions or comments from the Board? Ex-Officios? May I have a motion

please?

Mr. Chairman I move that the Board grant the petition of Maven, Incorporated and Melonease Shaw to lift the suspension of the Gaming Service Provider Registration to Maven, Incorporated as described by the OCC.

ATTORNEY SHERMAN:

Adam Gazarik's petition for removal from the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List is the next Petition before the Board today. In January 2015, the OEC filed a Petition to place Mr. Gazarik on the Board's Exclusion List on the basis that on July 19th, 2014 while visiting the Rivers Casino, Mr. Gazarik in an apparent intoxicated state entered a secured slot storage area in the slot technician workshop by breaking through a drywall wall. While in the room, he rummaged around, but did not have any other

additional damage. As a result of the conduct, Mr. Gazarik was permanently evicted from the Rivers, ultimately pled guilty to disorderly conduct and criminal mischief, and on October 21st, 2015 this Board placed him on the Involuntary Exclusion List for a minimum period of one year after which he could seek to be removed.

Mr. Gazarik's one year term is expired and he's requested be removed from the Involuntary Exclusion List. He requests that --- he states that he has no immediate desire to go to a Pennsylvania casino, but would like to avoid any further stigma attached to being placed on the list. He is gainfully employed and avers that other than this one incident, he's had no other contact with law enforcement. As I stated, the OEC has no objection to the request and it's now ready for this Board's disposition.

MR. FAJT:

Thank you. Any questions or comments from the Board? May I have a motion?

ATTORNEY COOK:

Morning. Next before the Board for its consideration are three Reports and Recommendations received from the Office of Hearings and Appeals (OHA). In each of these matters, the Board has in advance of this meeting been provided with the Report and Recommendation and the complete evidentiary record. Additionally, in each case the individual subject to the Report and Recommendation has been notified that the Board would be taking the matter up today. And if they wish to come forward when the matter is called to briefly address the Board, they may do so.

The first Report and Recommendation before the Board pertains to a request to recover

winnings while on the Board's Self-Exclusion List. In June of 2016 a female individual with the initials E.R. filed a Petition with the Board requesting that money and credits confiscated from her while gaming at Presque Isle Downs and Casino be returned. The OEC objected and as a result on September 20th, 2016 a hearing on the matter was held before the Board's OHA. Both the OEC and E.R. appeared at the hearing offering evidence.

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According to the Findings of Fact made by the Hearing Officer, on August 21st, 2013, E.R. entered Presque Isle, met with the Casino Compliance Representative and placed herself on the Board's Voluntary Self-Exclusion List for a period of one year. At that time, E.R. completed and signed all the necessary paperwork, which included a release and acknowledgment stating that a self-excluded person was prohibited from collecting winnings and that in fact winnings could be confiscated from a self-excluded person if found on the gaming floor. She was further notified that after her one year period of exclusion if she wished to be removed from the list she would have to take affirmative action. And if she did not, she would remain on the list.

The evidence further showed that on May

3rd, 2016, E.R. entered Presque Isle while still on the list and gamed at several slot machines prior to winning a jackpot of \$1,692.52. At the time of the jackpot E.R. had \$39.91 in credits remaining on her slot machine. In the course of casino staff processing the jackpot, E.R. was identified as self-excluded and both the jackpot and the credits on the machine were confiscated.

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At the hearing, E.R. testified that the Casino Compliance Representative who processed her placement on the list provided much information to her, but she had no direct or specific recollection of her being told that she had to take affirmative steps to be removed from the list after her one year period of self-exclusion. Ultimately, after hearing all of the evidence, the Report and Recommendation issued by the Hearing Officer concludes that pursuant to the Board's regulations, E.R. was on the self-excluded list at the time that the jackpot was won and as a result, she was prohibited from recovering winnings --- I'm sorry, recovering any losses or receiving winnings. The Hearing Officer thereafter reviewed the evidence presented and concluded that E.R. was entitled to recover the \$39.91 in credits on the machine as that was her seed money for lack of a

better term, but she was prohibited from receiving the 1 2 \$1,692.52 jackpot and that is the recommendation 3 before the Board. 4 MR. FAJT: 5 Any questions or comments from the Board? ATTORNEY COOK:

The next Report and Recommendation before the Board today pertains to Dawn Frazier. In April of 2016, Ms. Frazier submitted her Non-Gaming

Employee Registration Application seeking work as an EVS Attendant at the Parx Casino. On May 27th, 2016, the OEC issued a Notice of Recommendation of Denial of the application based upon the nature of Ms. Frazier's criminal history and failure for her to pay court costs and fees associated with her criminal convictions.

Specifically in 2009, Ms. Frazier was convicted of intimidation of a witness or victim and sentenced to between 11 months and 15 days to 23 months of incarceration followed by eight years of probation and payment of all court costs and fees. In 2012 she was convicted of driving under the influence charge and was sentenced to six months' probation and furthermore, as a result of her DUI conviction, her earlier probation period was revoked. And she continued on probation with some additional fees and involvement in drug treatment and alcohol treatment programs.

A hearing on OEC's objection to Ms.

Frazier's application was held on August 16th, 2016.

Despite receiving notice and in fact requesting the hearing, Ms. Frazier did not attend the hearing. As a result, the Hearing Officer was only presented with evidence of her convictions and no mitigation evidence

19 and as a result his Report and Recommendation 1 2 recommends that in fact the application be denied. 3 And that is the recommendation before the Board today. 4 MR. FAJT: 5 Any questions or comments from the 6 Board? May I have a motion? MS. YOUNG: 8 Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board 9 adopt the Report and Recommendation issued by the OHA 10 regarding the Non-Gaming Employee Registration Application of Dawn Frazier as described by the OCC. 11 12 MR. The motion passes. 19 ATTORNEY COOK: 20 Darrell Martin is the final Report and 21 Recommendation before the Board today. In May of 22 2016, Mr. Martin submitted an application for a Gaming 23 Permit seeking work as a Security Officer at the 24 Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs. On July 8th, 2016, the 25 OEC issued a notice recommending Mr. Martin's

application be denied based upon his prior criminal history, as well as his failure to disclose the entirety of it.

Specifically, it was discovered during BIE's investigation that Mr. Martin had a criminal history spanning between 1978 and 1995 with convictions relating to possession of controlled substances, larceny, possession of stolen property, and unlawful use of a motor vehicle. Mr. Martin was sentenced to confinement for three of his convictions and his most recent conviction in 1995 was for a felony charge. Specifically the attempted sale of a controlled substance. That however, was Mr. Martin's only felony offense and it was the offense he did disclose on his application.

The hearing in this matter was held on September 20th, 2016 before the OHA. Both Mr. Martin and OEC appeared at the hearing offering evidence. At the hearing, Mr. Martin testified that he only partially reported his criminal history because in his experience filling out employment applications, employers typically only are concerned with felony convictions. Which as I said, he did report. And convictions which happened within the prior seven years. Which all of his convictions pre-dated that.

Nevertheless, Mr. Martin acknowledged the entirety of his criminal history and testified that in almost 22 years that have passed since his conviction, he has worked to turn his life around. Specifically, he put on evidence as to his completion of two drug and alcohol treatment programs while incarcerated. And stated that he has remained clean and sober since his release from prison. Mr. Martin further testified to a steady employment history since his release from prison. The fact that he is now married and very involved with both his family and with the community. And after hearing all of the evidence presented, including Mr. Martin's mitigating evidence, the Hearing Officer concluded that given the passage of time and the evidence of rehabilitation that his application should be approved. That's the recommendation for the Board.

As we begin Enforcement Counsel's items I'd ask anyone who is addressing the Board to please state and spell your name for the court reporter. Also anyone other than attorneys must be sworn in before speaking and with that, Cyrus and Mr. Ferrell, you may begin.

ATTORNEY PITRE:

The OEC will present 22 matters for the Board's consideration today consisting of two Consent Agreements, four revocations, one suspension, and 15 involuntary exclusions. The first matter under OEC's portion of the agenda is a consideration for Consent Agreement between the OEC and Presque Isle Downs, Inc. That matter will be presented by Assistant Enforcement Counsel, Benjamin Ferrell.

ATTORNEY FERRELL:

Good morning, again, Chairman, members of the Board. That matter for consideration pertains

to two underage violations at Presque Isle Downs. On June 26th, 2016 a Presque Security Officer allowed an 18 year old patron wearing a yellow wrist band on his left wrist to enter the gaming floor. The Security Officer did not stop and ask the patron for his identification. Presque Isle's internal controls require that yellow wrist bands shall be placed on the patron's right wrist and not their left and shall only be issued to individuals over the 21 years of age. The patron gamed at three different slot machines for approximately five minutes and was on the floor for approximately ten minutes.

Additionally, on July 10th, 2016, an 18 year old patron was allowed to enter the gaming floor after showing the posted Security Officer his driver's license, showing he was 18 years of age. The Security Guard did not scan that individual's driver's license and allowed the patron onto the floor. Once on the floor, the patron gamed at three slot machines for approximately 43 minutes and was on the gaming floor for approximately 1 hour and 52 minutes. Under the terms of the agreed upon Consent Agreement, Presque Isle would pay a civil penalty of \$15,000 as well as a \$2,500 investigation fee. And at this time, we would request that the Board admit that Consent Agreement.

MR. FAJT:

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Thank you. Mr. Schrier, any comments as counsel from Presque Isle?

ATTORNEY SCHRIER:

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and Commissioners. Steven D. Schrier with the law firm of Blank Rome on behalf of Presque Isle Downs, Inc. just want to apologize for not having a representative of the company here today. I know that is something that they would have liked to have done. I received a call from Tom Dill who is the Deputy Chief Counsel and Compliance Officer last night, that he was snowed in a bit in Ohio and was trying to get here. Asked if I could cover this for him. So, again apologies for not having a representative of the company here. heard the presentation by Mr. Ferrell. We have no objection to the presentation or the terms of the Consent Agreement or Consent Order. And I'm here to answer any questions you may have regarding the details. Thank you.

MR. FAJT:

Thank you. Any questions or comments from the Board? Seeing none, may I have a motion?

MS. YOUNG:

Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board

approve the Consent Agreement between the OEC and Presque Isle Downs, Inc. as described by the OEC.

This Consent Agreement pertains to a failure to notify --- file a renewal application for a Principal of IOC. On July 7th of 2016, Bureau of Licensing notified OEC of a failure to file this

application for Lee Wielansky's position as Outside 1 2 Director of Isle of Capri Casinos, Incorporated. 3 Board initially issued Mr. Wielansky a principal 4 license on January 9th, 2013, that license expired on 5 January 8th of this year. BOL notified IOC in November of 2015 as well as April and June of this year that the renewal application was due. On July 11th of 2016, IOC submitted Mr. Wielansky's application. From the period of January 9th of this 9 10 year to July 11th, Mr. Wielansky performed his duties 11 as Outside Director without IOC having filed an application for renewal of his Principal License. 12 Under the terms agreed upon by both parties, IOC would 13 14 pay a civil penalty of \$14,500 as well as a \$2,500 15 investigative fee. And at this time OEC requests that 16 the Board approve this Consent Agreement.

MR. FAJT:

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IOC any comments on your behalf?

ATTORNEY TRANCHINA:

No. Elizabeth Tranchina, Vice President of Legal for Isle of Capri Casinos, Inc. and we are in agreement with the Consent Order.

The individual named in each complaint failed to respond within 30 days as required by Board regulation. As a result, the OEC filed a

request for default judgment and properly served the same upon each individual named in each complaint.

Thereby the facts in each complaint are deemed admitted. All filed documents have been provided to the Board and the matters are presently ripe for the Board's consideration.

ATTORNEY CROHE:

Good morning, Chairman, members of the Board. John Crohe, C-R-O-H-E, for the OEC. The next matter for the Board's consideration is the revocation of the Gaming Employee Permit held by Deborah Benkoski who stole a \$100 bill from a cash drawer in an active payout drawer while working as a Marketing Representative at Mohegan Sun. Ms. Benkoski is currently awaiting trial for two counts of theft and receiving stolen property. Therefore OEC now requests that the Board revoke the Gaming Employee Permit held by Deborah Benkoski.

MR. FAJT:
