


In making this determination, the Board may consider the results of the petitioner's slot machine operation, including financial information, employment figures and capital investment.

Baccarat

Bonus payouts may be won for certain hands when wagering against the dealer. The "ante bonus" is paid when a player is dealt one of the three highest ranking hands in the game. The "ante bonus" is paid regardless of the dealer's hand.

¹ Promotional plays are determined to be internal or external based on the way that they are handled by the slot machine meters and the Department of Revenue's central computer system (CCS). Internal promotional plays are recorded as wagers when they are played. Since the statutory definition of gross terminal revenue (GTR) excludes promotional play, the internal plays must be subtracted from "Wagers Received" before the GTR is calculated and the appropriate tax rate is applied.

External promotional plays are recorded as both a wager and a payout when they are played. Therefore, external plays must be subtracted from both "Wagers Received" and "Amount Won" before the GTR is calculated and the appropriate tax rate is applied. This results a net change of zero to GTR and the appearance that the external promotional plays have no impact on GTR. In reality all promotional play, whether internal or external, is deducted from GTR.

Since the inclusion of external promotional plays in the "Amount Won" essentially overstates the amount won when compared to other venues with internal promotional play only, the external promotional play must be deducted from the "Amount Won" prior to the calculation of any payout percentage.

MOHEGAN SUN AT POCONO DOWNS Project Sunrise Table Game Accommodation

Design Narrative

OVERALL DESIGN CONCEPT

The overriding Design Concept in this Table Game Accommodation phase is one of complimenting the original "Journey" storyline of the existing facility. The Phase II build-out drew its inspiration from a celebration of the landscape, the flora, the wildlife, the natural resources and the personality of the Pocono Mountain – Susquehanna River Valley. The concept is one of a journey through a metaphorical forest, made physical by stylized design elements representing trees, rivers, flowers, meadows, and, most prominently, the Sun, spreading its light and warmth from the very heart and center of the property.

The patron experience in this Table Game Accommodation phase consists mainly of two parts, the addition of table games, and their associated canopies, onto the existing gaming floor and the creation of a new slot area off the concourse, opposite the gaming floor. These two components offer more opportunity to build upon and enhance the original storyline, insuring a rich and multi-layered design vocabulary, and adding to the excitement and drama that is a hallmark of Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION - "Sunbeams"

The addition of table games to the existing gaming floor provides a series of challenges and opportunities in regards to the design philosophy, and the need for "canopies" above the tables to house lighting, surveillance and AV infrastructure must be balanced with the strong desire to maintain lines of sight from all areas of the concourse inward to the center bar.

The table game canopies exist as a two separate series of stylized "sunbeams" radiating outward from the powerful focal element that is the radiant sunburst over the center bar. Much as rays of light illuminating an open meadow do, these golden shafts hover above the gaming floor, extending the grand effect of the facility's signature design element out from the center and toward the concourse. The sunbeams themselves are a collage of glass tiles, in a multitude of sizes, shapes, and textures, crafted into flowing compositions of spectral color and intricate geometry. Brightly lit and suspended entirely from above, they float above the patron's head, defining a "sky plane" and inviting an exploration of what may lie at their heart.

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION - The Grove

The Approach:

As one would expect on any journey through a woodland environment, there are clearings, ravines, ridges and groves, and this journey is no different. In this instance, the Grove is the new slot area opposite the main gaming floor, and is a verdant manifestation of the stands of trees which metaphorically define the path around the Concourse. Upon approaching the Grove from the Concourse side, it is announced by a signature central column within the organic fabric of the existing concourse façade. This column is clad in metallic stencil-cut panels patterned after leaves, vines and undergrowth, which creates a thematic bond to the gaming floor railing and unites this new area to the gaming floor beyond. As one approaches this element, one is provided with glimpses on either side of it into the stylized copse beyond. Within the new slot area beyond, the sense of

"forest" is greatly enhanced through numerous representations of native flora and geography. Among these are:

- Internally-lit and shimmering, resin-colored pine cone light panels adorn the richly wood-paneled entry wall, recalling evergreen forests everywhere, and specifically the Eastern Hemlock, which is Pennsylvania's state tree.
- The carpet pattern is a direct representation of the "pine straw", that blanket of fallen needles which provides such a unique and luxurious sensation when trekking off the beaten path, within and around majestic stands of pine, spruce and hemlock.
- The column shafts represent the organic nature of tree trunks, and a symbolic peeling away of the outer bark to reveal the inner heartwood is accomplished through the use of "live edge" wood slabs over a field of honey onyx with linear glass tile accents.
- Crowning each interior column is a representation of a tree canopy, rendered in radiating organic wooden "branch mullions" and mullicolored acrylic panels. This artful rendition of the tree canopy is lit from within, as well as along its perimeter, to give an effect of sunlight shining down into the depths of the forest grove.
- A rear wall behind the rows of slot machines, is clad in floral textured wallcovering and is reminiscent of forest undergrowth and vegetation, with random piers of stacked stone recalling native rock outcroppings prevalent throughout the Susquehanna Valley

The Grove can also be approached via the connecting promenade from the original Phase I Racetrack. Patrons taking this route are greeted with a graceful representation of a line of tree saplings, rendered in wood and glass, between large piers of stone tile. In this instance, the stone tile selected is a green onyx, which calls to mind the velour-like layer of moss and lichen which clad rocks and fallen tree trunks in all Northern forests. The voids between the sapling elements provide tantalizing vistas into the Grove, with undulating ceiling coves beyond also guiding the eye deeper into the space. This direct visual connection breaks down the barrier between the two spaces, reinforcing the illusion of a shortened corridor.

If the petitioner is a Category 1 or Category 2 slot machine licensee, the signed waiver of rights form required by Sections 1312A(11) and 1315A(8).

Downs Racing LP (Name of slot machine licenses) further acknowledges that by petitioning for the approval a Table Game Operation Certificate, Downs Racing LP (Name of slot machine licenses) as well as its principals, owners, affiliates, officers and directors hereby knowingly watve certain rights which may otherwise arise as a result of amendments or additions to the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act that took effect on January 7, 2010 as set forth below:

- (1) the right under section 1209(f) (relating to slot machine license fee) or under any contract executed by the slot machine licensee/petitioner and the Department of Revenue under section 1209(c) to receive the return of any portion of the slot machine licensee/petitioner for its slot machine license;
- (2) the right, 1f any, to sue for the return of any portion of the slot machine license fee paid by the petitioner for its slot machine license.

I further certify and agree that if the slot machine licensee, on its own behalf or by and through its principals, owners, shareholders, officers and directors attempts to assert a challenge to the requirement of this waiver as a condition to receiving a Table Game Operation Certificate as provided for and required by 4 Pa.C.S. Chapter 13A and Section 1312A(b)(11), the slot machine licensee shall be responsible for indemnifying for, and holding harmless the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board and its members, officials and employees from, all costs and expenses of litigation as well as from any claims or judgments for damages or other harm relating in any way to: the subject matter of the Acknowledgement and Waiver of Rights, the petition for a Table Game Operation Certificate, or a refund of license fees provided for under Section 1209(f) of the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act, 4 Pa.C.S. §1209(f).

I am aware and agree that the failure to abide by agreements and terms of this Acknowledgement and Waiver of Rights may result in the suspension or revocation of any authorizations, permits, certificates and licenses to conduct gaming in Pennsylvania; and that false or misleading statements and representations made herein may subject myself to criminal penalties under 18 Pa.C.S. §§4902-4904.

AGREEMENT FOR TAX CREDIT AND RETURN OF FEE BETWEEN COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND DOWNS RACING, L.P.

This Agreement (hereinafter, "Contract") is made and entered into this ______ day of November, 2006, by and between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Revenue, (hereinafter, the "Department" or "Commonwealth") and Downs Racing, L.P., a Pennsylvania limited partnership (hereinafter, the "Licensee" or "Downs LP"), with offices at 1280 Highway 315, Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania 17802, having federal employer identification number 20-2157338 (hereinafter collectively, the "Parties").

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Race Horse Gaming and Development Act, Act 2004-71, as amended by Act 2006-135, 4 Pa. C.S. § § 1101-1904, (hereinafter, the "Act") authorizes the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (hereinafter, "Board") to grant slot machine licenses within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania;

WHEREAS, the Board, on October 27, 2006, granted to Downs LP a slot machine license, License No. F1267;

WHEREAS, Section 1209(a) of the Act imposed and the Licensee paid a license fee in the amount of \$50,000,000 on October 27, 2006;

WHEREAS, Section 1209 (c) of the Act provides for credits against taxes paid by Category 1 and 2 slot machine licensees under certain conditions and further requires the Parties to enter into a contract for the application of said credits; and,

WHEREAS, Section 1209(f) of the Act provides for the return of slot machine license fees to Category 1 and 2 licensees under certain conditions and provides the schedule and

amount of fees to be so returned, and Section 1209(c) requires that provisions of the contract required under Section 1209(c) include the requirements of Section 1209(f);

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and intending to be legally bound, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Definitions

24

The terms used in this Contract shall have the meanings given to them in the Act, unless specifically defined herein:

- A. "Tax" shall mean the daily 34% tax upon gross terminal revenue from the slot machines operating at the Licensee's facility, imposed by Section 1403 (b) of the Act. It does not include any other assessments of or payments from the Licensee.
- B. "License Date" shall mean the date recited above on which the Board issued a slot machine license to the Licensee.
- C. "License Fee" shall mean the \$50,000,000 paid by the Licensee as recited above.

2. Contract Term

The term of this Contract shall commence on the License Date and shall expire at midnight on the tenth anniversary of the License Date. The term of this Contract may not be extended for any reason.

3. Credit Against Tax for Slot Machine Licensees

As required by Section 1209 of the Act, and as contractually required by this Contract, the Licensee will be entitled to receive a credit against Tax payable to the State Gaming Fund as follows.

A. If the rate of the Tax is increased at any time during the term of ten years following the License Date, the Licensee shall be entitled to a credit against subsequent payment of the Tax equal to the difference between the Tax calculated at the rate on the License Date and the tax calculated at the increased rate. The credit shall be applied on a dollar-for-dollar basis as and when the Tax is payable as set forth in Section 1403 of the Act but shall not extend beyond the ten-year period following the License Date. The aggregate amount of all credits provided shall not exceed the amount of the License Fee reduced by any return of the License Fee pursuant to Section 1209(f) of the Act or this Contract.

- B. In case of a change of ownership or control of the Licensee, Section 1209(e) of the Act shall apply.
- C. Any credit to which the Licensee may be entitled shall expire at midnight on the tenth anniversary of the issuance of the Licensee's License Date; no credit shall be allowed thereafter.

4. Return of License Fee

As required by Section 1209 of the Act, and as contractually required by this Contract, the Licensee will be entitled to a return of all or part of the Licensee Fee as follows.

A. The entire License Fee of \$50,000,000 shall be returned to the Licensee in the event Sections 1201 (relating to Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board established), 1202 (relating to general and specific powers) or 1307 (relating to number of slot machine licenses) of the Act is amended or otherwise altered by an act of the General Assembly within five years following the initial issuance of any slot machine licenses pursuant to Section 1301 (relating to authorized slot machine licenses) to change:

1. the composition of the board;

: ; ;

- 2. the number or voting powers of members of the board;
- 3. the manner in which members are nominated or appointed to the board;
- 4. the length of term for which each member serves;
- 5. the general jurisdiction of the board in a manner that impairs or otherwise reduces the board's licensing authority; or
- 6. to increase the statutory maximum number of permissible licensed facilities.
- B. In the event that the Act is amended or otherwise altered by an act of the General Assembly as described pursuant to paragraph A of this Section:
- In the sixth year following the License Date, the Licensee shall be entitled to a partial return of the License Fee in the amount of \$41,666,667.
- 2. In the seventh year, the Licensee shall be entitled to a partial return of the License Fee in the amount of \$33,333,334.
- 3. In the eighth year, the Licensee shall be entitled to a partial return of the License Fee in the amount of \$25,000,000.
- 4. In the ninth year, the licensee shall be entitled to a partial return of the License Fee in the amount of \$16,666,668.
- 5. In the tenth year, the Licensee shall be entitled to a partial return of the License Fee in the amount of \$8,333,334.

- C. In the event that the action described in paragraph A of this Section occurs after the expiration of ten years, the Licensee shall not be entitled to a return of any portion of the License Fec.
- D. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Licensee shall not be entitled to the return of any portion of the License Fee as a result of any act of the General Assembly insofar as it implements a recommendation made by the Board pursuant to a qualified majority vote. In the event a full or partial return of the License Fee imposed becomes due pursuant to subsection 1209(f) of the Act or this Contract, the amount to be returned to the Licensee shall be reduced on a dollar-for-dollar basis by the total accumulated tax credits granted to the Licensee pursuant to subsection 1209(c) of the Act or this Contract. In no event shall the total amount of the Licensee Fee returned, combined with the total tax credits granted, exceed the amounts set forth in subsection 1209(f) or in this Contract. The total or partial return of the License Fee shall extinguish the Licensee's right to claim any further tax credits pursuant to subsection 1209(c) of the Act or pursuant to this Contract.

5. Conditions

- A. The Licensee shall not be entitled to a credit or return of the License Fee under Section 1209 or under this Contract during any period for which the Board has suspended the Licensee's License.
- B. The Licensee shall not be entitled to a credit or return of the License Fee under Section 1209 of the Act or under this Contract if the applicable act of the General Assembly occurs after the Board has revoked or terminated the Licensee's License.

C. Except as provided in Section 1209(e) of the Act and except as provided in this Contract, the Licensee shall not be entitled to a credit or return of the License Fee under Section 1209 of the Act or under this Contract if the applicable act of the General Assembly occurs after the date on which the Licensee ceases doing business as a slot machine licensee in this Commonwealth or ceases to operate a licensed gaming entity under the Act.

6. Offset for Taxes and Amounts Owed the Commonwealth

The Commonwealth may set off against any credit or against any return of License Fee owed to the Licensee under Section 1209 of the Act or under this Contract the amount of any tax liability to the Commonwealth, or other debt of the Licensee or its subsidiaries owed to the Commonwealth, which is not the subject of a properly filed appeal.

7. Notice

The Parties agree that all notices given pursuant to the terms of this Contract shall be sufficient if in writing and sent by telecopy, facsimile or courier service with receipt acknowledged. All other communications shall be sufficient if in writing and mailed prepaid first class. - C. This Contract shall not be amended or modified except by an instrument in writing duly signed by the Parties and as permitted by law.
- D. This Contract constitutes the entire contractual agreement between the Parties with respect to credits and returns of funds to Licensee pursuant to the Act.

E. If a court of competent jurisdiction determines any portion of this Contract to be invalid, it shall be severed and the remaining portions of this Contract shall remain in full force and effect.
